Section 2 – Report

The applicant, Mr Ibrahim Tarlacik, has applied for a new premises licence in respect of Tigris Supermarket 2, 97-99 Burnt Oak Broadway, Edgware, Middlesex, HA8 5EP. The application seeks to permit the following licensable activity with the following timings:

2.2 Description of premises

The premises are described on the application form as a supermarket and grocery store

2.3 The premises are located on the A5 Burnt Oak Broadway. The premises are located on the ground floor of a busy shopping parade with retail uses either side; residential accommodation is above those premises and directly across the road.

2.4 <u>Designated premises supervisor</u>

The proposed Designated Premises Supervisor (DPS) is Mr Ibrahim Tarlacik who is also the DPS at Tigris, 77-79 Burnt Oak Broadway, Edgware, Middlesex, HA8 5EP

2.5 Details of application

Received: 08 July 2016

Newspaper advertisement: 15 July 2016

Closing date for representations: 05 August 2016

2.6 Representations

Representations set out at annex 3 have been received from the licensing authority, two bodies representing persons living within the vicinity of the premises (Councillors) and four other persons.

- 2.7 The representation from the Councillors sets out in detail the possible effect that the grant of this application would have on persons that live and work within the vicinity of the premises
- 2.8 The representation from the licensing authority sets out the proposed conditions that would be applied to the licence. It also requests that the applicant should submit a local area risk assessment to explain what effect a licensed premises that operates such long hours would have on the community that exists within the vicinity of the premises.

2.9 Officers' observations

Under section 16 of the application, the applicant has not offered any additional conditions to further uphold the licensing objectives, although it is stated by the applicant that he is willing to consider any further conditions any authority would propose.

- 2.10 The applicant has not responded to the representation made by the licensing authority acting as a responsible authority which suggests re-worded conditions and additional conditions which could be applied to the licence.
- 2.11 The licensing authority should ensure that the prevention of public nuisance objective is not undermined. This has a lower threshold than that required to prove statutory nuisance, and the Panel should bear in mind the following paragraphs of the statutory guidance to the Act:
 - 2.15 Public nuisance is given a statutory meaning in many pieces of legislation. It is however not narrowly defined in the 2003 Act and retains its broad common law meaning. It may include in appropriate circumstances the reduction of the living and working amenity and environment of other persons living and working in the area of the licensed premises. Public nuisance may also arise as a result of the adverse effects of artificial light, dust, odour and insects or where its effect is prejudicial to health.

- 2.16 Conditions relating to noise nuisance will usually concern steps appropriate to control the levels of noise emanating from premises. This might be achieved by a simple measure such as ensuring that doors and windows are kept closed after a particular time, or persons are not permitted in garden areas of the premises after a certain time. More sophisticated measures like the installation of acoustic curtains or rubber speaker mounts to mitigate sound escape from the premises may be appropriate. However, conditions in relation to live or recorded music may not be enforceable in circumstances where the entertainment activity itself is not licensable (see chapter 15). Any conditions appropriate to promote the prevention of public nuisance should be tailored to the type, nature and characteristics of the specific premises and its licensable activities. Licensing authorities should avoid inappropriate or disproportionate measures that could deter events that are valuable to the community, such as live music. Noise limiters, for example, are expensive to purchase and install and are likely to be a considerable burden for smaller venues.
- 2.17 As with all conditions, those relating to noise nuisance may not be appropriate in certain circumstances where provisions in other legislation adequately protect those living in the area of the premises. But as stated earlier in this Guidance, the approach of licensing authorities and responsible authorities should be one of prevention and when their powers are engaged, licensing authorities should be aware of the fact that other legislation may not adequately cover concerns raised in relevant representations and additional conditions may be appropriate.
- 2.18 Where applications have given rise to representations, any appropriate conditions should normally focus on the most sensitive periods. For example, the most sensitive period for people being disturbed by unreasonably loud music is at night and into the early morning when residents in adjacent properties may be attempting to go to sleep or are sleeping. This is why there is still a need for a licence for performances of live music between 11 pm and 8 am. In certain circumstances, conditions relating to noise emanating from the premises may also be appropriate to address any disturbance anticipated as customers enter and leave.
- 2.12 These above comments are to assist the Panel in its decision making process based on the evidence before it and the legislative requirements.

