Section 1 – Summary

A Temporary Event Notice under the Licensing Act 2003 was submitted to the licensing authority (Harrow Council) to permit licensable activities at the 'Dooey's Bar 41-43 Station Road, Harrow, HA1 2UA' on Saturday 2 June 2012. The Metropolitan Police have submitted an objection notice to the temporary event notice. In accordance with section 105 of the Licensing Act 2003, the licensing authority must hold a hearing to consider the objection notice unless the police, premises user and licensing authority agree that a hearing is unnecessary.

Section 2 - Report

2.1 Current situation

2.1.1 There is currently a premises licence (a copy of which is attached) in force at the 'Dooey's Bar' situated at 41-43 Station Road, Harrow, HA1 2UA' that authorises sale of alcohol and the provision of regulated entertainment, during the following timings:

Monday to Sunday

10.00am - 00:00

- 2.1.2 A temporary event notice has been submitted to the licensing authority by the applicant, June Burrell, to authorise licensable activities, namely the sale of alcohol and the provision of regulated entertainment, at Dooey's Bar on 2 June from 2300 0900 the following morning.
- 2.1.3 On Wednesday 18 April 2012 licensing officers from the licensing authority spoke to Mr Dilpkumar Thakrar (owner of Dooey's Bar and the premises licence holder for it) and were informed by him that he was unaware of the application for a temporary event notice for his premises for an event on 2 June 2012, and that he had not given permission for anyone to use his premises on that date.
- 2.1.3 The Metropolitan Police have submitted an objection notice to the temporary event notice on the grounds of crime and disorder. A copy of the objection notice is attached to this report.

2.2 Legal Implications

- 2.2.1 Pursuant to the provisions of section 105(2)(a) of the Licensing Act 2003, the Licensing Authority must hold a hearing to consider the objection notice, unless all parties (i.e. the premises user, the chief officer of police who gave the objection notice and the licensing authority) agree that a hearing is unnecessary. The hearing must be held in accordance with the provisions of the Licensing Act 2003 (Hearings) Regulations 2005.
- 2.2.2 The Licensing Panel is required to give appropriate weight to the representations (including supporting information) presented by all the parties, the Guidance issued pursuant to section 182 of the Licensing

Act 2003, the Council's statement of licensing policy and the steps that are necessary to promote the crime prevention licensing objective.

- 2.2.3 Having considered those relevant matters and the objection notice, the Licensing Panel is required to do one of the following:
 - a. Give the premises user a counter notice if it considers it necessary for the promotion of the crime prevention objective to do so and a notice stating the reasons for its decision, and give a copy of these notices to the relevant chief officer of Police:
 - b. Decide not to give a counter notice, giving notice of this decision to the premises user and the relevant chief officer of Police.
- 2.2.4 It should be noted with these options that clear reasons should be given to the parties for the decision to issue or not issue a counter notice.
- 2.2.5 In addition to determining the application in accordance with the legislation, Members must also have regard to the following -
 - The common law rules of natural justice.
 - The provisions of the Human Rights Act 1998.
 - The considerations in section 17 of the Crime and Disorder Act 1998 as below:

Without prejudice to any other obligation imposed on it, it shall be the duty of each authority to which this section applies to exercise its various functions with due regard to the likely effect of the exercise of those functions on, and the need to do all that it reasonably can to prevent, crime and disorder in its area.'

The Borough Commander, through Sergeant Crump, has submitted an objection notice against this application based on the prevention of crime and disorder objective.





Annex 1 – Mandatory Conditions

Mandatory conditions where licence authorises supply of alcohol:

- 1 No supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence
 - a) at a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence, or
 - b) (b) at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended
- 2. Every supply or sale of alcohol made under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.

Mandatory condition where licence requires door supervision:

Where one or more individuals are required to be at the premises to carry out a security activity, such individual(s) must be licensed by the Security Industry Authority.

Mandatory Conditions Order 2010

- 1.—(1) The responsible person shall take all reasonable steps to ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.
- (2) In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises in a manner which carries a significant risk of leading or contributing to crime and disorder, prejudice to public safety, public nuisance, or harm to children—
- (a)games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to—
- (i)drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or
- (ii)drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);
- (b)provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic (other than any promotion or discount available to an individual in respect of alcohol for consumption at a table meal, as defined in section 159 of the Act);
- (c)provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less;
- (d)provision of free or discounted alcohol in relation to the viewing on the premises of a sporting event, where that provision is dependent on—
- (i)the outcome of a race, competition or other event or process, or
- (ii)the likelihood of anything occurring or not occurring;
- (e)selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-



social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner.

