Section 1 – Summary

An application has been received to vary the premises licence for 'The Harrow' public house, 269 – 271 Station Road, Harrow to extend the opening hours, hours for alcohol sales, regulated entertainment and late night refreshment and amend relevant conditions. Representations has been received from two residents at the same address.

Representations

No representations have been received from any of the responsible authorities.

One representation has been received from a two residents living at the same address concerning the prevention of crime and disorder, and public nuisance, objectives.

Section 2 – Report

- 2.1 The premises licence holder, Stonegate Pub Company Limited, has applied to vary the premises licence in respect of 'The Harrow', 269 – 271 Station Road, Harrow, Middlesex HA1 2TB. The existing premises licence is set out at appendix 1.

2.3 Description of premises

The premises are a large town centre pub capable of holding 700 persons, situated on

two floors. It is located in a predominately commercial part of Station Road in Harrow although there are residential properties nearby in, for example, Lyon Road, Gayton Road, Bonnersfield Lane and surrounding streets. There are no other pubs immediately nearby but there are a number of restaurants and late-night take-aways. A location map is provided at appendix 2.

2.4 Licensing history

The premises have been licensed as a public house since February 1996 (under previous licensing legislation) and under the Licensing Act 2003 since November 2005.

2.7 Representations

One representation has been received from two local residents living at the same address (appendix 3).

2.8 Conditions

The premises licence holder has submitted the following as part of its application:

The information provided in this box is solely for information only and not intended to be converted into conditions on the licence.

This application is sought in order to vary the premises licence in respect of the terminal hours for licensable activities and opening, along with the amendment of conditions to ensure that the operating schedule is robust and appropriate for the premises.

Additional non-standard timings are also sought. The applicant is seeking later hours in part following requests from our customers, who want to continue their night in a safe, supervised and comfortable environment in particular, when entertainment is offered. In addition, the experience of the premises and of Stonegate is that the later hours sought will allow a longer wind down period and a more gradual dispersal which can be managed and contained.

The operating schedule of the existing premises licence contains some old and outdated conditions which are now covered by other legislation. There are however existing conditions which are still suitable for the style of operation however the wording of them is outdated and these have been reworded as detailed...below. In addition, new conditions are offered following discussions with the Environmental Health Officer which bolster the operating schedule ensuring it is robust, clear, appropriate and enforceable.

Pre consultation has taken place with the Police Licensing Officer, Licensing Enforcement Officer and Environmental Health Officer. The applicant was pleased to have productive discussions with these officers. Their comments have been taken into account in considering and drafting this application.

In particular the applicant proposes to introduce a new last entry time of 130am where the premises trades until 3am for the sale of alcohol. This reinforces the purpose of the application which is to keep our existing customers to allow them to enjoy their evening and supervise a controlled dispersal, rather than attract a new clientele.

Following discussions with the Environmental Health Officer, who confirmed no noise complaints have been received at all this year, the applicant has also included conditions to ensure no noise nuisance occurs from the premises. These include keeping doors and windows closed and maintaining a dispersal policy.

Stonegate Pub Company Limited have in place an extensive licensing manual detailing both company policies appropriate across the whole estate, along with procedures in place at a local level to ensure the premises operates to the highest standard and promotes the licensing objectives. These include policies regarding social responsibility, underage sales, and procedures to prevent crime and disorder and public nuisance.

- 2.9 Members will be aware that an operating schedule forms part of the licensing process. This document outlines what activities are proposed, the opening hours, and how the activities will be managed particularly in respect of the licensing objectives.
- 2.10 The most critical part of the operating schedule are the steps taken by the applicant to promote the licensing objectives. Applicants are always reminded to take careful consideration as to what is entered in this section as whatever is proposed will be translated as conditions on the licence.
- 2.11 The premises licence at appendix 1 sets out the current conditions. If the application is granted it will be subject to the alternative conditions set out at appendix 4 proposed in light of the premises licence holder's statement at paragraph 2.8 above.
- 2.12 The Panel has the discretion to add to or modify these conditions in light of the representations where it is appropriate to do so to promote the licensing objectives.
- 2.13 Officers' observations
Officers inspected the premises on 4 July 2016 and found no matters of concern. There have been no complaints received about the premises since the current DPS assumed his role there.
- 2.14 The Panel will wish to note that none of the responsible authorities have made representations about this application, and as indicated have had the opportunity to discuss the application with the premises licence holder prior to it being submitted.
- 2.15 These above comments are to assist the Panel in its decision making process based on the evidence before it and the legislative requirements.
- 2.16 A summary of the varied licence, if granted as sought, is set out at appendix 4.

