Harrow Virtual School Analysis of 2014 KS4 Outcomes (GCSE's and other equivalent qualifications)

- Currently we have 25 pupils who have just completed Year 11
- Of these, 13 have been in Care less than a year (including 7 who have only been in care since April 2014)
- 10 are UASC
- Of the 25 pupils:
- 15 were entered for GCSE
- 3 were entered for ESOL qualifications
- 4 was not entered for any qualifications
- 2 have statements of SEN
- 1 is in custody
- Of the 15 entered for GCSEs:

5 A*-C

- 1 pupil from Nower Hill obtained 6 A*-C and plans to do media studies at West Herts.
- (VS had a lot of input into preventing this pupil being excluded for challenging behaviour and worked closely with Deputy Head throughout his Year 11. He is known to YOT)

5 A*-G

- 7 pupils got 5 A*-G
- 5 of the 7 pupils also got BTEC qualifications which are equivalent to up to 4 GCSEs but are not reported
- 2 of these pupils were UASC
- 4 of the pupils had no knowledge of previous education (prior to arrival -earliest 2012)
- 1 pupil has experienced 3 placements in the last 18 months and his mother is about to be deported following custody. He is gifted in drama and is staying onto his school 6th form
- 6 of these pupils were in Harrow mainstream schools and 1 in a Barnet mainstream school
- All of the pupils have College Placements/Apprenticeships

1 A*-G

- 13 pupils got at least 1 A*-G
- 1 pupil has experienced mental health problems
- 1 pupil with a traveller background has not engaged in formal education but took one GCSE
- 2 Pupils got U's (Jubilee and HTS)

Of the other pupils

- 3 pupils did an ESOL Entry Level courses
- 2 pupils at SEN Schools and achieved Entry Level qualifications

- 3 entered the country too late to be entered for exams
- 1 is in custody (I have contacted YOT to find out if exams were taken)
- 1 pupil in a Brent school was not entered for any formal exams
- Our most successful pupils are the ones who are consistently in the same school
- Schools report that Emotional and Social needs affect results detrimentally and Mental Health needs must be addressed especially from Y9 upwards
- The impact of the new robust Virtual School will not be felt for a couple of years

DfE consider those who have been in care for more than a year from 31.3.14 which is 10 pupils

Two CLA has been placed in Y10 so will take GCSEs next year (so do not appear in this year's VS figures)

2 Pupils got at least 5 A*-G

- Of these 1 pupil has experienced 3 placements in the last 18 months and his mother is about to be deported following custody. He is gifted in drama and is staying onto his school 6th form
- The other (UASC) received an ear injury following a bomb blast in his home country. He had no previous education but has now established a love for learning

Of the other pupils:

1 pupils got 4 A*-G and a BTEC qualification. He received 3's in KS2 and was placed out of borough

1 pupil with a traveller background has never engaged in formal education but took a GCSE and obtained an F grade in English

1 pupil (UASC) got a Maths qualification (4MAOF) and an ESOL entry level

1 pupil is in a residential Special School

The other 2 pupils are UASC and one of these got an ESOL qualification. The other pupil was in a Brent school which did not have the option of taking an ESOL qualification.
