(a) on the 1st day of July, 1958, the Minister of Housing and Local Government confirmed, with modifications, the above-mentioned Order (No. 1), and

(b) on the 27th day of June, 1958, the Minister of Housing and Local Government confirmed, with modifications, the above-mentioned Order (No. 2).

The effect of the Orders is as follows:—

Cobden Hill Dell.

To divert the public right of way over land to the west of Cobden Hill Dell, Radlett, from a point approximately 1,000 feet from Watling Street, Radlett, and proceeding in a north-easterly direction for a distance of 900 feet or thereabouts to a point near the north-western corner of Cobden Hill Dell, to a line using an existing public right of way commencing at a point 700 feet or thereabouts east-north-east of the south-western end of the footpath to be diverted and leading in a northerly direction for a distance of 562 feet or thereabouts to its intersection with the north-eastern end of the footpath to be extinguished. The existing right of way will be extinguished as from the 18th July, 1958.
