Anti-Semitism in the Labour Party Motion to Full Council – 28th February 2019

Proposed by Cllr. Paul Osborn and Seconded by Cllr. Marilyn Ashton

This Council notes:

- The worrying rise of anti-Semitism on all sides of politics, across Europe and the United States
- The Council's adoption of the "working definition of anti-Semitism" at the Full Council meeting on 23rd February 2017.
- The Council's reaffirmation of this definition at the Full Council Meeting on 19th July 2018.
- The resignation of Luciana Berger MP and others from the Labour Party.
- The Labour Party has received investigated 673 cases of alleged anti-Semitism complaints in the last 10 months.
- The steps taken by the Labour Party to deal with these complaints including suspending/expelling over 100 members
- <u>That there is a perception that the Labour Party has not moved quickly enough to</u> deal with anti-Semitism.
- The comments from Margaret Hodge MP on 11th February 2019 that she is "Not convinced" the Labour leadership is "serious on rooting out anti Semitism".

This Council believes:

- All forms of racism and anti-Semitism should be condemned.
- We should stand shoulder to shoulder with our Jewish Community to drive out the scourge of anti-Semitism <u>from society that has beset Her Majesty's Opposition.</u>

- <u>wW</u>rite to the Leader of the <u>Labour Party</u>, <u>Opposition</u>, Jeremy Corbyn, calling upon him to take <u>additional</u> action to ensure anti-Semitism is <u>taken seriously and properlyrobustly</u> dealt with in the Labour Party.
- Write to the Home Secretary, Sajid Javid, calling on the government to take action to address the worrying rise of anti-Semitism and racism across the country
