123. **Report to the Office of the Schools Adjudicator:**

An officer introduced a report of the Director of Schools and Children's Development, which included the information on the statutory requirement to annually to the Office of the Schools Adjudicator (OSA) **on how well the admission arrangements in Harrow are working**. The information, which formed the basis of the annual report from the OSA to the Secretary of State, also included information on how fair access protocol was working locally and how school places were assigned in a fair and timely fashion.

In a response to questions, an officer advised that:

- due to time constraints the Forum did not receive copies of the report before it was submitted to the OSA. The Forum could submit its own report to the OSA if it felt that the system was not working;
- officers would circulate a draft copy of the report to Members of the Forum in future, which may require a special meeting of the Forum prior to its submission to the OSA..

**RESOLVED:** That (1) the report be noted;

(2) in future, the Director of Schools and Children's Development circulate a draft copy of the report to the Office of the Schools Adjudicator (OSA) to all members of the Forum and that, time permitting, it also be submitted to a meeting of the Forum prior to the report being dispatched to the OSA.

124. **Primary and Secondary Guides 2010/2011:**

An officer introduced a report of the Director of Schools and Children's Development, which advised of the work in progress on the Primary and Secondary Guides to Schools in Harrow 2010/2011. The booklets would be available for parents from 1 September 2009 along with application forms for entry into reception in September 2009 and 11+ and 12+ transfer to High Schools in September 2010. The booklets had been updated to include information on the change to the age of transfer and changes to the schools admission arrangements. Draft copies of the booklets were sent to Harrow schools in the week commencing 6 July 2009 for proof reading. In previous years schools only received the relevant sections of the booklets for editorial comments. This year schools were sent the entire booklet and were asked for any general comments.

An officer reported that draft copies had been circulated to the Admissions Forum Sub-Group for comment but that it had only made few remarks.



A member suggested that the information relating to the Moriah Jewish Day School might need amending, pending the outcome of a recent court case. An officer advised that the deadline for changes may not be met, and that a caveat to the information provided in the booklet could be included to note that the information provided was accurate at the time of publishing and that, for the most up-to-date policy, parents should contact the schools.

A member suggested that including information on the role of school's governors would help explain their involvement, and might also encourage more people to take up the position. Members agreed that, although a source of information about governors needed to be provided, the Primary and Secondary Guides were not suitable documents to contain such information, as governors took no part in the admissions process. The Chairman added that the booklets recommended contacting the individual schools for their relevant prospectus, where information about governors could be provided.

A member welcomed the inclusion of flowcharts and suggested that the flowchart in the Guide to High Schools be brought forward to page 5, as in the Guide to Primary Schools. The Chairman also extended his thanks on behalf of the Forum to the Admissions Service for all the work they had undertaken in producing the booklets.

**RESOLVED:** That (1) the report be noted;

(2) the amendments suggested by members be incorporated in the final versions of the Primary and Secondary Schools Guides 2010/2011;

(3) further comments from members of the forum be submitted to officers by no later than Wednesday 22 July 2009.

125. **Confirmation of Addresses:**

An officer introduced a report of the Director of Schools and Children's Development, which advised the Forum on the current arrangements to confirm addresses for school places. The need to have a robust checking procedure had arisen following complaints from parents over false applications and from parents who had been unsuccessful in their applications. They had asked that all addresses be verified. The same officer commented that whatever procedures were put in place, if parents were determined to fabricate information, it would be very difficult to eradicate all fraudulent applications.

The primary document used for confirmation of address was a copy of the current Council Tax bill. In cases where tenants did not pay Council Tax, a tenancy agreement sufficed, although private agreements would not be appropriate. If further clarification was required, the electoral register would be checked, a driving licence requested or certain information sought from the Council's Housing Service.