- 2. The responsible person shall ensure that no alcohol is dispensed directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of a disability).
- 3. The responsible person shall ensure that free tap water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.
- 4.—(1) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder shall ensure that an age verification policy applies to the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.
- (2) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and a holographic mark.
- 5. The responsible person shall ensure that-
- (a)where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures—

(i)beer or cider: ½ pint;

(ii)gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and (iii)still wine in a glass: 125 ml; and 250 ml

(b)customers are made aware of the availability of these measures.

Mandatory conditions where licence authorises exhibition of films:

- (1) The admission of persons under the age of 18 years to exhibitions of films must be restricted in accordance with any recommendation made by the British Board of Film Classification, except where condition 2 applies.
- (2) The admission of persons under the age of 18 years to exhibitions of films must be restricted in accordance with any recommendation made by the relevant licensing authority regarding the film in question

Annex 2 - Conditions consistent with the operating Schedule

- 1. The applicant will monitor the need for door supervisors and in so doing will take into account any advice given by the Police.
- 2. The pub manager is required to actively participate in and support the local Pubwatch Scheme (where active).
- 3. There will be no promotions that encourage illegal, irresponsible or immoderate consumption.
- 4. Signs are put up throughout the premises alerting customers to possible theft.
- 5. A monitored central station alarm is installed and will be operated and maintained according to the reasonable specification of the Metropolitan Police Crime Prevention Officer.



- 6. Floor staff conduct physical sweeps inside the premises to remove hazardous objects / waste.
- 7. Public transport information (including night time travel options) will be made available to customers. The phone number of an allocated taxi firm will be displayed on the premises.
- 8. The Designated Premises Supervisor and Personal Licence Holders will ensure the maintenance of all provided fire and other safety arrangements (including evacuation procedures) and equipment in accordance with the requirements of current legislation.
- 9. Reasonable steps are taken to recognise the rights of local residents and to encourage customers to leave the premises quietly. Door supervisor and management monitor the behaviour of customers leaving the premises and signs encourage customers to leave the premises quietly.
- 10. Managers are required to liaise with local neighbours as part of their duties and resolve any reasonable concerns.
- 11. Deliveries are conducted during daytime to control noise nuisance.
- 12. No adult entertainment (paid for by the company of a nude physical nature) is permitted at these premises.
- 13. The premises will operate a 'Challenge 21' policy, whereby any person attempting to purchase alcohol (or other age restricted product) and who appears to be under the age of 21 years will be asked to provide proof (i.e. passport, driver's licence or some other such accredited form of photo identification) that they are over the age of 18 years. Notices will be displayed advising customers that such a policy is in operation. A record of age related refusals will be kept and will be made available to officers of the police or local authority upon request.
- 14. Any children under 16 remain the responsibility of the accompanying adult when using the premises (and/or exterior area).
- 15. Staff are not allowed to be in sole supervision of children which remains the responsibility of the accompanying adult at all times.
- 16. Admittance refused to persons under the age of 16 years unless accompanied by an adult.
- 17. An appropriate automatic noise control device must be fitted for any amplified sound. The device should be set so that the volume of any amplified sound emanating from the premises does not cause a public nuisance. A calibration certificate must be supplied for the installation of the unit and submitted to licensing authority for approval.
- 18. The Premises Supervisor must ensure that any amplified sound from the premises does not cause a public nuisance by ensuring that amplified sound is not audible at the boundary of any properties where the occupiers are likely to be sensitive to noise.
- 19. The Premises Supervisor must ensure that any amplified sound from the premises




20. Any AWP machine on the premises is either to be emptied each night (and adequate signage that this occurs is to be displayed) or fitted with an police approved security device (e.g. a 'boot' or 'roller shutter').

On Tuesday 17th April 2012 police received an application for a Temporary Event Notice for Dooeys Bar for an event on 2nd June 2012. The times listed for the event are from 23:00 to 09:00. The event details are shown as 70's and 80's Soul Reunion. There are no further details of the event such as whether or not security staff will be used. This event causes the police great concern as the event itself is likely to have started earlier in the evening and if allowed would mean that persons attending would have a considerably extended period of alcohol consumption. This is likely to have the potential for an increase in violent and disorder related incidents that would require a police response.

