Section 2 – Report

Current situation

- 2.1 An application has been made to vary a club premises certificate in respect of “South Harrow Sports & Social Club”, Valentine Road, South Harrow, Middlesex, HA2 8EG (‘the Premises’).
- 2.2 The Premises currently has the benefit of a club premises certificate which was granted in 2005 under the Transitional arrangements. Briefly the current club premises certificate states the following licensable activity and times:

Sale of retail alcohol:

Monday – Saturday	11:00 – 23:00
Sunday	12:00 – 22:30

With respect to the hours open to the public, there are no times listed on the licence as this was originally a ‘grandfather rights’ conversion.

- 2.3 The application now seeks to extend to times for the current licensable activity – namely the sale of retail alcohol to the following times:

Monday – Thursday	11:00 – 00:00
Friday – Saturday	11:00 – 03:00 (the following morning)
Sunday	12:00 – 22:30

The application also seeks to add the following licensable activities:

Recorded Music:

Monday – Thursday	19:00 – 00:00
Friday – Saturday	19:00 – 03:00 (the following morning)
Sunday	12:00 – 22:30

Live Music:

Friday & Saturday	19:00 – 03:00 (the following morning)
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The application also proposes to add the following times for hours open to public:

Monday – Thursday	11:00 – 00:00
Friday – Saturday	11:00 – 03:00 (the following morning)
Sunday	12:00 – 22:30

- 2.4 The applicant's proposed steps to promote the licensing objectives are listed in Section M of the application. Currently there are no conditions under annex 2 or 3 of the club premises certificate.

Representations

- 2.5 The application to vary the club premises certificate has attracted nine representations from other persons. These representations primarily raise issues pertaining to the four licensing objectives - prevention of public nuisance, public safety, prevention of crime and disorder and the protection of children from harm which the panel should consider when determining the application. The panel cannot consider issues that do not go towards the promotion of the licensing objectives.
- 2.6 Copies of all the representations received are attached to this report.

Consultation

- 2.7 The application was advertised in accordance with the Regulations under the Licensing Act 2003.

Licensing Policy Implications

- 2.8 In relation to the Council's Licensing policy at paragraphs 8.3 and 8.8, the applicant has addressed how he intends to promote the licensing objectives.

Legal Implications

- 2.9 The Licensing Panel is required to hold a hearing to consider the variation application and any relevant representations unless all parties agree that a hearing is unnecessary. The hearing must be held in accordance with the Licensing Act 2003 (Hearings) Regulations 2005.
- 2.10 The Licensing Panel is required to give appropriate weight to the representations (including supporting information) presented by all the parties, the Guidance issued pursuant to section 182 of the Licensing Act 2003, the Council's statement of licensing policy and the steps that are appropriate to promote the four licensing objectives.
- 2.11 Having considered those relevant matters, the Licensing Panel is required to take such of following steps (if any) as it considers appropriate for the promotion of the licensing objectives –
- a. To modify the conditions of the certificate
 - b. To reject the whole or part of the application

and for this purpose the conditions of the certificate are modified if any of them is altered or omitted or any new condition(s) added.

2.12 It should be noted with all options that –

- Clear reasons should be given for the decision.
- Any additional or modified conditions should be practical and enforceable
- The applicant and any person who made relevant representations would have the right of appeal to a magistrates' court on one of the grounds provided in Schedule 5 to the Licensing Act 2003

2.13 In addition to determining the application in accordance with the legislation, Members must have regard to –

- The common law rules of natural justice
- The provisions of the Human Rights Act 1998
- The considerations in section 17 of the Crime and Disorder Act 1998

2.14 By section 6 of the Human Rights Act 1998, the Panel is required to act in a way that is compatible with rights under the European Convention for the Protection of Human Rights. The following provisions of the European convention seem relevant: Article 6 (right to a fair trial), Article 14 (prohibition of discrimination) and Article 1 of the First Protocol (protection of property).

Community Safety

2.15 In relation to section 17 of the Crime and Disorder Act 1998, this states:

'Without prejudice to any other obligation imposed on it, it shall be the duty of each authority to which this section applies to exercise its various functions with due regard to the likely effect of the exercise of those functions on, and the need to do all that it reasonably can to prevent, crime and disorder in its area.'

The Borough Commander has not made a representation against this application.

Financial Implications

2.16 There are no financial implications.

Risk Management Implications

2.17 If any party is aggrieved with the decision of the licensing panel on one of the grounds set out in Schedule 5 to the Licensing Act 2003, they can appeal to a Magistrates' Court. The Appeal period is 21 days from notification of the decision.

