

STATUTORY CONSULTATION

IMPORTANT – THIS AFFECTS YOU – PLEASE READ



#### What is this about?

An informal public consultation was conducted in October/November 2013 to review the current parking issues in the Queensbury area.

The results of the informal public consultation were presented to the Traffic and Road Safety Advisory Panel (TARSAP) on 5th February 2014. TARSAP were asked to approve the recommendations made in the report and to take the scheme forward to Statutory Consultation. The recommendations were based on the responses from the residents and businesses in the previous consultation.

At TARSAP, the members of the panel made a collective decision that Everton Drive be removed from the proposed scheme and that all of Reynolds Drive be included in the statutory consultation. Further information on this can be found in the published minutes of the meeting. Link provided below.

As a result of the panel decision a further consultation specific to Everton Drive was undertaken which concluded that the majority of respondents (59%) did support parking controls in Everton Drive if the surrounding roads were controlled.


The following recommendations will be taken to the next stage, which is Statutory Consultation. Statutory Consultation is the legal process that the council is required to undertake before any changes can be made to any waiting or loading restrictions, or designated parking bays on the public highway.

Below is a summary of the recommendations, which can be viewed in association with the enclosed plans.

- Charlton Road (west side odd numbers) double yellow line, no parking at any time, be installed from Queensbury Circle to approximately 15 metres south of Moorhouse Road including the island gaps to the service road;
- Charlton Road (west side odd numbers) single yellow line operational Monday to Saturday 8am to 6:30pm be installed from Moorhouse Road to Court Close
- Charlton Road (east side even numbers) single yellow line operational Monday to Saturday 8am to 6:30pm be installed from Queensbury Roundabout to the property boundary of nos. 232/234;
- Everton Drive a new Controlled Parking Zone (CPZ) be created operating Monday to Sunday 8am - Midnight;
- Honeypot Lane (no. 206 to no. 302 and no. 219 to no. 339) a new Controlled Parking Zone (CPZ) be created operating Monday to Sunday 8am - Midnight in conjunction with Everton Drive;
- Honeypot Lane (the north-eastern slip road, fronting no. 180 to no. 302) double yellow line,

no parking at any time, be installed at the entry points of the slip road off the main Honeypot Lane carriageway;

- Honeypot Lane (the north-eastern slip road, fronting no. 180 to no. 204) northeast side
  install Pay and Display parking bays operating Monday to Saturday 8am to 6:30pm with the
  tariff of £0.10 per 20 minutes and on southwest side install double yellow lines
- Lawrence Crescent a new Controlled Parking Zone (CPZ) be created operating Monday to Friday 11am – 12 noon be installed;
- Malvern Gardens (Honeypot Lane to no. 93 and no. 112) a new Controlled Parking Zone (CPZ) be created operating Monday to Sunday 8am – Midnight in conjunction with Everton Drive;
- Mary Close and Ruth Close single yellow line operational Monday to Friday 3pm to 4pm including slip road from Honeypot Lane;
- Mary Close and Ruth Close (slip road from Honeypot Lane) double yellow line, no parking at any time, be installed 15 metres either side of the vehicle entrance to playing fields;
- Millais Gardens a new Controlled Parking Zone (CPZ) be created operating Monday to Friday 11am – 12 noon be installed;
- Mollison Way (east of Constable Gardens) extend existing double yellow lines both sides of road approximately 8 metres;
- Mollison Way (east of Constable Gardens, north side even numbers) single yellow line operational Monday to Saturday 8am to 6:30pm be installed from end of double yellow lines to the property boundary of nos. 74/76;
- Mollison Way (east of Constable Gardens, south side odd numbers) single yellow line operational Monday to Friday 11am 12 noon be installed from end of double yellow lines to the property boundary of nos. 31/33. Please note that a separate consultation on proposals to improve the bus route on Mollison Way (east of Constable Gardens) has been carried out;
- Mollison Way (north and south shopping parades) install Pay and Display Monday to Saturday 9am – 6:30pm with the tariff of £0.10 per 20 minutes;
- Mollison Way (Turner Road to Cotman Gardens) to note the installation of inset parking bays and waiting restrictions in accordance with the Mollison Way Bus Route Improvement Scheme which is separate from the parking review;
- Moorhouse Road (both sides including across service road entrance) double yellow line, no parking at any time, be installed from Charlton Road to approximately 18 metres into Moorhouse Road;
- Reynolds Drive a new Controlled Parking Zone (CPZ) be created operating Monday to Sunday at any time;
- Turner Road (Borough boundary to roundabout, southwest side odd numbers) double yellow lines from borough boundary to northwest side of driveway of no. 1 Turner Road;
- Turner Road (Borough boundary to roundabout, southwest side odd numbers) single yellow line operational Monday to Saturday 8am to 6:30pm be installed from double yellow lines detailed above to existing double yellow line at roundabout;



