# Section 1: Summary

2.1 Brief History

The Council are currently in the process of consulting on their Draft Traffic Local Implementation plan (LIP). The Environment and Economy Scrutiny Sub-Committee are being consulted on this document as part of this consultation process.

As reported previously, the Local Implementation Plan (LIP) is a statutory document required by the Mayor of London containing all transport programmes and activities, both those funded by TfL and those funded from other sources. Once submitted, Transport for London will advise the Mayor on whether or not to approve the LIP.

The Sub-Committee considered this document previously at its meeting on 10 March 2005 and agreed that due to the size on the document (over 300 pages) that it members would consider the document outside the meeting and hold a Special meeting at a later date to consolidate their comments.
