Section 1 – Summary

This report sets out the provisional results for pupils in Harrow in the relevant key stage assessments for their age in 2012. All are subject to further checks and revisions. Finally validated results are not available until early 2013.

Section 2 – Report

Early Years Foundation Stage (EYFS): Ages 4-5

- Standards have continued to rise in the EYFS in response to the priority given by schools and the Local Authority to this area. The 2012 results are Harrow's best ever outcomes. EYFS remains a priority area for improving standards.
- Standards have risen alongside a significant reduction in the gap of the attainment between the average and the lowest performing 20% pupils. Harrow is now ranked 98th and graded 'C' for the EYFS gap (ranked 149th in 2011).
- The key indicator of the percentage achieving at least 78 points and who have at least 6 in PSE (Personal, Social and Emotional) and CLL (Communication, Language and Literacy) has shown a significant improvement since 2009, with a 20% increase from 2009 (50%) to 2012 (60%).
- While children attaining well in this indicator are likely to do well by the end of Key Stage 1, predictions from EYFS to KS1 should be treated with caution.
- Over the last 3 years Harrow's EYFS outcomes have improved at a higher rate than the national average.

Key Stage 1: Ages 5-7

Year 1 Phonics Screening

Phonics screening took place this year for the first time. Harrow children scored well in the phonics screening activities relative to the national average. Harrow is ranked 16th in the country in 2012. Phonics screening is an assessment tool intended to assist teachers in helping young children to become more fluent and confident readers. The percentage of pupils meeting the required standard of Phonic decoding in 2012 is shown below.

Key Stage 1

- Harrow's 2012 end of Key Stage 1 (KS1) results are an improvement on 2011 across all subjects. Harrow's results have remained above both the national and statistical neighbour averages over the last few years. These are Harrow's best ever results at Key Stage 1.
- There have been particularly good improvements in Speaking and Listening and in Writing. Harrow's performance is above the national average and above the average of our statistical neighbours in all aspects of English and maths.
- Harrow is ranked 18th for Reading, 10th for Writing, 22nd for Speaking and Listening (45th in 2011) and 26th for Maths (29th in 2011).
- The percentage of pupils achieving or exceeding the expected level in Key Stage 1 (KS1) teacher assessments in 2012 is shown below.

Key Stage 2: Ages 7-11

- Harrow's 2012 Key Stage 2 results in Harrow are provisional as the discounting of recent arrival pupils within schools has not yet been applied at borough level.
- The 2012 results look very positive with an improvement in English with Mathematics at Level 4 or above from 78% in 2011 to 82% in 2012. Results in mathematics show a significant improvement. The percentage making expected in English has improved from 87% in 2011 to 91% in 2012. In Maths, the percentage making expected progress has improved from 86% in 2011 to 90% in 2012. However, Harrow's improvement overall is in-line with the improvement that can be seen nationally.
- Please note: The DfE has stated that comparisons with previous years should be made with care as particularly significant changes have been made to the arrangements in 2012. Most notable of these is the new measure of overall attainment in English. This measure is composed of Reading test results and Writing teacher assessments; it is not comparable with any English measures published in previous years.

- Harrow is ranked 26th in the country for English with mathematics at Level 4 or above (21st in 2011), 34th for English separately (23rd in 2011) and 14th for mathematics separately (28th in 2011).
- The percentage of pupils achieving or exceeding the expected level in Key Stage 2 (KS2) tests in 2012 is shown below.

• Harrow's results have continued to improve over the last 5 years in all subjects and at both level 4+ and level 5+, whilst continuing to stay above the national average each year.

- All Key Stage 2 standards outcomes show performance above national averages every year since 2008.
- Key Stage 1 to Key Stage 2 progress in English and in maths also remains above the national average since the first year of these measures in 2009.
- Harrow is ranked 24th in the country for making expected progress in maths (30th in 2011) and 38th for making expected progress in English (29th in 2011).

Key Stage 4: Ages 14-16

- The end of Key Stage 4 results below are taken from the DfE's KS4 Performance Tables Checking Exercise dataset, which have not had the results of any Recent Arrival pupils discounted.
- The provisional **5+ A*-C GCSEs including English & mathematics 2012 result of 62.6%** is below the final result of 2011 of 64.6%. However, once the results of recent arrival pupils have been discounted this result should increase by about 1%. Harrow is ranked 22nd on this measure (16th in 2011 and 27th in 2010). The **5+ A*-C GCSEs 2012 result of 83.2%** has improved from last year's result of 80.3%.
- This year's English Baccalaureate result of 21.3% is below last year's national average of 23.7%. Harrow is ranked 28th on this measure (11th in 2011).

