7.1.14 Non-Executive Cabinet Members

The Leader may appoint a maximum of 4 **non executive members of Cabinet from the voluntary sector and** a minimum of 1 ~~Non-Executive member~~ from the opposition parties as nominated by their group leaders ~~as Non-Executive members of Cabinet~~. They may speak but not vote on items before the Cabinet in private and public meetings and have commensurate access to documents as full Cabinet members except for draft Cabinet reports.

Executive Procedural Rules para 5.3

The Leader may appoint a maximum of 4 ~~and a minimum of 1~~ Non-Executive Members **of Cabinet** from **the voluntary sector and** from the opposition parties as nominated by their group leaders ~~as Non-Executive Members of Cabinet~~. Code of Conduct for Councillors