The Metropolitan Police Service is currently facing a significant demand on resources. This increase in demand has been brought about by the disorder from last summer in conjunction with the Olympics and the Euro 2012 football finals which are both upcoming. The extended consumption of alcohol is, in our opinion, likely to increase the likelihood of police being required to attend this event to deal with an incident and therefore place a strain on local resources.

To express my concerns regarding this I tried to contact the applicant but have been unable to reach them. I then contacted the current Designated Premises Supervisor shown on the licence, Mr Jeetan Shah. Mr Shah informed me that he has sold the premises and has not had anything to do with it since July 2011. This means that the premises has been operating under his licence without his knowledge for 9 months. This again causes me great concern with the specific management and operation of the premises with regards safety and accountability. I have no contact details or even knowledge of whom should be responsible for the premises. I therefore ask that this application be rejected in its entirety.

Section 2 – Report

Current situation

- 2.1 An application has been made for a new premises licence in respect of "Harrow St Marys Cricket Club" ('the applicant'), Old Millhillian Sports Grounds, Headstone Lane, Harrow, Middlesex, HA2 6NF.
- The Premises currently has the benefit of a Club Premises Certificate which was granted in 2005 to 'Old Millhillian Sports Club'.
- 2.3 It is understood that the Premises are shared by the 'Old Millhillian Sports Club' and 'Harrow St Mary's Cricket Club'. The applicant has made an application for a premises licence to authorise licensable activities at the Premises as the Club Premises Certificate only authorises licensable activities in respect of the members and guests of 'Old Millhillian Sports Club' only.
- 2.4 Briefly, the application seeks to permit the following licensable activities during the following timings:

Sale of Alcohol & the Provision of Dancing:

Sundays to Thursdays 11.00am – Midnight

Fridays and Saturdays 11.00am – 01.00am (next day)

Live & Recorded Music:

Sundays to Thursdays 07.00pm – Midnight

Fridays and Saturdays 07.00pm – 01.00am (next day)

Late Night Refreshment:

Sundays to Thursdays 11.00pm – Midnight

Fridays and Saturdays 11.00pm – 01.00am (next day)

Hours Open To Public: Sundays to Thursdays 07.15am – 01.00am (next day)

Fridays and Saturdays 07.15am – 02.00am (next day)

2.5 The current Club premises certificate issued to 'Old Millhillian Sports Club' authorises the following licensable activities to be provided to club members and their guests during the following timings:

Supply of alcohol:

Mondays to Saturdays 11.00am – 11.00pm Sundays 12.00pm – 10.30pm

- 2.6 The applicant's proposed steps to promote the licensing objectives are listed in Section P of the application.
- 2.7 The premises are situated off Headstone Lane. A map showing the area is attached to the report.

Representations

- 2.8 The application for a new premises licence has attracted representations from one Responsible Authority namely Environmental Health and thirty seven interested parties, (seventeen of whom have signed a collective petition). These representations primarily raise issues pertaining to the licensing objectives which the panel should consider when determining the application. The panel cannot consider issues that do not go towards the promotion of the licensing objectives and can only consider matters pertaining to the licensing objectives raised in the representations and any supporting documentation submitted in accordance with the Licensing Act 2003 (Hearings) Regulations 2005.
- 2.9 Copies of all the representations and the petition received are attached to this report.

Consultation

2.10 The application was advertised in accordance with the Regulations under the Licensing Act 2003.

Licensing Policy Implications

2.11 In relation to the Council's Licensing policy at paragraphs 8.3 and 8.8, the applicant has addressed how he intends to promote the licensing objectives at section P of the application form.

Legal Implications

- 2.12 The Licensing Panel is required to hold a hearing to consider the application and any relevant representations unless all parties agree that a hearing is unnecessary. The hearing must be held in accordance with the Licensing Act 2003 (Hearings) Regulations 2005.
- 2.13 The Licensing Panel is required to give appropriate weight to the representations (including supporting information) presented by all the parties, the Guidance issued

pursuant to section 182 of the Licensing Act 2003, the Council's statement of licensing policy and the steps that are necessary to promote the four licensing objectives.