- 5+ A*-C GCSE passes including English and mathematics are close to last year's result (2011 64.6%), which was the highest ever achieved in the authority.
- Provisionally, Harrow is placed 22nd in the country for 5 A*-C GCSE passes including English and maths (16th in 2011; 27th in 2010).
- For the new English Baccalaureate measure Harrow is ranked 25th in the country (11th in 2011; 19th in 2010).

- The percentage of students making expected progress from Key Stage 2 to Key Stage 4 in English has increased from 77.4% in 2009 to Harrow's highest result this year of 80.8%. Harrow's results have continued to stay significantly above the national average every year since 2009.
- The percentage of students making expected progress from Key Stage 2 to Key Stage 4 in Maths has also continued to improve from 75.2% in 2009 to this year's result of 79.3%, as well as remaining substantially above the national average since 2009, with nearly 11% difference in 2012.
- For the percentage of learners who have made expected progress in English, Harrow is ranked 3rd in the country (14th in 2011; 10th in 2010)
- For the percentage of learners who have made expected progress in maths Harrow is ranked 8th in the country (7th in 2011; 6th in 2010)
- These outcomes compare well against the national average for progress in 2012 (English 67.7%; Maths 68.5%). The national Median is not yet published.
- Standards of attainment at Key Stage 4 continue to be significantly above the national average and Harrow's schools continue to be among the highest performing nationally for adding value from Key Stage 2.

- Harrow is ranked 11th in the country for the percentage of candidates achieving 2 or more passes of A Level equivalent qualification.
- Harrow is ranked 22nd in the country for the Average Points Score achieved (APS) (13th in 2011; 78th in 2010)
- Results in Harrow do not include the return from post-16 Colleges. Harrow is a net exporter of 6th Form students and a net importer of further education students.

Destination Measures 2012 (based on 2010 leavers)

The DfE's first release of 'Destination' data in 2012 shows how many Young People completing Key Stages 4 and 5 stay on in education (based on <u>2010</u> leavers)

- Harrow is joint top nationally in terms of the rate of KS4 students staying in education 91%
 The national average is 85%
- At Key Stage 5, Harrow has the highest rate in England at **79%** against national average of 64%.

This data remains experimental, which means that it is new and still undergoing evaluation.

The percentage of young people aged 16-18 who are not in education, employment or training (NEET) in Harrow is the 3rd lowest in England (when the City of London and Isles of Scilly are excluded, Harrow has the lowest NEET).

Commentary on Provisional Performance Data for 2012:

Harrow's key stage results are supported by what inspectors say about our local schools and academies. The vast majority of maintained schools and academies in Harrow are judged good or outstanding.

Performance at Early Years Foundation Stage (EYFS) is improving in response to the priority given to this area. Improved attainment this year at EYFS and Key Stage 1 mark a clear change in the trend of Harrow's performance over time. These key stages are performing much better in Harrow than in previous years.

The Key Stage 2 and 4 results are subject to change as pupils who arrived late in schools are discounted from the published data. Key Stage 2 results, particularly in English, have improved across the country due to the new assessment arrangements operating in 2012. Outcomes for

mathematics in Harrow are worth noting. GCSE attainment might reasonably be expected to rise slightly as a result of discounting before publication in the New Year.

In individual schools there can be year on year effects from different cohorts and raw attainment data should be seen alongside data on value-added for individual schools. As an example, although a school's raw data may indicate lower standards the school could be adding considerable value to its intake each year. What Harrow does well, and does so consistently, is to add significant value over time. The longer children spend in the Harrow's school system, the greater their average rate of progress.

Section 3 – Further Information

These results are subject to further checks and revisions. Finally validated results are not available until early 2013.

In light of national changes to performance indicators Education Strategy and School Organisation will review the content of future performance information reports and make any appropriate changes.

Section 4 – Financial Implications

There are no financial comments in relation to this report. Further analysis of data will help to inform any commissioned improvement activities which are already provided for within existing budgets.

Section 5 - Equalities implications

As this is an information report on progress and attainment in schools it does not require an Equality Impact Assessment. However, the standards achieved by pupils have a significant impact on their life opportunities and where gaps in attainment are identified in further analysis these are addressed through direct support and challenge to schools and through commissioned improvement activities.