2.13 Conditions

Members will be aware that an operating schedule forms part of the licensing process. This document outlines what activities are proposed, the opening hours, and how the activities will be managed particularly in respect of the licensing objectives.

- 2.21 The most critical part of the operating schedule are the steps taken by the applicant to promote the licensing objectives. Applicants are always reminded to take careful consideration as to what is entered in this section as whatever is proposed will be translated as conditions on the licence.
- 2.22 Applicants should give consideration to the local area and reflect this in their application. It should demonstrate an awareness of the local community, local crime and disorder issues, and the local environment.
- 2.23 The Panel should also take into account paragraphs 10.13 to 10.15 of the guidance, and in particular the latter paragraph in relation to allowing shops, stores and supermarkets to be allowed to sell alcohol during the same hours as the shop is open for other goods unless there are good reasons based on the licensing objectives not to.

2.24 The Panel has the discretion to add to or modify these conditions where it is appropriate to do so to promote the licensing objectives.

2.25 <u>Licensing policy</u>

There are no implications in relation to the statement of licensing policy arising from this application.

2.26 Legal implications

The Licensing Panel is required to hold a hearing to consider any relevant representations made in relation to the premises licence application unless all parties agree that a hearing is unnecessary. The hearing must be held in accordance with the Licensing Act 2003 (Hearings) Regulations 2005.

- 2.27 The Licensing Panel is required to give appropriate weight to the representations (including supporting information) presented by all the parties, the Guidance issued pursuant to section 182 of the Licensing Act 2003, the Council's statement of licensing policy and the steps that are appropriate to promote the four licensing objectives.
- 2.28 Having considered those relevant matters, the Licensing Panel is required to take such of the following steps (if any) as it considers appropriate for the promotion of the licensing objectives –

The steps are—

- (a)To grant the licence subject to:
 - (i) Conditions that are consistent with the operating schedule accompanying the application modified to such extent as the authority considers appropriate for the promotion of the licensing objectives, and;
 - (ii) Any condition which must under section 19, 20 or 21 of the Licensing Act 2003 be included on the licence:
- (b)to exclude from the scope of the licence any of the licensable activities to which the application relates;
- (c) to refuse to specify a person in the licence as the premises supervisor;
- (d)to reject the application

For the purposes of 2.28(a) above, the conditions of the licence are modified if any of them are altered or omitted or any new conditions added.

- 2.29 It should be noted with all options that
 - clear reasons should be given for the decision.
 - any additional or modified conditions should be practical and enforceable
 - the applicant and any person who made relevant representations would have the right of appeal to a magistrates' court on one of the grounds provided in Schedule 5 to the Licensing Act 2003
- 2.30 In addition to determining the application in accordance with the legislation, Members must have regard to the –

- · common law rules of natural justice
- provisions of the Human Rights Act 1998
- considerations in section 17 of the Crime and Disorder Act 1998
- 2.31 By section 6 of the Human Rights Act 1998, the Panel is required to act in a way that is compatible with rights under the European Convention for the Protection of Human Rights. The following provisions of the European convention seem relevant: Article 6 (right to a fair trial) Article 14 (prohibition of discrimination) and Article 1 of the First Protocol (protection of property).
- 2.32 In relation to section 17 of the Crime and Disorder Act 1998, this states:

'Without prejudice to any other obligation imposed on it, it shall be the duty of each authority to which this section applies to exercise its various functions with due regard to the likely effect of the exercise of those functions on, and the need to do all that it reasonably can to prevent, crime and disorder in its area.'