2.14 Having considered those relevant matters, the Licensing Panel is required to take such of the following steps (if any) as it considers necessary for the promotion of the licensing objectives –

The steps are—

- (a) to grant the licence subject to-
 - (i) conditions that are consistent with the operating schedule accompanying the application modified to such extent as the authority considers necessary for the promotion of the licensing objectives, and
 - (ii) any condition which must under section 19, 20 or 21 of the Licensing Act 2003 be included in the licence;
- (b) to exclude from the scope of the licence any of the licensable activities to which the application relates;
- (c) to refuse to specify a person in the licence as the premises supervisor;
- (d) to reject the application

For the purposes of 2.14(a)(i) above, the conditions of the licence are modified if any of them is altered or omitted or any new conditions added.

- 2.15 It should be noted with all options that
 - Clear reasons should be given for the decision.
 - Any additional or modified conditions should be practical and enforceable
 - The applicant and any person who made relevant representations would have the right of appeal to a magistrates' court on one of the grounds provided in Schedule 5 to the Licensing Act 2003
- 2.16 In addition to determining the application in accordance with the legislation, Members must have regard to
 - The common law rules of natural justice
 - The provisions of the Human Rights Act 1998
 - The considerations in section 17 of the Crime and Disorder Act 1998
- 2.17 By section 6 of the Human Rights Act 1998, the Panel is required to act in a way that is compatible with rights under the European Convention for the Protection of Human Rights. The following provisions of the European convention seem relevant: Article 6 (right to a fair trial) Article 14 (prohibition of discrimination) and Article 1 of the First Protocol (protection of property).

Community Safety

2.18 In relation to section 17 of the Crime and Disorder Act 1998, this states:

'Without prejudice to any other obligation imposed on it, it shall be the duty of each authority to which this section applies to exercise its various functions with due regard to the likely effect of the exercise of those functions on, and the need to do all that it reasonably can to prevent, crime and disorder in its area.'

The Borough Commander has not made a representation against this application.

Financial Implications

2.19 There are no financial implications.

Risk Management Implications

2.20 If any party is aggrieved with the decision of the licensing panel on one of the grounds set out in Schedule 5 to the Licensing Act 2003, they can appeal to a Magistrates' Court. The Appeal period is 21 days from notification of the decision.



I was recently notified of plans to allow the Millhillian Sports Club a license to sell alcohol as well as play live/recorded music.

As a resident whose garden backs on to the area, I am truly disappointed and disgusted at this prospect. When purchasing my property on Park View almost 10 years ago, the main factor that attracted me to the property was the peace and quiet of a residential suburban neighbourhood.

The prospect of my idyllic back garden being disturbed by loud music starting early and going on late into the night, which as been the case in previous summer periods, is something I disagree with whole heartedly.

I am supported by other home owners on Park View and probably other surrounding roads when I say we disapprove of this license being granted and firmly believe it should not be granted.

Park View is a respectful neighbourhood where we consider and respect other home owners to the extent where we notify our neighbours prior to a private event which may disturb them. We all wish to live in a peaceful, quiet neighbourhood where we are not disturbed during the early hours of the mornings or the late hours of the evenings where residents may want to sit in their gardens and enjoy the peace and quiet in the warm summer months.

I will be shocked and appalled if Harrow Council still grants the license after the uproar created by the

residents of Park View. I will further oppose this motion wherever necessary.

"Home" is a place where many residents wish to feel safe, secure and most of all happy. The quiet hum of cheers during a cricket match in the back ground adds a sense of community and life on an occasional weekend, however, loud and continuous music is something we are all heavily opposed to. That does not instil a sense of "home". Quite frankly, we all wish to live in our homes, roads, avenues and overall communities with no disturbances which includes a make shift nightclub which will be severely out of place in a suburban neighbourhood. I'd like to place representation to this application to change (The Prevention of Public Nuisance). The applicant is mindful of noise from the premises but has not shown fully how this will be controlled so i would like to add the following, which is similar to what they are offering:

It is important that the volume of any music including the bass content is adjusted accordingly to a level that the structure of the building can adequately contain. This is particularly important with a licensed property close to residential premises as in this case, which is proposing to have live music.

This could be achieved by amending the operating schedule to the following

"The Premises Supervisor (or representative) shall monitor the volume of music emanating from the premises and adjust the volume to ensure that any amplified sound or other music from the licensed premises does not cause a public nuisance. The Premises Supervisor (or representative) can ensure that music from the premises does not cause a public nuisance by ensuring that the music is inaudible at the boundary of any properties where the occupiers are likely to be sensitive to noise."

Reason: To ensure that any music and amplified sound from the licensed premises does not cause a public nuisance.

