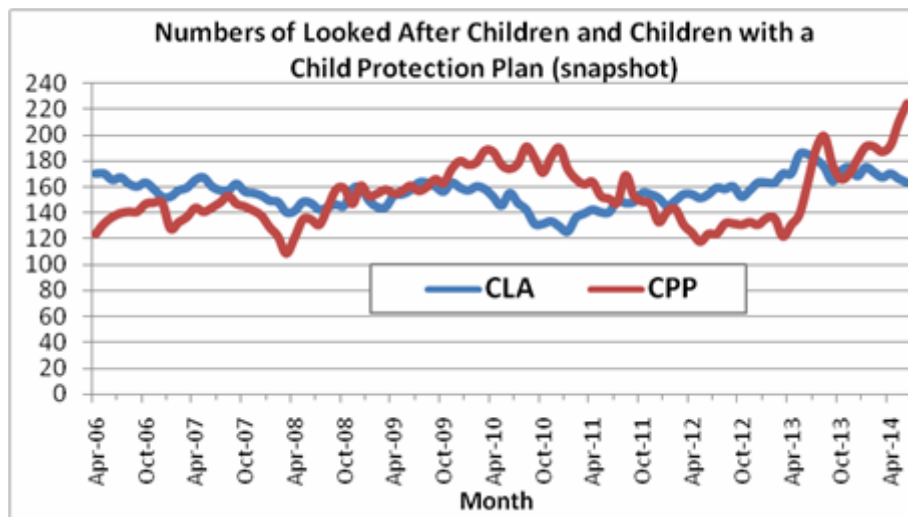

## Part B –Numbers of CLA and CPP over time



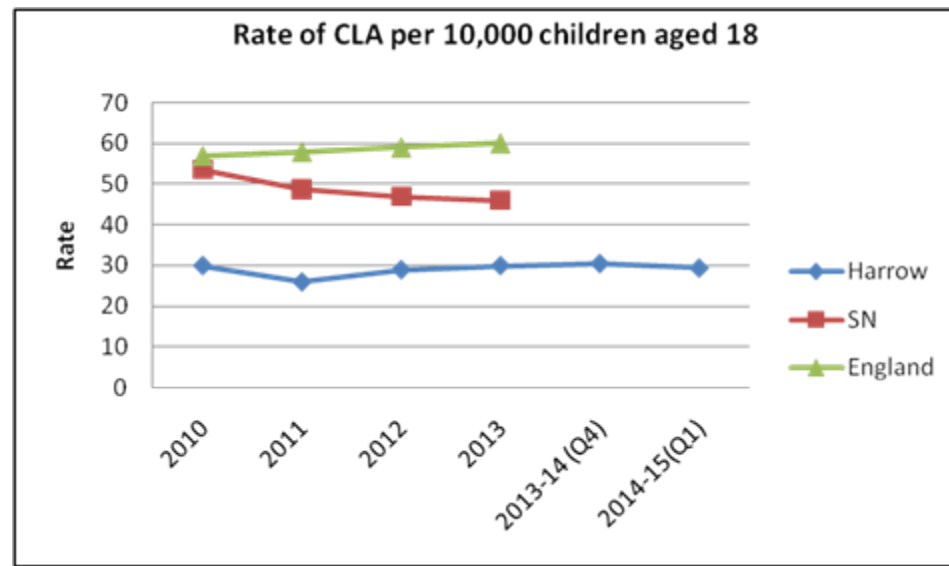
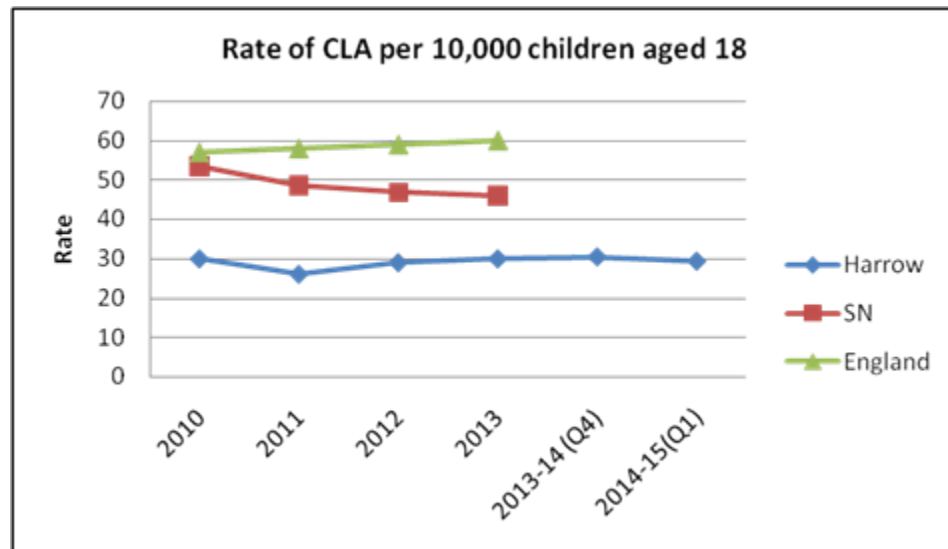
CPP numbers have risen significantly in 2013-14 to the current level of 221. The rise which corresponds with a lowering of thresholds, gives a rate of 40.4 per 10,000, which brings Harrow above comparator rates.

