#### **RESOLVED ITEMS**

#### 66. The Keeping of a Child in Secure Accommodation

The Panel considered confidential reports from the Council's Children's and Families Directorate, an Independent Person and the Secure Unit which set out the background to the current situation and outlined the reasons why a secure unit placement was still considered necessary at this stage.

The Panel carefully reviewed the case, taking into account the updates from officers of Children's and Families Directorate, including the child's social worker, the Secure Unit and the Independent Person. The child and the mother were in attendance and were given the opportunity to set out their views.

The Panel agreed that the criteria for the placement in secure accommodation continued to apply, that the placement continued to be necessary and that no other description of accommodation was appropriate at this time. The Secure Accommodation was considered to be a safe environment for the child and helped to minimise risks.

The Panel noted that the Local Authority might apply to the Court for an extension of the Order if it was deemed necessary.

**RESOLVED:** That the child remains in the secure placement for the duration of the Secure Order which expired on 5 December 2012.
