A small quantity of cigarette packs were also discovered in the store room by Mr Hayward and seized by PC Ballantoni:





Regulation 7 (1) of The Tobacco Products (Manufacture, Presentation and Sale) (Safety) 55 Regulations 2002 require that tobacco products, other than tobacco for oral use and smokeless tobacco products, shall carry on the most visible surface, one of the following warnings: "Smoking kills" or "Smoking seriously harms you and others around you"; and on the other most visible surface, an additional warning from a list set out in a schedule included in the Regulations. The photographs I have taken show that these warnings are not present on the packets. Instead there is wording in a foreign language. The sample's labelling is consistent with all packets seized from the shop and therefore none of them comply with the requirements of the Regulations.

I then carried out an formal interview of Mr Duta. The interview was under caution and 65 under the provisions of PACE. Also in attendance were Mr Abdullahi and interpreter Angelica Pinte. The interview began at 11:13hrs, I cautioned Mr Duta at 11:21hrs and it concluded at 11:56hrs. The interview was recorded on to two CD-Rs simultaneously, one was sealed at the end of the interview and the other was used as a working copy to produce a transcript of the interview. I now produce the sealed CD in evidence as 70 AMF/DR/3 and a transcript of the interview I created as AMF/DR/4. After the interview I booked sealed bags 006345 and 006346 into our evidence store along with the sealed

AMF Can you explain to me what they are doing here?

Luminita told me that "I got some cigarettes because me and my husband stopped smoking so I decided to bring them to the shop to give to customers". But not I can see that she is lying to me because I can see a lot of cigarettes there and I didn't know about them.

Mr Duta confirms that he received a letter from Harrow council that they would check the shop on 27th September. He explains that he was not worried about anything but when they came they found the cigarettes. He says that he was only told by Luminita about the cigarettes after the council had found them.

Mr Faulkner explains that he hasn't any further questions and offers Mr Duta an opportunity to add or clarify anything he has said.

Mr Duta says he would like to know how many cigarettes were taken and Mr Faulkner explains that he did leave a receipt at the shop and that he will provide him with another copy after the interview.

Mr Faulkner provides a notice explaining how Mr Duta can obtain a copy of the interview recordings and says that a report will be submitted and that he may be prosecuted. Interview concluded at 11:56am.

I am employed by the London Boroughs of Brent and Harrow Trading Standards Service as a Senior Enforcement Officer. My duties include enforcement of a number of Acts of Parliament and Regulations including the Trade Marks Act 1994; the Consumer Protection Act 1987 and its subordinate legislation.

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On the 27th September 2016 at 10:10 I accompanied Andrew Faulkner, Senior Enforcement Officer with Brent and Harrow Trading Standards Service, on a visit to D & D Ro Limited, trading as Carniprod / Magazin Romanesc, 181 Burnt Oak Broadway, Edgware, HA8 5EH.

We were taking Part in a Harrow Council Day of Action in the Burnt Oak area conducting routine visits to businesses and we were being assisted by two police officers, 183QA, PC Bellantoni and 295QA, PC Gogna. These details were recorded onto a Consumer Rights Act notice of entry which was completed once we had introduced ourselves to the person serving in the shop. I noticed that lying by the cash register there was a letter sent by me,

giving the business 48 hours advance notice that we would be visiting, it had not been opened.

The lady working in the shop said she spoke no English, we tried to explain that we were going to conduct an inspection of the shop. Mr Faulkner started looking behind the counter and he looked at a step which the shop worker had been standing on. I knew from a previous visit that this was a hollow step. Mr Faulkner discovered that there were foreign tobacco products inside the step, they were removed and placed on the counter. There were cigarettes and tubs of loose tobacco.

The back rooms were then searched by me with a police officer and more foreign cigarettes were discovered in a Celebrations sweets tub, these were brought to the front of the shop and placed with the other foreign tobacco products. While in the back room I saw that there were medicines, which I suspected were controlled and should only be available on prescription. I photographed them in the drawers where they were stored.

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The Tobacco products were seized by the police officers and I recorded the goods being seized onto receipt PH/0064 which was signed by Mr Faulkner, the shop worker did not wish to sign so it was left and marked as unsigned. The Consumer Rights Notice was completed at 10:55 and we left the premise taking the seized goods with us.

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Using my work IPhone I took a total of 11 pictures during our inspection of D & D Ro Limited; when I returned to Brent Civic Centre, I copied the images from D & D Ro Limited into my folder on the Brent server. I printed two of the pictures and produce them as exhibits PH/DD/1 and PH/DD/2. One shows the tobacco on the counter in the shop, the other shows

Mr Abdullahi asks about the platform where they found cigarettes and Mr Duta confirms that he made it himself for a previous assistant who was short.

Mr Duta confirms that he does sell legal cigarettes and that these are bought from Damecha Cash and Carry.

Mr Faulkner says that when they visited, Ms Luminita spoke no English. He asks whether she was able to challenge for ID to underage customers.

Mr Duta says that he has instructed her how to. He adds that she longer works at the shop as he has fired her.

Mr Faulkner explains that he hasn't any further questions and offers Mr Duta an opportunity to add or clarify anything he has said.

Mr Duta says he would like to know how many cigarettes were taken and Mr Faulkner explains that he did leave a receipt at the shop and that he will provide him with another copy after the interview.

42:30 Mr Faulkner provides a notice explaining how Mr Duta can obtain a copy of the interview recordings and says that a report will be submitted and that he may be prosecuted. Interview concluded at 11:56am.

I am employed by the London Boroughs of Brent and Harrow Trading Standards Service as a Senior Enforcement Officer. My duties include enforcement of a number of Acts of Parliament and Regulations including the Trade Marks Act 1994; the Consumer Protection Act 1987 and its subordinate legislation.

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On the 27<sup>th</sup> September 2016 at 10:10 I accompanied Andrew Faulkner, Senior Enforcement Officer with Brent and Harrow Trading Standards Service, on a visit to D & D Ro Limited, trading as Carniprod / Magazin Romanesc, 181 Burnt Oak Broadway, Edgware, HA8 5EH.

We were taking Part in a Harrow Council Day of Action in the Burnt Oak area conducting routine visits to businesses and we were being assisted by two police officers, 183QA, PC Bellantoni and 295QA, PC Gogna. These details were recorded onto a Consumer Rights Act notice of entry which was completed once we had introduced ourselves to the person serving in the shop. I noticed that lying by the cash register there was a letter sent by me,

15 giving the business 48 hours advance notice that we would be visiting, it had not been opened.

The lady working in the shop said she spoke no English, we tried to explain that we were going to conduct an inspection of the shop. Mr Faulkner started looking behind the counter and he looked at a step which the shop worker had been standing on. I knew from a previous visit that this was a hollow step. Mr Faulkner discovered that there were foreign tobacco products inside the step, they were removed and placed on the counter. There were cigarettes and tubs of loose tobacco.

The back rooms were then searched by me with a police officer and more foreign cigarettes were discovered in a Celebrations sweets tub, these were brought to the front of the shop and placed with the other foreign tobacco products. While in the back room I saw that there were medicines, which I suspected were controlled and should only be available on prescription. I photographed them in the drawers where they were stored.

The Tobacco products were seized by the police officers and I recorded the goods being seized onto receipt PH/0064 which was signed by Mr Faulkner, the shop worker did not wish to sign so it was left and marked as unsigned. The Consumer Rights Notice was completed at 10:55 and we left the premise taking the seized goods with us.