CLA numbers have remained stable and 163 children were looked after at end of June. Harrow continues to have a significantly lower rate of CLA than comparators. Further analysis of the statistical neighbours group shows that Merton, Kingston and Redbridge have similar rates. The average is pulled up by Croydon Hillingdon and Hounslow which have high numbers of CLA.

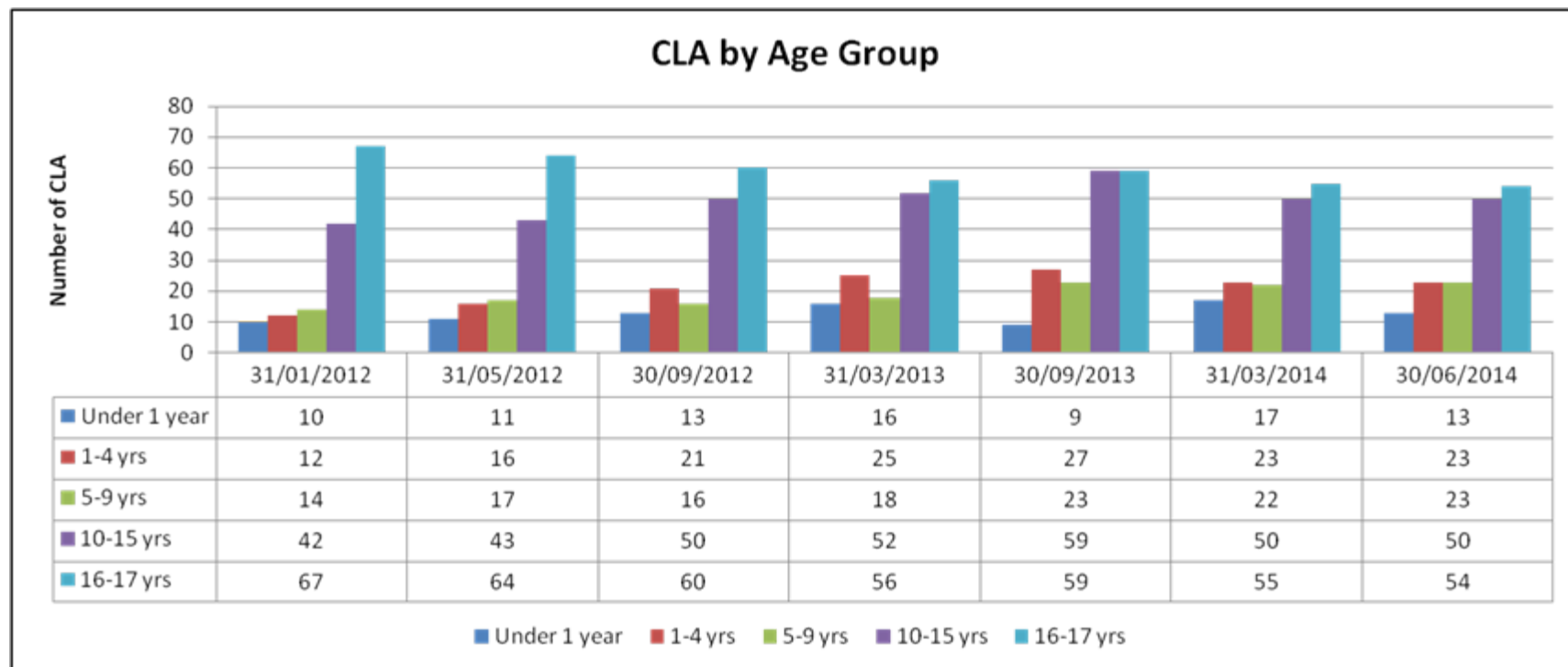

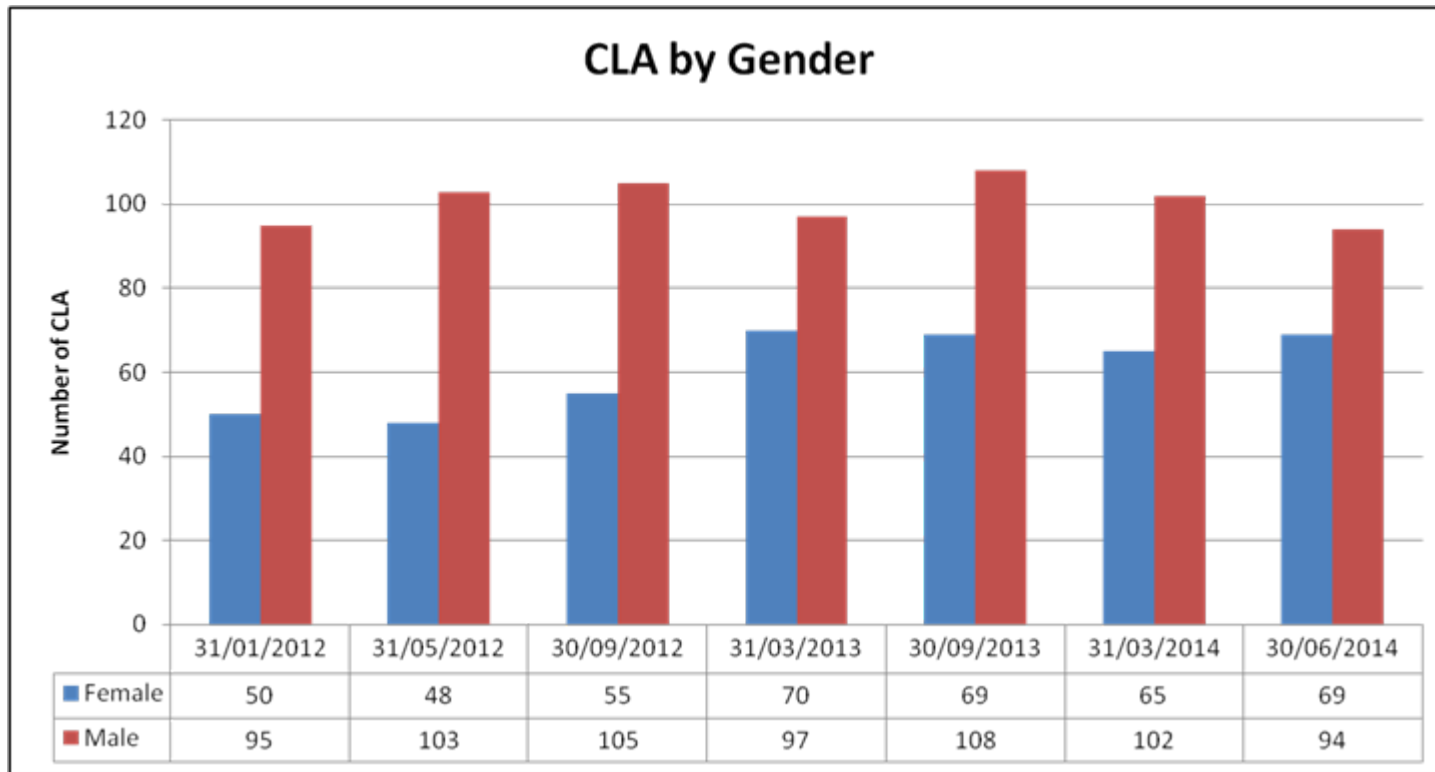

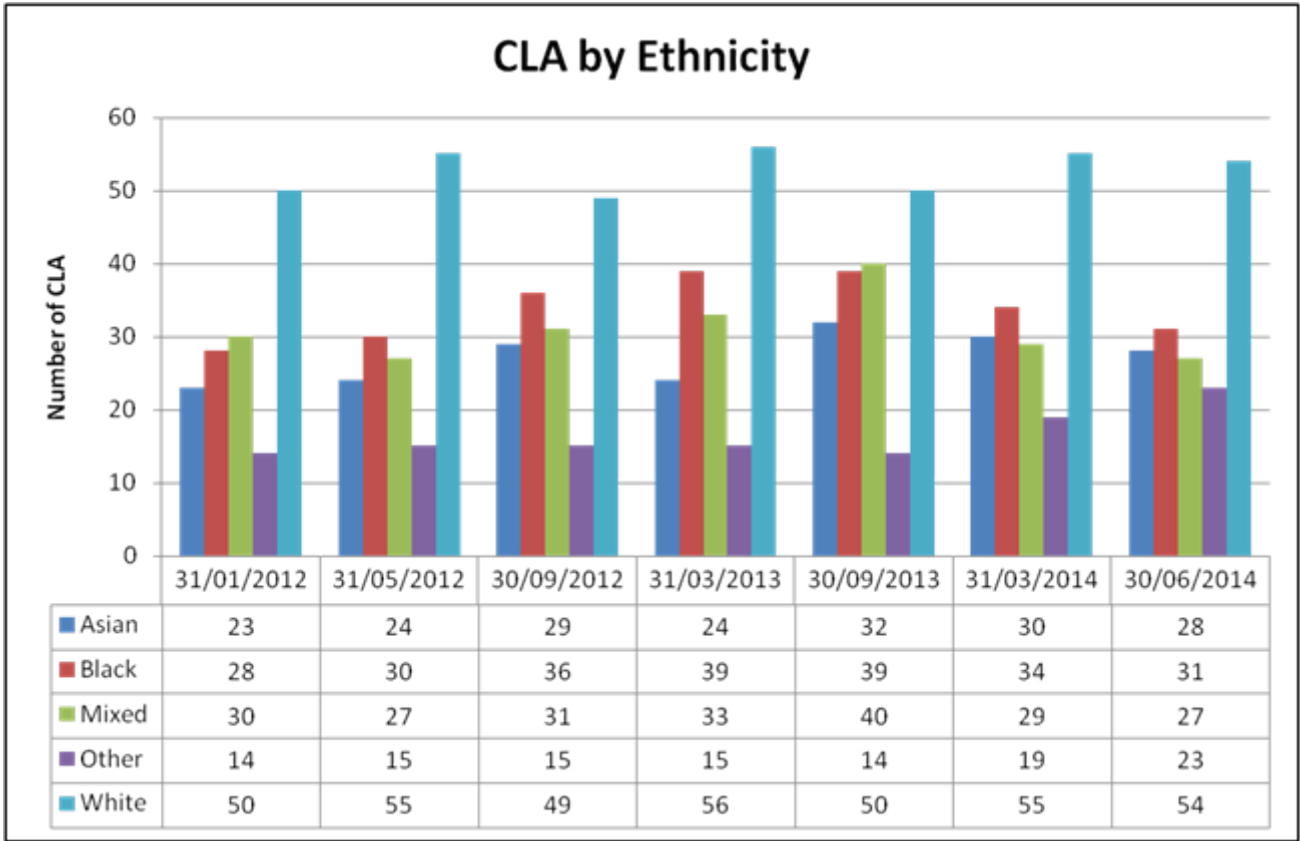

There is a small increase in looked after children from Asian & other backgrounds and a reduction in those from mixed and Black backgrounds. Overall two thirds of Harrows children looked after population is from BME groups