**RESOLVED:** That the report be noted.

126. **Rising 5, 11+ and 12+ Allocations for 2009/10:**

An officer introduced a report of the Director of Schools and Children's Development, which set out information about the allocation of places to Reception (Rising 5), 11+ Transfer and 12+ Transfer for the academic year 2009/2010. Information relating to primary schools indicated that the number of applications being granted their first preference was declining and information relating to high schools revealed a small increase in the numbers of applications for schools outside the borough.

A discussion took place between members regarding parents who had applied for their nearest four primary schools and had been offered none. A member reported that they had used their own address as a test and discovered that they would not have been offered any of their closest primary schools, and questioned the validity of a system where, in a populated urban area, parents could not be offered a place at schools which were within easy walking distance. Another member added that such instances had previously been investigated by the Admissions Service but the circumstances in those cases were different. It was questioned whether the number of preferences allowed on the application form could be raised from four to five. An officer replied that the problem was not specific to Harrow but was something that was affecting London and the South-East of England. The area around schools in which successful applicants lived was decreasing every year. As a result the Government had introduced two initiatives by which to better coordinate primary applications. The first was to co-ordinate in-year applications from September 2010 and for the school year 2011/2012 to co-ordinate intake to reception. Local authorities across London are currently developing draft schemes of co-ordination, with one recommendation being to allow applicants to make up to six preferences for admission to Reception. The officer reported that due to the high level of demand for some schools it was not possible to

give a guarantee that all applicants could be offered one of their local school and that finding an equitable system, given the population number and the differences in opinions over what was a reasonable distance to travel to school, was very difficult. The same officer added that a system for applicants to do their own home to school measurements would be available on the Harrow website in the Autumn term.

In response to a suggestion from a member about the how distance tie-breaker was measured, an officer reminded the Forum that there were other options open to the Council other than measuring the distance in a straight line, which the Forum may wish to consider.

**RESOLVED:** That (1) the report be noted;

(2) applications where parents were not being offered any of their four nearest preferred maintained primary schools be monitored and that a report on the numbers be provided to the Forum.

127. **Measurement of Distance from Home to School:**

An officer introduced a report of the Director of Schools and Children's Development, which advised of the current arrangements in place for measuring distance from home address to school. Information was provided to the forum for clarification following concerns raised by parents who were unsuccessful in gaining places at Newton Farm School because of the positioning of the school gates.

The Forum noted that:

- distance from home to school was measured in a straight line;
- the entry points used were those defined by the school;
- since the allocation of school places for 2009, all schools had been asked to confirm the official gates/entry points for the purposes of providing a new facility which would enable parents to calculate their own home to school distance;
- officers would be visiting all schools for further confirmation of official gates and entry points.

A member queried whether the official gates and entry points were something that could be defined by the Council's Planning Service. In response, the Chairman requested that legal advice be sought and that a report be brought to the next meeting of the Forum. The same member queried whether it would be practicable to assign the entrance of the main school building as the official gate and entry point. Another member replied that many schools did not have one main entrance to their buildings and that it was highly impractical to channel a high number of students through one entrance or exit.

**RESOLVED:** That (1) the report be noted;

(2) the Director of Legal and Governance Services submit a report to the next meeting of the Forum on whether the Planning Service had any control over the official gates and entry points of schools.

128. **Planned Admission Numbers:**

An officer reported orally on planned admission numbers and informed the Forum who was responsible for monitoring this area of work. Since the School Organisation Committee was abolished in 2005, place planning had been under the control of the Council's Education Service. Information statutory proposals to change planned admissions numbers could be brought to the Forum for information purposes. The same officer confirmed that the Director of Schools and Children's Services would be asked which Council forum would deal with issues related to school place planning.

**RESOLVED:** That the officer response be noted.

129. **Deferred Entry to School:**

In response to a question from a member of the Forum, an officer stated that the Portfolio Holder for Schools and Children's Development would be responding to a question from a member of the public on deferred entry at the Cabinet meeting of 16 July 2009. The Chairman requested that a report on deferred entry be brought to the next meeting of the Forum as well as the response from the relevant Portfolio Holder.