- 2.17 Licensing policy
There are no implications in relation to the statement of licensing policy arising from this application.
- 2.18 Legal implications
The Licensing Panel is required to hold a hearing to consider any relevant representations made in relation to the premises licence application unless all parties agree that a hearing is unnecessary. The hearing must be held in accordance with the Licensing Act 2003 (Hearings) Regulations 2005.
- 2.19 The Licensing Panel is required to give appropriate weight to the representations (including supporting information) presented by all the parties, the Guidance issued pursuant to section 182 of the Licensing Act 2003, the Council's statement of licensing policy and the steps that are appropriate to promote the four licensing objectives.
- 2.20 Having considered those relevant matters, the Licensing Panel is required to take such of the following steps (if any) as it considers appropriate for the promotion of the licensing objectives –
- The steps are—
- (a) to modify the conditions of the licence;
 - (b) to reject the whole or part of the application;
- The conditions of the licence are modified if any of them are altered or omitted or any new conditions added.
- 2.21 It should be noted with all options that –
- clear reasons should be given for the decision.
 - any additional or modified conditions should be practical and enforceable
 - the applicant and any person who made relevant representations would have the right of appeal to a magistrates' court on one of the grounds provided in Schedule 5 to the Licensing Act 2003
- 2.22 In addition to determining the application in accordance with the legislation, Members must have regard to the –
- common law rules of natural justice
 - provisions of the Human Rights Act 1998
 - considerations in section 17 of the Crime and Disorder Act 1998
- 2.23 By section 6 of the Human Rights Act 1998, the Panel is required to act in a way that is compatible with rights under the European Convention for the Protection of Human Rights. The following provisions of the European convention seem relevant: Article 6 (right to a fair trial) Article 14 (prohibition of discrimination) and Article 1 of the First Protocol (protection of property).
- 2.24 In relation to section 17 of the Crime and Disorder Act 1998, this states:

'Without prejudice to any other obligation imposed on it, it shall be the duty of each authority to which this section applies to exercise its various functions with due regard to the likely effect of the exercise of those functions on, and the need to do all that it reasonably can to prevent, crime and disorder in its area.'

Financial Implications

2.25 There are no financial implications.

Appeals

2.26 If any party is aggrieved with the decision of the licensing panel on one of the grounds set out in Schedule 5 to the Licensing Act 2003, they can appeal to a magistrates' court within 21 days from notification of the decision.

Annex 1 – Mandatory Conditions

Mandatory conditions where licence authorises supply of alcohol:

- 1 No supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence -
 - a) at a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence, or
 - b) at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended
2. Every supply or sale of alcohol made under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.

Mandatory condition where licence requires door supervision:

Where one or more individuals are required to be at the premises to carry out a security activity, such individual(s) must be licensed by the Security Industry Authority.

The Licensing Act 2003 (Mandatory Licensing Conditions) (Amendment) Order 2014

1. (1) The responsible person must ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.
(2) In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises—
 - (a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to—
 - (i) drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or
 - (ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);
 - (b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
 - (c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
 - (d) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner;
 - (e) dispensing alcohol directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of disability).
2. The responsible person must ensure that free potable water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.
3. (1) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder must ensure that an age verification policy is adopted in respect of the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.
(2) The designated premises supervisor in relation to the premises licence must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy.
(3) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and either—
 - (a) a holographic mark, or
 - (b) an ultraviolet feature.
4. The responsible person must ensure that—
 - (a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures—
 - (i) beer or cider: ½ pint;
 - (ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and
 - (iii) still wine in a glass: 125 ml;

(b) these measures are displayed in a menu, price list or other printed material which is available to customers on the premises; and

(c) where a customer does not in relation to a sale of alcohol specify the quantity of alcohol to be sold, the customer is made aware that these measures are available.”

