- (2) the following conditions be added to the premises licence:
 - 1. Clear signage at all exits shall be prominently displayed asking customers to keep the surrounding area tidy and free from litter and to dispose of all rubbish in litter bins.
 - 2. Alcohol is only to be sold to customers who purchase food.
- (3) the application for recorded music be rejected;