Adjusting the volume of music to a level that is inaudible at any properties where the occupiers are likely to be sensitive to noise is a tighter restriction than required to prevent public nuisance. However, any music that is audible at this point has the potential to cause annoyance and lead to public nuisance, especially late at night at the operational times proposed, even at a very low volume.

The advice on inaudibility at the boundary of neighbouring noise sensitive premises has been provided to try and reduce any ambiguity in the condition, and provides the Premises Supervisor with a clear benchmark for compliance.

In practical terms, it is possible that the music can be audible beyond this point and this condition still complied with, however the Premises Supervisor would be at risk of causing a public nuisance depending on the circumstances at that time.

REPRESENTATION AGAINST AN APPLICATION FOR A PREMISES LICENCE OR CLUB PREMISES CERTIFICATE UNDER THE LICENSING ACT 2003

The granting of a licence to supply alcohol and allow recorded and live music to be played at this venue will result in a significant public nuisance. The clubhouse backs onto the open fields of Pinner Park farm, which could create the misconception that there are no neighbours who would be troubled by the noise. In actual fact residential properties in Gidea Close, Park View, Woodridings Avenue, Nugent's Park, St Thomas' Drive, and George V Avenue all back onto these fields and the noise from the venue carries across the fields disturbing the residents from all these properties.

The management of the venue have failed to abide by current legal requirements, namely by organising events throughout the past summer during which music was played until well past midnight, whilst not holding a licence. Equally there is no easily identifiable way for a disturbed householder to contact the venue in order to request the noise to be abated.

The publication of the notice of application identifies the venue by its address in Headstone Lane. The majority of those households affected by this application are likely not to have realised that this application related to the venue backing onto their residences.

I believe it would be appropriate for the Chief Environmental Health Officer to hold off a decision on this application whilst a proper impact analysis is carried out that actively seeks the views of the residents of the above mentioned streets and that also allows noise tests to be carried out to determine the scope of the noise pollution that would be generated by the venue in the event that such a license were granted.



Environmental Nuisance and the Licensing Act 2003

I understand that you have before you an application for, effectively, the widest possible social use of a sports ground in Headstone Lane.

Park View is separated from the Headstone Lane Sports Grounds by a wide field. However on several occasions in each year extremely loud music is broadcast from one or more of those grounds so as to arrive here as the loudest noise that over-rides and occludes all others. This is probably not complained about on the basis of its being very occasional and there is obviously a lot of "live and let live". You may or may not be aware that this noise nuisance happens.

As I am not able to see the application in its detail nor to know what licences are in place for the applicant club's neighbours, I can only point out to you that should the frequency of these occurrences increase, the Borough Council would become very much aware of the disturbance that is occasioned. It would be particularly unfortunate if the Council has been persuaded to be the effective cause of permitting what might well be a gross nuisance. This would be potentially actionable under the doctrine of foreseeability.

The best immediate course might well be to establish whether the subject club has been the source of loudly broadcast noise in recent years and, if so, to weigh the application on the precautionary principle.

- (b)provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic (other than any promotion or discount available to an individual in respect of alcohol for consumption at a table meal, as defined in section 159 of the Act);
- (c)provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less;
- (d)provision of free or discounted alcohol in relation to the viewing on the premises of a sporting event, where that provision is dependent on—
- (i)the outcome of a race, competition or other event or process, or
- (ii)the likelihood of anything occurring or not occurring;
- (e)selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-



social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner.

- 2. The responsible person shall ensure that no alcohol is dispensed directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of a disability).
- 3. The responsible person shall ensure that free tap water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.
- 4.—(1) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder shall ensure that an age verification policy applies to the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.
- (2) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and a holographic mark.
- 5. The responsible person shall ensure that-

(a)where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures—

(i)beer or cider: ½ pint;

(ii)gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and (iii)still wine in a glass: 125 ml; and 250 ml

(b)customers are made aware of the availability of these measures.

Annex 2 - Conditions consistent with the operating Schedule


The club rules shall form the running of the premises.

- 1. The premises shall operate a 'Challenge 21' policy.
- 2. One event nights the number of patrons allowed on the premises will be 120 and this wll be monitored by a committee member in charge on the night.
- 3. A noise limiter will be fitted on the premises.
- 4. Patrons will be reminded by staff that they should leave the premises quietly, notices will be displayed to that affect.