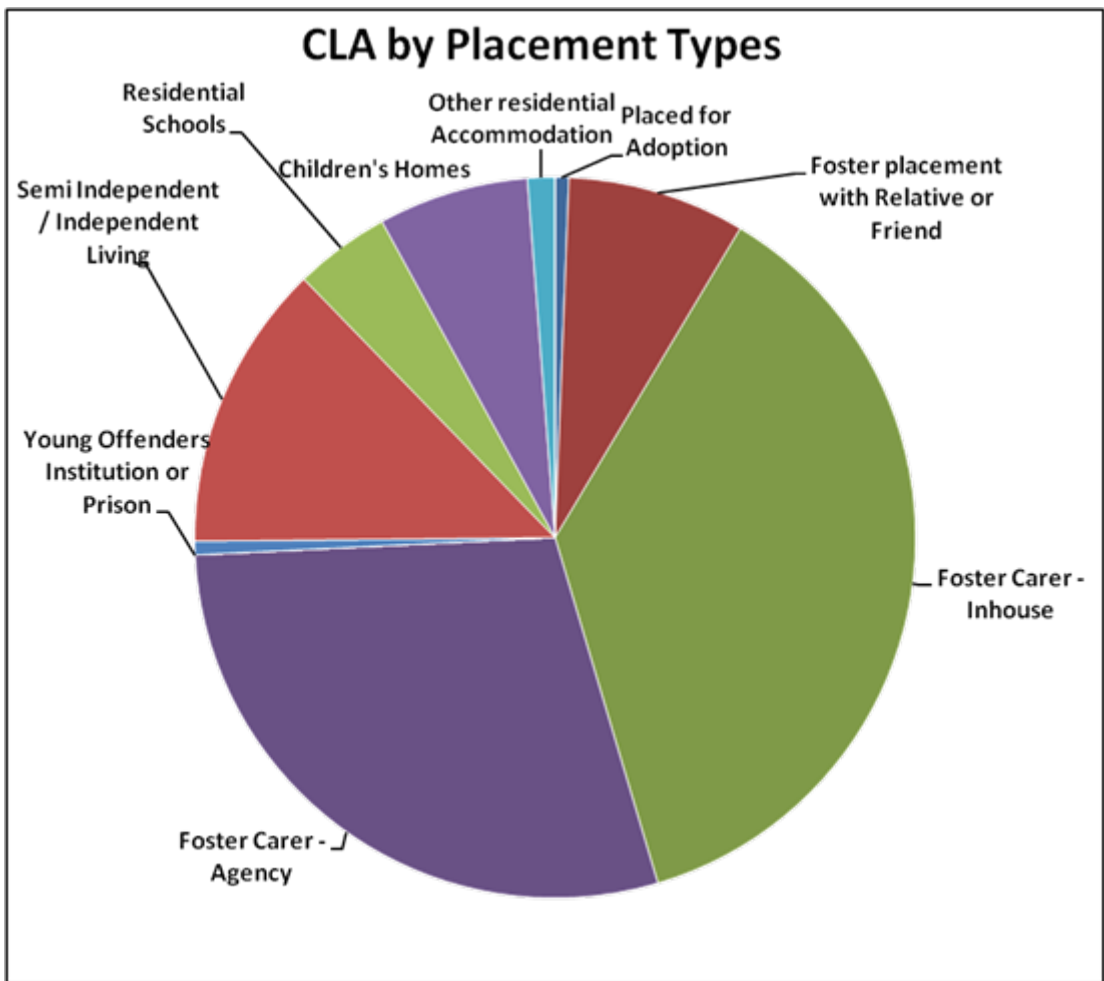

73.6% of Children looked after are in a foster placement, statistical neighbours and England averages are around 73 - 75%. Numbers of in-house placements have been increasing. Particular challenges are faced with our older CLA cohort.

All placement moves are scrutinised at a panel for authorisation before they are implemented. Support packages have been developed to prevent placement breakdown .