Financial Implications

2.33 There are no financial implications.

Appeals

2.34 If any party is aggrieved with the decision of the licensing panel on one of the grounds set out in Schedule 5 to the Licensing Act 2003, they can appeal to a magistrates' court within 21 days from notification of the decision.







I oppose the granting of this licence as I believe, if the licence is granted there is a likelihood of an increase in crime and disorder; there is a risk to public safety and there will b an increase in public nuisance.

Since I was elected in May 2014 I attend the regular meetings of the Edgware safer Neighbourhood Ward Panel. This is where community activists, elected Councillors and the local Metropolitan Police meet to look at crime and community safety in the Edgware Ward.

From these meetings the attendees learn from the Police where the crime hotspots are and I and my colleagues have learnt that Burnt Oak Broadway has become a crime hotspot.

The type of crimes occurring around Burnt Oak Broadway are street robbery; drunk and disorderly, prostitution, noise nuisance urination/defection in public areas.

This increase in crime and growth in public disorder has causal links to the growth in Edgware Ward of a migratory population that includes a high percentage of single young men. The men, largely from Romania, are living, on their own, in other words with no family support, and work very long hours.

When not working they get very lonely and feel isolated in a foreign country where they know few people and have limited language skills in English. Therefore, at weekends in particular, they seek solace from drink and sex. In other words, cheap alcohol and prostitution.

There are a lot of stores along Burnt Oak Broadway, between Columbia Avenue and Stag Lane that sell alcohol and much of it is very cheap. Some of it is illegal. I witnessed an HMRC/Trading Standards raid on a store not far from Tigris where £10,000 worth of beer was seized as it was stolen and was being sold very cheaply.

The impact of the current supply of alcohol has led to a growth of nuisance along residential roads like The Highlands. The Highlands meets Burnt Oak Broadway near Tigris Supermarket and the type of problem residents now experience is drunken young men walking down The Highlands late at night, drunk, rowdy, intimidating and urinating in public in the street.

If the Tigris Supermarket were to be allowed to sell alcohol 7/24 the store would be a magnet for the young men I have referred to and this could lead to a growth in alcohol abuse, prostitution and public nuisance.

The growth of alcohol abuse on the streets of the Edgware Ward is a driver of crime, and is a primary cause as to the settled community moving away from the area. This is having a deleterious impact on the community. I lived in the area, first as a child, from June 1957 through to November 1975, when I got married.

The area was always a stable community made up, until the early-1970's, of skilled white working class and a small number of Jewish families. In the early 1970's a large migration of Gujerati speaking Indians moved in who had been exiled from their African home by Jomo Kenyatta and Idi Amin (Kenya and Uganda).

The Gujerati and a smaller South Indian community have formed the backbone of Edgware Ward with the families being small-scale entrepreneurs and their children, educated locally, going into professional roles.

Thus, the area became diverse but stable. Other migrations have occurred over the last 40 years but the community was stable and prosperous. Since the end of the last decade a large number of EU residents have moved in. I and my 2 Councillor colleagues estimate they form 15% of the Edgware community and growing. 95% of that community are Romanian. It is principally the Romanian community who are living in rented units and often as single men and I believe it is this community that Tigris want to target with longer opening hours.

With the limits imposed by central government on public expenditure Council' are less likely to do community relations work with the Romanian community so the Council is unable to assist the community to assimilate and settle. It is also unable to engage on health protection where many Romanian men at weekends get so drunk they are legless (witnessed by me). This is having a serious impact on their health and well-being and is another reason to object to the granting of the licence.

I am prepared to attend the Licensing Panel as a witness and I have photographic evidence of the problems caused by alcohol abuse.

This kind of behaviour has direct link to public safety and residents feel threatened and unsafe to walk particularly young girls and women on their own.

There are already many shops selling alcohol in the area and allowing more shops will only add to the suffering of the residents.

This being the main shopping area for residents, even though there are no schools in the immediate vicinity of the shop, young persons and children use the Broadway regularly and adding one more shop selling alcohol will only add ricks to young persons and children.