- Turner Road (Borough boundary to roundabout, northeast side, even numbers) single yellow line operational Monday to Friday 11am – 12 noon be installed from borough boundary to existing double yellow line at roundabout;
- Turner Road (south-western side of roundabout) single yellow line operational Monday to Friday 11am – 12 noon be installed around southwest side of roundabout between existing double yellow lines;
- Turner Road (roundabout to Camrose Avenue) a new Controlled Parking Zone (CPZ) be created operating Monday to Friday 11am - 12 noon and 3pm – 4pm and Saturday - Sunday 11am - 12 noon;
- Winchester Road (Honeypot Lane to no. 40 and no. 41) a new Controlled Parking Zone (CPZ) be created operating Monday to Sunday 8am – Midnight in conjunction with Everton Drive;
- Winchester Road (northwest side even numbers) single yellow line operational Monday to Sunday 8am midnight from no. 40 to Malvern Gardens;
- Introduce "at any time" waiting restrictions (double yellow lines) at junctions, in turning heads, along narrow sections of carriageway and at bends throughout the consultation area in accordance with guidance from the Highway Code and computer simulation of vehicle swept paths throughout the consultation area.

#### What happens next?

As mentioned earlier, this is the Statutory Consultation stage which is a legal requirement that the council needs to undertake prior to making a Traffic Management Order and implementing the proposals. The plans have been developed taking into account, where practical, all the comments we received during the previous consultation stage.

This is your opportunity to review the plans in private and make an informed decision and any final comments that you have about the proposal. It will not be possible to add to or increase the extent of the restrictions, as the scheme has been developed using previous residents' and businesses' comments. However, minor changes that reduce the scale of the proposals where they do not impact on safety for the wider community may still be possible. Alternatively the changes could be abandoned.

We will advertise the Traffic Management Order by placing notices on street lamp columns and in a local paper on or about **7**<sup>th</sup> **August 2014** which will also explain where the plans can be seen. This would give anyone a chance to comment or place a formal objection if they wish to do so by **27**<sup>th</sup> **August 2014**.

If there is a significant number of objections to what is proposed which demonstrates a consensus around an alternative suggestion or changes, then, if the objections are upheld it may be necessary to give all the affected properties in any such area the opportunity to comment on these changes. This will result in a delay in the scheme being implemented in these areas until there is a clear indication that the affected properties agree to the alterations.

The results and any formal objections will be presented to the next available TARSAP meeting for consideration before proceeding to implementation on the agreed measures. It is anticipated that the results will be reported to TARSAP on 2nd October 2014. If there are any formal objections then TARSAP will determine what action needs to be taken. Once approval to proceed has been obtained from the Portfolio Holder, the scheme will be given to our contractors to implement and

all residents will be informed of the outcome.

#### Making a formal statutory objection

Under the legislation which controls the statutory consultation process anyone can make a comment or formal statutory objection to the proposals. However a statutory objection needs to be made in **writing (email is acceptable)** including the word **object** or **objection** (to distinguish it clearly from comments) and the **reason** for the basis of the objection on how you are **materially affected** by the proposals together with your name and address. The law sets out a strict timetable for considering formal objections.