## Section 1 – Summary and Recommendations

This report puts forward a proposal to change the arrangements currently in place to confirm address when submitting an application for a school place

### **Recommendations:**

The Admissions Forum is requested to:

Consider and make a decision on the request of the voluntary aided schools to ask for two pieces of documentary evidence as proof of resident in Harrow.

### **Reason: (For recommendation)**

To ensure there is fairness and equity across all Harrow schools in relation to providing proof of address as part of the application process.

## **Section 2 – Report**

At their meeting on 14 July 2009, Members of the Forum received an information report advising of the current arrangements for confirming proof of residence for applicants for community schools.

On 23 September 2009 a meeting was held with representatives from Harrow's voluntary aided schools to discuss arrangements for the co-ordination of in-year applications. Representatives from the VA schools indicated that mainly they request two separate documents as proof of address. They felt that this provided a more robust system and reduced the possibility of applicants providing false or misleading information.

Currently their requirement is to request a current council tax bill, which is normally issued in April. They also require a utility bill issued within the last three months in order to obtain more up to date verification of address.

Because of the very high levels of demand for places, the VA schools indicated that they would not wish to reduce the requirement for proof of address.

In the circumstances, and to maintain equity across the sectors, it is proposed that the proof of address for requirements for all maintain schools should be:

1. Current year council tax bill in the name of the applicant
2. A utility bill in the name of the applicants issued within the last 3 months.

### **Implications of the Recommendation**

There would be implications in terms of additional workload on the Admissions Service, particularly if the applicant only submitted a council tax bill. However, because the Service has access to the council tax data base, it would be possible to undertake a check to confirm that the applicant still lived at the address given on the application form. Only in circumstances where the applicant was not still registered at the address would it be necessary to contact the applicant for further proof of address.

### **Financial Implications**

As any additional workload resulting from this proposal would be minimal it is anticipated that it can be met from current resources.

## Section 1 – Summary and Recommendations

This report considers the proposal put forward in a public question to Cabinet as to whether the borough would consider allowing more flexible entry to school by allowing younger children to start school a year later.

### **Recommendations:**

The Admissions Forum is requested to:

1. Note the report and consider the views of the Educational Psychology Service, Achievement & Inclusion Service and the Early Years Service
2. In light of these comments, decide whether the current admission arrangements meet the needs of the younger and less developed children or whether a change is required.

### **Reason: (For recommendation)**

To ensure Harrow's admissions policy is meeting the needs of the younger and less developed children at the time of admission to school.

## Section 2 – Report

The following questions were asked at the Cabinet meeting on 16 July 2009.

### Background

#### Question

“Research commissioned by the government done by IFS, published in 2007, showed that sometimes even up to the age of 16, the youngest pupils are still behind their older counterparts. The school secretary has said last year that summer-born children should be allowed to defer entry for up to a year, following that, is the borough is considering allowing more flexible entry to school by allowing younger children to start school a year later and also, as there is so much being said about younger children falling behind, how does the borough specifically cater for these younger and less developed children during their first years at school (reception till year 2)?”

**Answer:** The Council has not yet determined any possible future admission arrangements for younger children. This would be discussed at the Admission Forum before any changes were introduced. Any decision taken would be made in the light of guidance in the School Admissions Code of Practice and from the DCSF. All provisions for Early Years education take particular care to ensure that all children are assessed on entry to nursery school and, whatever the child's development and skills at that point, appropriate activities are then planned to help them make good progress. We are actually discussing this already, so your question as come at the right time.

#### Supplemental Question:

Is the Council considering, in addition to the assessments that are done in the beginning of the year to allow for assessment of specific younger children before they start school to check, not just whether they are at the right milestone for their own age but how they are compared to the skill they need to have by starting school and the academic work that they need to deal with?

**Supplemental Answer:** Yes. As I said, we are discussing that, so we will look at that and make a decision on the evidence and what we need to do, we will be doing. I understand that you wanted to meet with me and I am prepared to meet with you and the officers whenever it is appropriate.