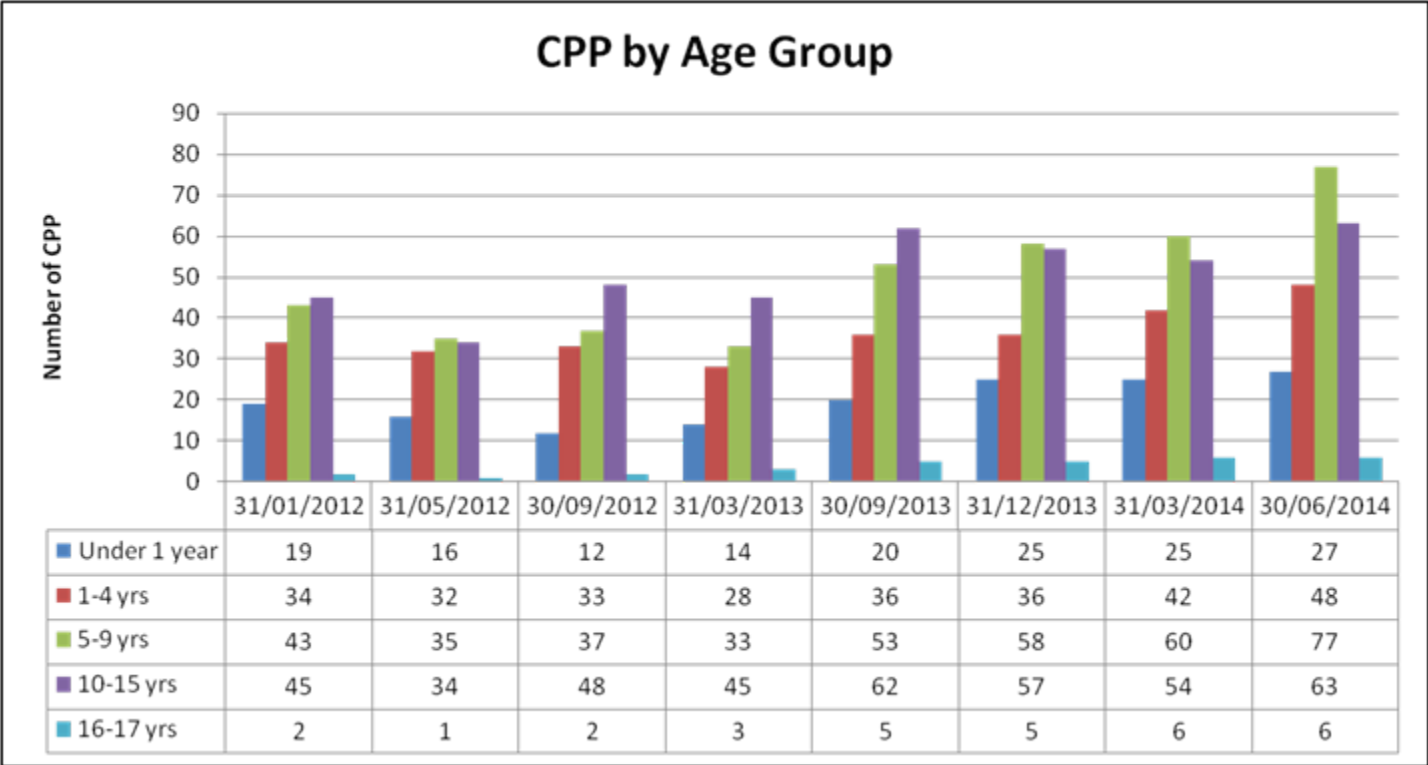

# Part D: Children Subject to a Child Protection Plan (CPP)

Children are made the subject of a child protection plan (CPP) when they are considered to be at risk of physical, sexual, emotional harm or neglect. Overall Harrow has seen an increase in the number of children with a CPP. At 30<sup>th</sup> June 2013, 163 children had a Child Protection Plan. This has risen to 224 as of 30<sup>th</sup> June 2014