Mandatory Condition order 2014

1. A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price which is less than the permitted price.

2. For the purposes of the condition set out in paragraph 1—

(a) “duty” is to be construed in accordance with the Alcoholic Liquor Duties Act 1979

(b) “permitted price” is the price found by applying the formula—

$$P = D + (D \times V)$$

where—

(i) P is the permitted price,

(ii) D is the rate of duty chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the duty were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol, and

(iii) V is the rate of value added tax chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the value added tax were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol;

(c) “relevant person” means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a premises licence—

(i) the holder of the premises licence,

(ii) the designated premises supervisor (if any) in respect of such a licence, or

(iii) the personal licence holder who makes or authorises a supply of alcohol under such a licence;

(d) “relevant person” means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity which enables the member or officer to prevent the supply in question; and

(e) “valued added tax” means value added tax charged in accordance with the Value Added Tax Act 1994

3. Where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) of paragraph 2 would (apart from this paragraph) not be a whole number of pennies, the price given by that sub-paragraph shall be taken to be the price actually given by that sub-paragraph rounded up to the nearest penny.

4. (1) Sub-paragraph (2) applies where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) of paragraph 2 on a day (“the first day”) would be different from the permitted price on the next day (“the second day”) as a result of a change to the rate of duty or value added tax.

(2) The permitted price which would apply on the first day applies to sales or supplies of alcohol which take place before the expiry of the period of 14 days beginning on the second day.

Mandatory conditions where licence authorises exhibition of films:

(1) The admission of persons under the age of 18 years to exhibitions of films must be restricted in accordance with any recommendation made by the British Board of Film Classification, except where condition 2 applies.

(2) The admission of persons under the age of 18 years to exhibitions of films must be restricted in accordance with any recommendation made by the relevant licensing authority regarding the film in question

This licence is granted subject to the rules of the council annexed hereto i.e. the "rules of management for places of public entertainment r1" and to the following specific conditions:

