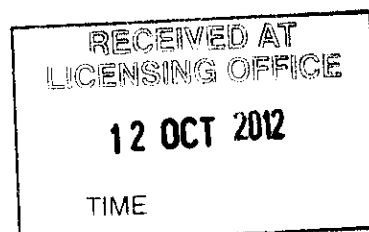

1. There is a risk that an extension of the licensing hours until 2.00 a.m. will attract undesirable elements into our neighbourhood.
2. When the doors of the nightclub are open the sound of their music is audible from our house and an extension of the club's opening hours is liable to disturb our peace and quiet.
3. Clients of the club park their cars in neighbouring streets, including Montgomery Road. I do not wish to be disturbed by people leaving the club in the middle of the night.

1. Five years ago, when the club was under different ownership, we experienced intolerable noise nuisance and rowdiness in our street. I believe that the late drinking hours at the premises was one of the factors that encouraged this anti-social behaviour. In 2009 the ownership of the club changed and the Licensing Panel determined new licensing conditions. Since then the club appears to have been managed responsibly and I have not suffered from the disturbance that characterized the previous operation. There was one occasion when the noise from the club was very loud for a prolonged period but this stopped as soon as I contacted the manager to complain. My fear is that an extension of the licensing hours will attract undesirable elements that the club will have difficulty controlling and there is a risk that the problems we experienced in 2007 will reoccur.
2. Even under responsible management, it is impossible to prevent the sound of music emanating from the club when people are entering or leaving the premises. This can be tolerated up to 11.00 p.m. but if the entertainment is going to continue until 1.45 a.m. this will become intrusive
3. The comings and goings of the club's clients who park in our street is now an established part of life here. Most clients seem to be considerate but unfortunately there are some who are oblivious to the noise they make. However, even considerate clients have to open and shut their car doors and I do not relish the prospect of this noise becoming a regular occurrence outside my house at 2.00 a.m.