## D1 - CPP by Age



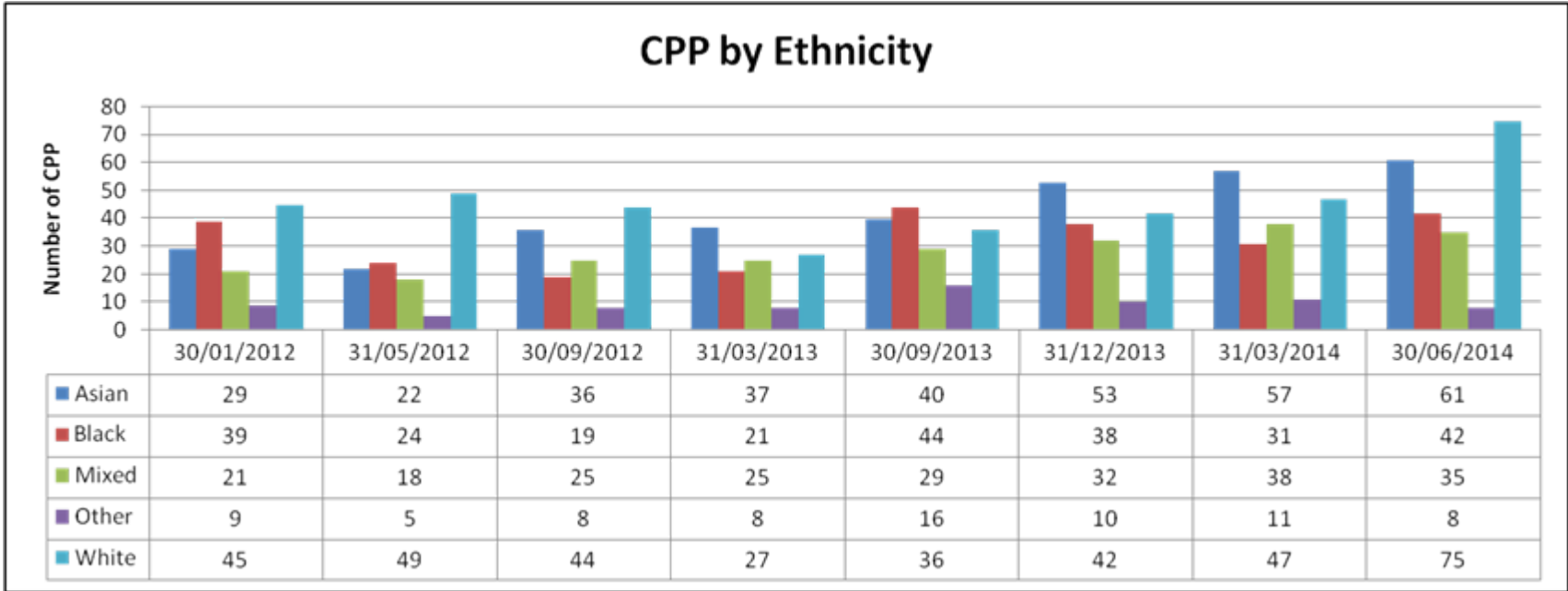

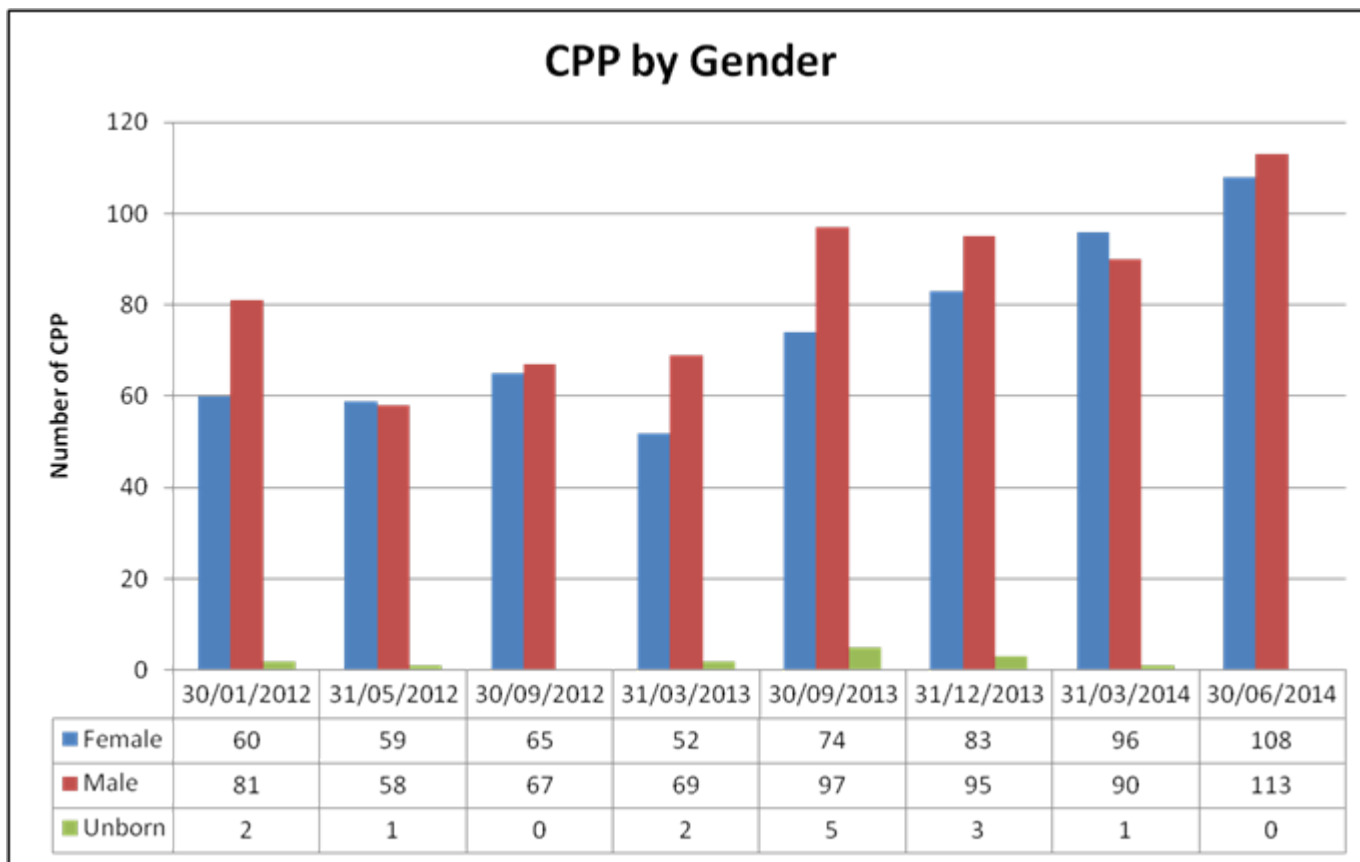

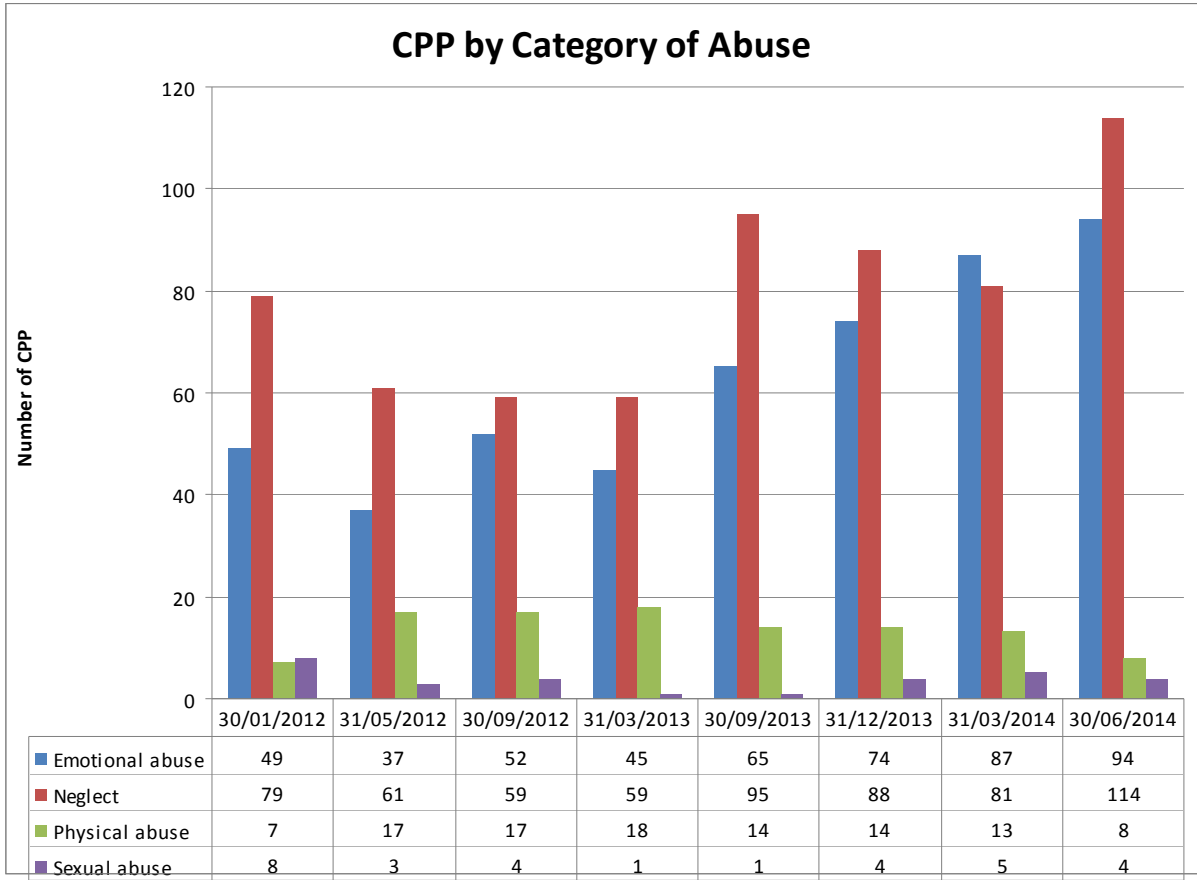

**D4 - CPP by Category of Abuse**



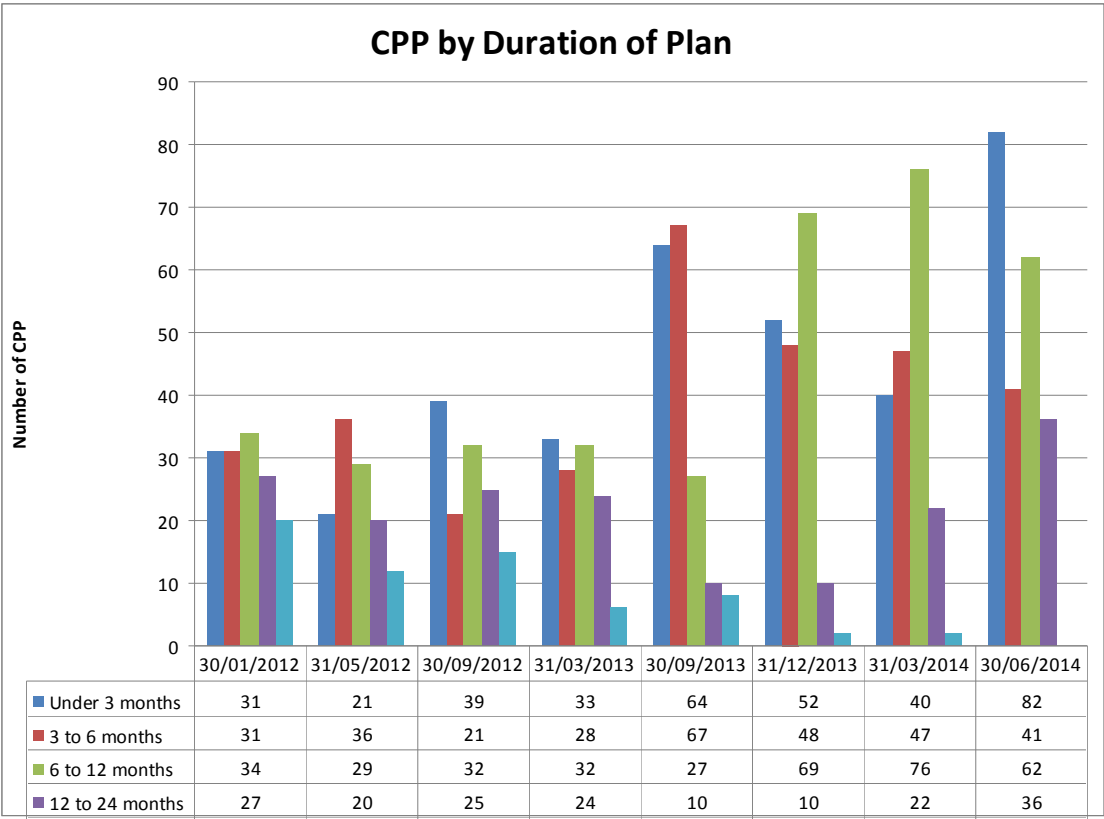

Co-ordinated work has taken place to progress and end plans in a timely manner, meaning that the numbers of plans lasting over 24 months have reduced.

The number of plans under 3months has increased sharply due to the increase in numbers of Child Protection plans in recent months. The increase in new CP Plans last year is likely to have contributed to the increase in plans having a duration of 12 - 24months.