### Current situation

The school admissions Code of Practice requires that where admission authorities for primary schools offer places in reception classes to parents before their children are of compulsory school age, they **must** allow parents to request that their child's entry be deferred until later in the same school year. The effect of this is that the place is held for that child and is not available to be offered to another child. The parent is not able to defer entry beyond the beginning of the term after the child's fifth birthday, nor beyond the academic year for which the original application was accepted.

In Harrow all children start in Reception in September. This covers children born on 1 September to 31 August. In the past two years, the Admissions Service has received no formal requests for deferred entry at the time of application. However, one or two cases a year are brought to our attention by schools of parents requesting deferred entry after the school place has been allocated. Such requests are agreed at a local level.

More flexible entry to reception could mean some children would be admitted to school outside of their chronological age group. This would have an impact throughout their school career. If a change to the admission rules were to be agreed allowing deferred entry for a full school year children would be chronologically Year 1 when they start school. They would transfer to high school, would sit exams and enter sixth form a year later than their age-related peers. Issues could arise if the child in question later developed at a pace that meant they were academically, socially and emotionally more mature than the children in their age group. Because the child would have reached statutory school leaving age in Year 10, there would be no requirement on the parent to ensure they completed their secondary education.

If a change to the current admission arrangements is proposed, then this would need to form part of the annual consultation on admission arrangements for September 2011/12.

### **Comments from the Educational Psychology Service**

There is no strong evidence that supports educating children out of their chronological age group is in their best interest. The Early Years curriculum provides sufficient flexibility to meet the needs of younger and less developed children and offers opportunities for phased admission and/or part-time placement until the child reaches statutory school age. Younger and less developed children are better placed in school where they can be observed and monitored. Once a child has started school and professional staff have had an opportunity to undertake an assessment the school, in partnership with parents, can agree for the child to spend an extra year within the early years curriculum (in exceptional circumstances).

There is a lot of flexibility in the system already and within the current statutory requirements it would be difficult to move beyond this.

### **Comments from the Achievement and Inclusion and Integrated Early Years and Community Services.**

These services work with schools to support the full implementation of the Early Years Foundation Stage and the provision of a play based curriculum within year one which is fully differentiated to meet the needs of all children. Whilst acknowledging that some schools have not traditionally offered a play based curriculum, Harrow in partnership with the National Strategies has been running a transition programme that has looked at practice between Reception and Year 1. This has brought together those practitioners from Harrow schools to discuss how to meet children's needs and fully differentiate the curriculum to meet the needs of all children so they all make good progress.

The borough, together with partners ensures that schools get a wide range of support and advice to support them in providing the best possible early education for children this includes:

- Access to the Every Child a Talker project
- Training and continuing professional opportunities
- Specific projects to look at developing best practice to roll out across Harrow

Work is currently taking place to support schools with making good "On Entry" assessments. This work is being guided by the Early Years Foundation Stage and key National Strategies documentation, in particular Progress Matters. Guidance will be issued to all schools from Achievement and Inclusion and Integrated Early Years and Community Services this Autumn.

The recommendation from the Review of the Primary curriculum by Sir Jim Rose, that the preferred pattern for entry to school should be the September following a child's fourth birthday. It would seem at odds with the report to adopt a change in council policy when flexibility and support are the key to a successful transition. Schools already adopt a sensitive and consultative approach with parents over readiness for full time school. A high quality, responsive Early Years Foundation Stage provision would do much to close the gaps in achievement for some summer born children. This is what Achievement and Inclusion and the Early Years Team are working together to ensure that every child experiences.

### **Implications of changing admission arrangements to allow for flexible entry to reception.**

There would be costs involved in implementing such a process, such as input from the Early Years Team and the Educational Psychology Service.

Once children are of statutory school age, parents are required to ensure that their child is in receipt of full-time education sufficient for his/her age, aptitude and ability. If a more flexible approach to entry to reception were to be adopted, then there could be implications for monitoring and assessing how parents were meeting this requirement.