1. The maximum number of patrons accommodated at any one time should not exceed 700

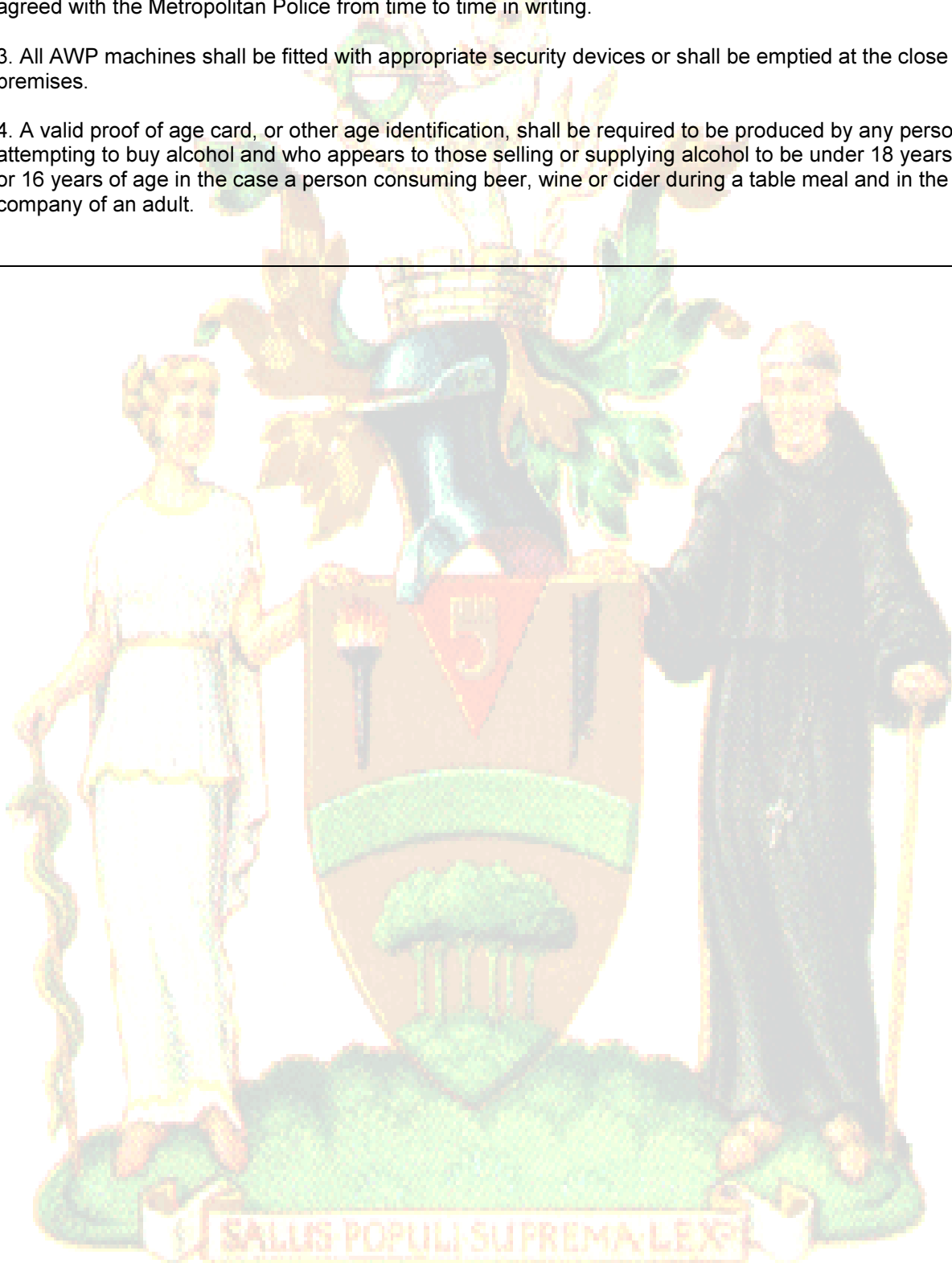

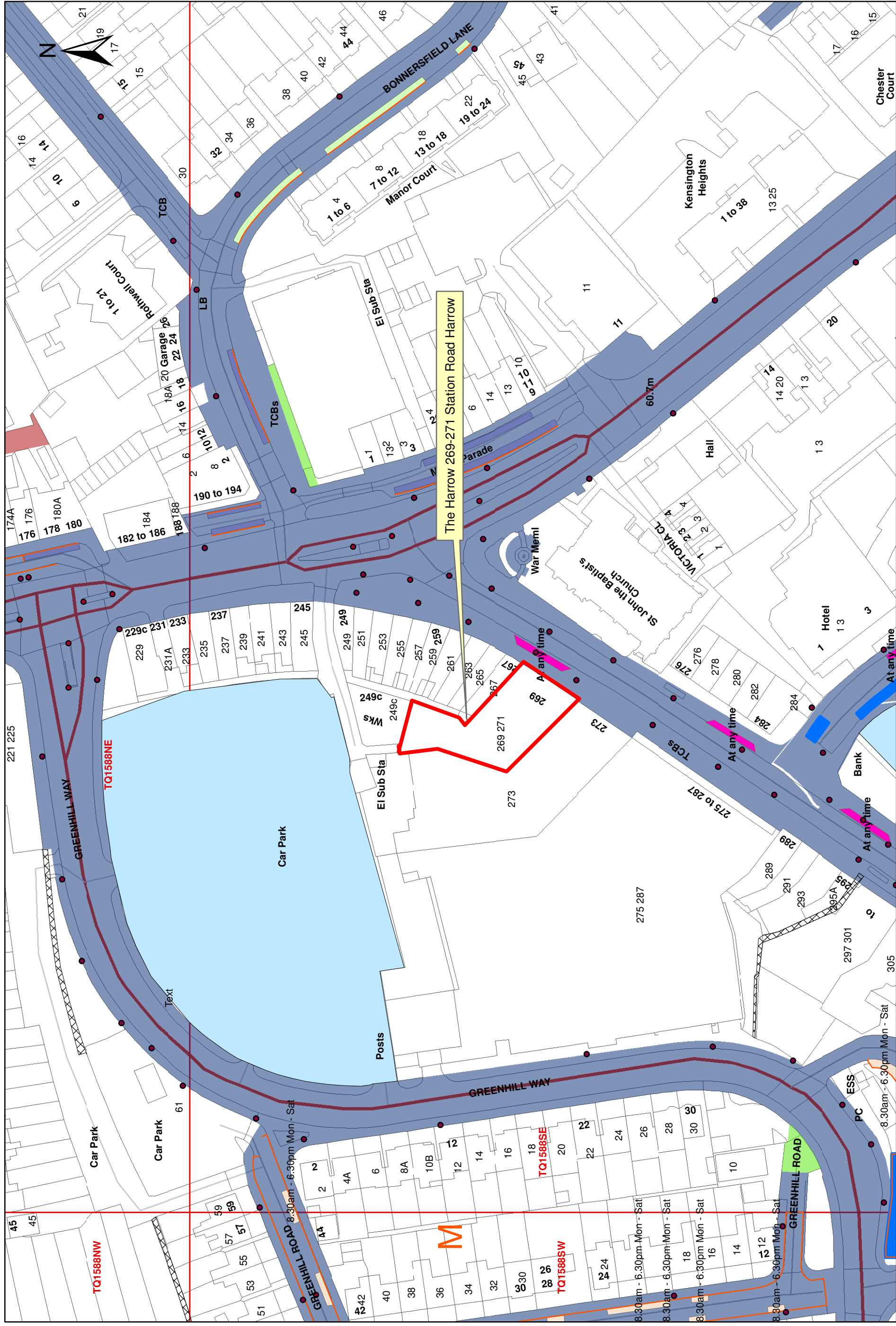
2. SIA registered door staff shall be employed at the premises at such times and in such numbers to be agreed with the Metropolitan Police from time to time in writing.

Conditions consistent with the operating schedule and proposed in the representations:

Prevention of crime and disorder

1. Where the premises is open for the sale of alcohol until 03:00 hours, there shall be no admission or re-admission to the premises after 01:30 hours, save for customers who have temporarily left the premises e.g. to smoke.

2. A CCTV system shall be installed at the premises and maintained in good working order and used at all times when the premises are open for licensable activities. Any CCTV footage shall be held for at least 28 days and shall be made available to an officer of the Licensing Authority or Police on reasonable request
3. The need for door supervisors will be assessed by way of risk assessment and cognisance will be taken of any police advice.

Prevention of public nuisance

4. Clear and legible notices shall be displayed in a prominent position near the exit door(s) requesting that customers leave quietly to avoid disturbing local residents.
5. The premises shall maintain a written dispersal policy, which shall be made available to the police and licensing authority officers upon request.
6. All doors and windows shall be kept closed after 23:00 hours, or when regulated entertainment in the form of live or DJ-led music is taking place, except for access and egress.

Protection of children from harm

7. A proof of age scheme such as Challenge 21 will be operated at the premises where the only acceptable forms of identification are photographic identification cards such as a driving licence or passport.
8. A log (which may be electronic) shall be kept detailing all refused sales of alcohol. The log shall include the date and time of the refusal and the name of the member of staff who refused the sale. A copy of the log or electronic report shall be made available to an authorised police officer and licensing authority officer upon request.
9. All bar staff to receive appropriate training in relation to alcohol sales prior to commencing their duties. This will include the premise licence conditions, underage sales policy and other relevant licensing matters. Training documents (which may be in an electronic format) shall be made available to an authorised police officer and licensing authority officer upon request.
