RESOLVED: That having carefully considered all the relevant information including:

- Written and oral representations by all the parties.
- The Licensing Act 2003 and the steps that are appropriate to promote the licensing objectives.

- Human Rights Act 1998.

8. The premises licence holder shall ensure that all CCTV recordings shall be stored for a minimum period of 31 days with the date and time stamping. Recordings shall be made available following the reasonable request of Police or authorised officers of the Licensing Authority under the Data Protection Act 1998 throughout the preceding 28 day period.

Reasons: The Panel considered that the measures taken above were appropriate and proportionate in the circumstances to promote all the licensing objectives.

Right of appeal: Any party aggrieved with the decision of the Licensing Panel on one or more of the grounds set out in schedule 5 of the Licensing Act 2003 may appeal to the Magistrates' court within 21 days of notification of the decision.
