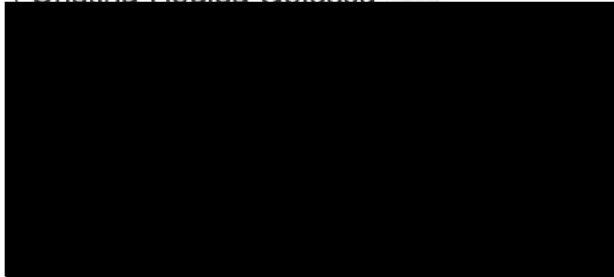

**Annex 1 – Mandatory Conditions**

Mandatory conditions where licence authorises supply of alcohol:

- 1 No supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence -
  - a) at a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence, or
  - b) (b) at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended
2. Every supply or sale of alcohol made under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.

Mandatory condition where licence requires door supervision:

Where one or more individuals are required to be at the premises to carry out a security activity, such individual(s) must be licensed by the Security Industry Authority.

Mandatory Conditions Order 2010

1.—(1) The responsible person shall take all reasonable steps to ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.

(2) In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises in a manner which carries a significant risk of leading or contributing to crime and disorder, prejudice to public safety, public nuisance, or harm to children—

(a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to—

(i) drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or

(ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);

(b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic (other than any promotion or discount available to an individual in respect of alcohol for consumption at a table meal, as defined in section 159 of the Act);

(c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less;

(d) provision of free or discounted alcohol in relation to the viewing on the premises of a sporting event, where that provision is dependent on—

(i) the outcome of a race, competition or other event or process, or

(ii) the likelihood of anything occurring or not occurring;

(e) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-

social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner.

2. The responsible person shall ensure that no alcohol is dispensed directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of a disability).

3. The responsible person shall ensure that free tap water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.

4.—(1) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder shall ensure that an age verification policy applies to the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.

(2) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and a holographic mark.

5. The responsible person shall ensure that—

(a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures—

(i) beer or cider: ½ pint;

(ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and

(iii) still wine in a glass: 125 ml; and 250 ml

(b) customers are made aware of the availability of these measures.

Mandatory conditions where licence authorises exhibition of films:

(1) The admission of persons under the age of 18 years to exhibitions of films must be restricted in accordance with any recommendation made by the British Board of Film Classification, except where condition 2 applies.

(2) The admission of persons under the age of 18 years to exhibitions of films must be restricted in accordance with any recommendation made by the relevant licensing authority regarding the film in question

### **Annex 2 - Conditions consistent with the operating Schedule**

1. A zero tolerance towards illegal drugs will be enforced at all times.

2. If a disc jockey is used on any night then he/she will ask customers to leave quietly.

3. All instances of crime and disorder will be reported to the police and will be kept in an incident log book.

4. Additional patrols will take place by members of staff, internally and externally, to limit any noise pollution when entertainment is being offered within the premises.

5. When children are allowed upon the premises, any entertainment offered within the premises will be suitable for young persons.

**Annex 3 - Conditions attached after a hearing by the licensing authority.**

Condition 1. CCTV to be installed and maintained in accordance with reasonable police requests.

Condition 2. No children on the premises after 2100.

Condition 3. SIA approved door supervisors to be employed as agreed by the Police.

Condition 4. Noise or vibration shall not be permitted to come out of premises as to cause a nuisance.

Condition 5. AWP machines to be emptied or fitted with a security 'boot'.

Condition 6. Signs to be prominently displayed at all exits asking people to leave the premises in a quiet and orderly manner and respecting the needs of the local residents.

Condition 7. Doors and windows must be kept shut during hours when regulated entertainment takes place, save for entry and exit through the doors of the premises.

Condition 8. No food, beverages or alcohol can be taken or consumed outside after 2330.

Condition 9. At the conclusion of the sale of alcohol at the premises, no entry or re-entry to the premises is allowed until the premises is permitted to re-open the following morning in accordance with the premises licence.