### **Financial Implications**

If this proposal was implemented there may be minor implications for Schools Funding Formula that would need to be considered.

### **Risk Management Implications**

Once children are of statutory school age, parents are required to ensure that their child is in receipt of full-time education sufficient for his/her age, aptitude and ability. If a more flexible approach to entry to reception were to be adopted, then there could be implications for monitoring and assessing how parents were meeting this requirement.

At their meeting on 23 February 2009 the Harrow Admission Forum agreed that a Working Group should be retained to consider admission arrangements, including the over-subscription criteria for nursery places.

The Working Group met on 9 July 2009 and the following points were raised:

1. The Group felt that a clearer definition of their terms of reference should be requested from the Admissions Forum and that the Admission Forum decision should be formally minuted.

2. Members of the Group also felt it would be helpful to have more headteachers co-opted onto the Group. The Head of Service for Integrated Early Years and Community Services agreed to raise this with nursery headteachers at their next meeting.
3. Officers were requested to present a report on how nursery arrangements are currently working, based on a survey of nursery headteachers (see Appendix A). A meeting was scheduled for 29 September 2009 but by that date only 12 responses had been received from the 28 forms sent to headteachers. In the circumstances, it was agreed to cancel the scheduled meeting in order to give those schools who had not responded time to do in order that the Working Group could have a full picture of how nursery admissions are working across all schools.

## Section 1 – Summary and Recommendations

This report is provided for members' information in response to a request from the Harrow Admissions forum at their meeting of 14 July 2009 to advise on the designation of the entry points for schools for the purposes of calculating distances to schools for admissions procedures.

### **Reason: (For recommendation)**

Members requested information on the designation of entry points for schools for the purposes of calculating distances to schools for admissions procedures.

## **Section 2 – Report**

### **Background**

Harrow Council publishes admissions criteria annually; the criteria are applied where schools are oversubscribed. The current published admissions criteria determine that the Headteacher/Governing Body shall determine where school gates are for the purposes of calculating the distance to a particular school. There is no legal definition of a 'school gate'; the admissions criteria define the basis upon which Harrow Council uses the home to school criteria.

### **Current situation**

In the past, there have been some uncertainties regarding which entrances are utilised for the purposes of calculating the distance to a school gate. In order to overcome some of these difficulties, school gates for each school in the borough are now indicated on a plan. This plan is signed by the Headteacher of the school concerned, and published on the Harrow Council website. Applicants for school places are able to access copies of the plans via the website.

In determining the location of the entry points for a school, obvious considerations such as enabling access for disabled persons, maintaining a safe environment around the entrance in compliance with health and safety legislation, especially with regard to fire escapes, are important.

The crucial point is that the published admissions criteria makes clear reference to school gates and provides detailed information online.

### **Other options considered**

Members of the Harrow Admissions Forum have queried whether the Council would have planning control over the entry points at schools.

Members are advised that planning control in these types of circumstances can ordinarily only be exercised over physical structures and not entry points.

Newly erected gates and posts may fall within the type of physical structures the Council would have planning control over, but every potential breach of planning control would have to be assessed on a case by case basis.

Depending on the circumstances of each case, the planning enforcement officer would have to consider whether the physical structure falls within the statutory definition of the type of development that requires planning permission; how long the physical structure has been in situ; the harm resulting from the physical structure; and whether it would be expedient to take enforcement action to require removal of a physical structure.

## Section 2 – Report

### Current arrangements

#### Transfer from primary to high school

11+ transfer

Every year around 60,000 pupils living in London transfer to high school, many crossing borough boundaries to do so. All 33 London boroughs and some councils bordering the capital (eg Hertfordshire) have signed up to a system to co-ordinate admissions to their high schools.

Under the Pan-London Co-ordinated Admissions System, all parents list the schools that they want to apply for on one form, ranking them in order of preference. This form is returned to the council in which the child/family lives.

