### **Section 2 – Report**

#### Introductory paragraph

For the 2014/15 municipal year members of the Overview and Scrutiny Leadership group decided that they would like to look at the council's budget setting process including budget consultation and effective scrutiny of the budget and Medium Term Financial Strategy. The main objective of this work is to generate recommendations for developing these processes in the future, to enable the council to find the savings needed in the next three years in the most effective way possible.

Councillor Pamela Fitzpatrick has been nominated as the Chair for the challenge panel. The challenge panel will be held in mid-late December 2014 and will hear evidence from Council officers and portfolio holders.

Written submissions will be invited from voluntary sector organisation, other councils, trade unions representing Council employees, and organisations with expertise relating to public sector budget planning processes. A small number of witnesses may be invited to attend the Challenge Panel based on the content of their submissions.

Any submissions from challenge panel members (or other Councillors) from their own research/ experience/ knowledge will also be considered.

#### **Financial Implications**
