Police are not opposing the hours sought in this application, however I am requesting additional measures beyond those mentioned in the application in order that these assist in meeting the licensing objectives.

There is a clear link between crime & disorder and the consumption of alcohol. This is why the Act requires applicants to state what steps they are taking to meet the four objectives.

The minimum requirements that police would expect are the provision of door supervisors on those evenings where additional hours are utilised, no drinks promotions and correctly installed and functioning CCTV, both within and immediately outside the premises.

The applicant has suggested some additional measures to promote the four objectives. With regards the protection of children from harm we consider it an excellent condition that children are not permitted on the premises after 1900hrs save use of the patio, toilets and function room. I request that the applicant agree to a further condition that children are not permitted on any part of the premises beyond 2300hrs.

The application makes a request for extended hours for live music and dance and supply of alcohol but also makes request to remove the requirements under the Special Hours Certificate that obliges alcohol sale be ancillary to provision of substantial refreshment. The application is solely requesting longer vertical drinking time with no ability to consume refreshment should it be requested.

On 5Th February 2005 police came across a fight outside this premises. A karaoke night had been held at the location, it would appear that this attracted a number of the local youths. As the manager was asking people to leave a fight broke out between these people outside of the pub, the fight was seen by police and quickly dealt with. None of the parties involved wished to make

any allegations.

In this borough the small number of premises that currently operate 'late' or regular extended hours have entertainment incorporated within these hours and as a condition of these hours. These hours have been negotiated by use and proof of experience and by incorporating security measures into the conditions (e.g. door supervisors at a ratio of 1:50 patrons). This has vastly reduced the potential for disorder and has kept this borough a safer one.

On a Friday and Saturday night I request that a last entry or re-entry condition be imposed and set at midnight to avoid crime and disorder.

It is not known whether The CCTV system for this premises is of a suitable standard and police would request it be upgraded to Police Crime Reduction officer approval should this be applicable. Whenever incidents occur of disorder and criminality the lack of suitable CCTV evidence impairs the investigation. A condition must be made that should a varied licence be granted to the premises that an appropriate CCTV system be installed with all appropriate operating measures met.

Regarding prevention of public nuisance notices should be displayed asking customers to respect neighbours when leaving the premises. I ask that this be made a condition.

Similarly I suggest a condition of a terminal hour on the use of the exterior of the premises in order to avoid disturbance to neighbours.

I request it be made a condition that any S.34 AWP machine be either emptied at night or fitted with appropriate recommended security device (e.g. a 'boot' or "roller shutter cabinet").

I ask that the non-smoking area for children is not only provided but is enforced and that the panel consider the use of smoke extractors as a condition.

Regarding under age drinking I request a 'challenge under 21' policy be adopted.

Toughened glass should be a condition of a licence given to a premises granted extended hours.

Attendance at the local pub watch by a Licensee or the D.P.S. must be a condition. I am aware that the current Licensees attend the existing pub watch scheme.

All security measures such as this must comply to Crime Reduction Unit guidance. I request that the applicant contact the police Crime Reduction officers and that such an officer be allowed full access to all areas of the premises in order to review all security measures and that the applicant agree to any reasonable recommendations forthcoming in his report. This is to prevent crime and disorder.