All councils taking part in the Pan-London Co-ordinated Admissions System then use a computerised system to pass on details of applications for schools in other areas and to co-ordinate the offer of places to make sure that nobody gets offered more than one school place. The decision on whether a place can be offered will continue to be made by the admission authority for each school listed on the application form. Where a school is oversubscribed, its published admission criteria will be used to decide the order in which applicants will be offered places. The council holds the offer for the highest preference on the parents' form and releases all other lower preference offers, so that these places can be offered to other applicants. Potential offers are then exchanged between councils until they are in a position to make the single best offer to parents using all available places. (See appendix 1 for step by step explanation of the co-ordinated process).

### 12+ transfer

Currently, transfer to Harrow community high schools varies slightly from the 11+ scheme in that the way parents apply for a place in Year 8 is the same whether applicants live in Harrow or in another borough. Following the change in age of transfer, September 2010 will see the final cohort of children transferring in Year 8 to high school. For the 2011/12 academic, all applications will be dealt with under the 11+ scheme of co-ordination.

### Changes introduced for September 2010 and September 2011.

From the 2010-2011 academic year, there is a new requirement for local authorities to formulate a scheme for co-ordinating in-year applications. That is applications made during the academic year and applications for admission to age groups other than the normal year of entry. This scheme must be formulated by 1 January 2010.

From 2011-2012 onwards, local authorities must formulate schemes for co-ordinating all applications to maintained schools from parents in their area, whenever received, and for whichever age group, under one scheme.

**How places are allocated under Harrow's 11+ Transfer Co-ordinated Admissions Scheme for Harrow community and voluntary aided schools and schools outside of Harrow**

**STEP 1**

Applications for Harrow community high schools will be dealt with by the Harrow Admissions Service. If you have named a Harrow voluntary aided school on the application form, we will send details of your application to them, as they are responsible for their own admissions. If you have named a secondary school in another council on the application form, we will send details of your application to that council.

**STEP 2**

If a school has more children applying than places available, the council/school governors will use their published rules to decide to whom to allocate places. Harrow's voluntary aided schools and other councils will then tell us if they can allocate you a place.

**STEP 3**

Once we have details of which children can be offered places, we will co-ordinate all the offers to make sure that only one offer is made. We do this by applying the ranking information you gave on the application form in the following way:

- If your child meets the rules for more than one of the schools you have asked for we will look at the rankings you gave the schools and offer you a place at your highest-ranked school.
- If your child meets the rules for only one of the schools on your list, we will offer you a place there.

**STEP 4**

Offers for schools placed lower on your list of preferences will not be made when a higher preference school has been offered.

**STEP 5**

If you applied on line, offers will be available to view from 7.00 am on 2 March 2010. Letters will be posted first class to all applicants on 1 March 2010. If you wish to accept the place, you need to fill in the reply form provided and return it to the Admissions Service at the Civic Centre by Monday, 25 March 2010. Later the school will contact you with details of arrangements for your child to start at the school, including any preliminary visits and parents' evenings.

**STEP 6**

Once offers have been made on 1 March and up to 31 August 2010, Harrow will seek to ensure that a place is not offered at a school in its area ranked on the CAF as a lower preference than any school already offered to a parent (see Step 4 above).

Appendix 1 gives details of 110 applicants for primary schools who were not offered any of the four schools they had named as preferences on their application for a Reception class place for September 2009. Only six of the 110 applicants were offered place further from home than the schools they had applied for. Three of these applicants were offered a school more than 5 miles from home. The reason for this is the unprecedented number of applications received for reception class places, which required the authority to take special measures to increase capacity in order to be able to offer

every Harrow resident child a school place. Pressure on places in the south east of the borough was particularly high and despite the actions taken to ameliorate the situation it was not possible to offer these three children schools nearer to their home. Appendix 1 gives the most up-to-date information about these children.

High school applicants not offered one of their preferred schools, were all offered places at schools closer to home than those named on the application form.