General Conditions – Section 62, Licensing Act 2003 Appendix A – Current Premises Certificate

- (1) The general conditions which a club must satisfy if it is to be a qualifying club in relation to a qualifying club activity are the following.
- (2) Condition 1 is that under the rules of the club persons may not-
 - (a) be admitted to membership, or
 - (b) be admitted, as candidates for membership, to any of the privileges of membership,without an interval of at least two days between their nomination or application for membership and their admission.
- (3) Condition 2 is that under the rules of the club persons becoming members without prior nomination or application may not be admitted to the privileges of membership without an interval of at least two days between their becoming members and their admission.
- (4) Condition 3 is that the club is established and conducted in good faith as a club (see section 63).
- (5) Condition 4 is that the club has at least 25 members.
- (6) Condition 5 is that alcohol is not supplied, or intended to be supplied, to members on the premises otherwise than by or on behalf of the club.

The additional conditions for the supply of alcohol – Section 64, Licensing Act 2003

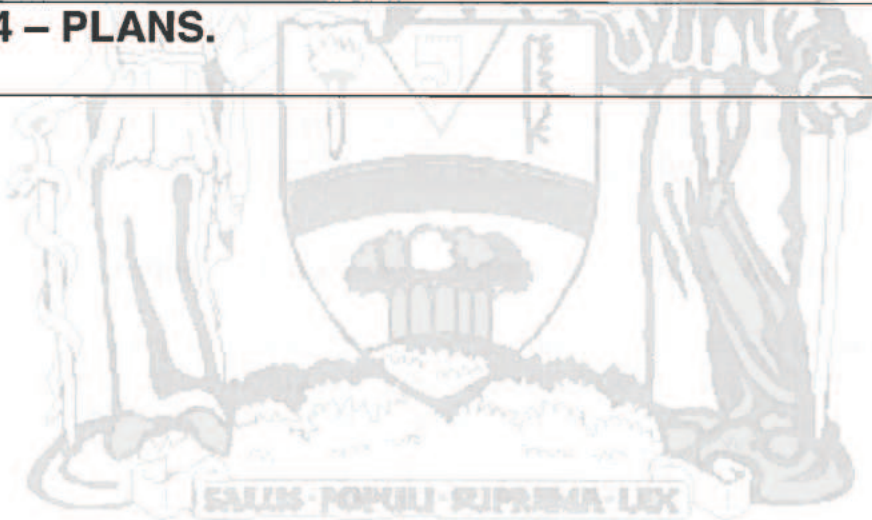
- (2) Additional condition 1 is that (so far as not managed by the club in general meeting or otherwise by the general body of members) the purchase of alcohol for the club, and the supply of alcohol by the club, are managed by a committee whose members-
 - (a) are members of the club;
 - (b) have attained the age of 18 years; and
 - (c) are elected by the members of the club.This subsection is subject to section 65 (which makes special provision for industrial and provident societies, friendly societies etc.).
- (3) Additional condition 2 is that no arrangements are, or are intended to be, made for any person to receive at the expense of the club any commission, percentage or similar payment on, or with reference to, purchases of alcohol by the club.
- (4) Additional condition 3 is that no arrangements are, or are intended to be, made for any person directly or indirectly to derive any pecuniary benefit from the supply of alcohol by or on behalf of the club to members or guests, apart from-
 - (a) any benefit accruing to the club as a whole, or
 - (b) any benefit which a person derives indirectly by reason of the supply giving rise or contributing to a general gain from the carrying on of the club.

I would like to object to the application on the grounds of prevention of public nuisance.

Appendix D - Representations

Currently, the club is not often busy, and the activities do not often create a nuisance, however on the odd occasion when they have a late night function, the noise from the club is loud during the evening and especially so around the end of the function. This is due in part to the escaping sound of recorded music as people open the doors to enter and exit, conversations outside the doors where people congregate to smoke, and part due to the noise of them getting into their cars, driving down Valentine road, or walking down Valentine Road and talking noisily.

I know that the club cannot be held responsible for the actions of customers once outside the club, but the current noise around midnight is a good marker for what could be expected at around 3am if the weekend extension is granted. The noise nuisance would make sleeping at weekends difficult, and midweek disturbed. Putting up a "Please respect our neighbours" sign is unlikely to help, the application claims that members are already aware of the rules that require them to behave considerately, they are clearly unaware of the effects their behaviour has.

I note that the application also claims that the Club are in regular contact with the residents to ensure there are no problems. This is untrue, the club has not been in contact with me in the seven years I have lived here.

Valentine road is a narrow road, and parking is at a premium. When there is a big function at the club it is already harder to find parking in the road, or other local roads. I imagine the reason for changing the opening hours and activities undertaken is to increase the number of customers. This can only have a detrimental effect on the parking available to residents, and the noise caused by people driving up to the club and reversing back when they find no parking there.

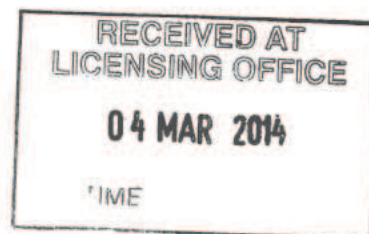

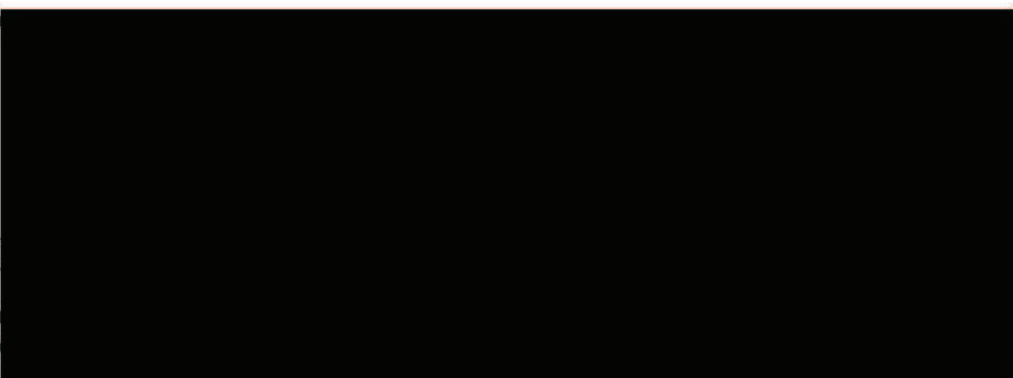

This is worse in the summer when participants leave the doors open, presumably due to the heat, and stroll around in the club garden. Drinkers often raise their voices to an unacceptable level. Items such as cans and condoms get thrown into my garden. On one occasion following a party some of the revellers climbed into my garden and broke into my bike shed. This was about 10 years ago and I reported it to the police. The club owners have never ever contacted me to advise that a party has been arranged, nor enquired about how the noise affects us. The problems are bad enough already. Extending the duration of the nuisance till 3am can only make the situation worse.

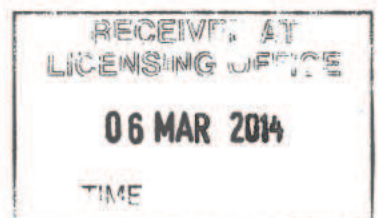

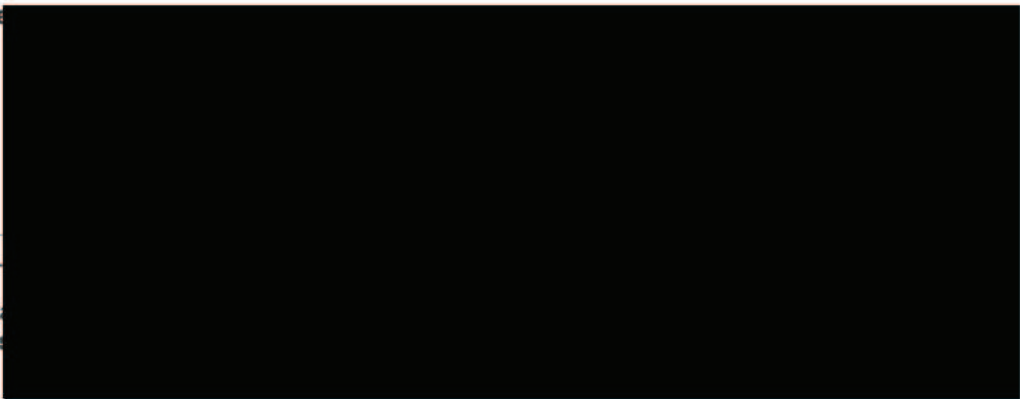

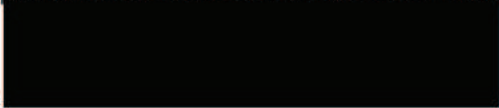
- 22nd February 2014 - noise from the club kept residents awake at least two hours after their official current licence permits.
- Residents complain of loud music and voices coming from the club. Because the building is a pre-fab construction there is no sound-proofing. However, the situation is made worse by doors left open during warmer months / for access to smoking area and outside picnic tables.
- Residents complain that, ~~there is a~~ ~~problem~~ as a result of late-drinking at the club, they do not always get adequate sleep to go to work and do their jobs properly. Many families have young children - their sleep has also been disrupted. The only apparent attempt to contain noise when members leave the club - a poster ^{on the door asking for consideration -} ~~is~~ ^{appears to have} ~~is~~ completely ineffective. This has led to many examples of public nuisance, particularly noise from live music and shouting and singing outside the club which regularly interrupts and prevents sleep.
