in the ground floor restaurant and that they also want to do this until 0300 at New Year. I am very concerned about the impact this is likely to have on the residents of the local streets.

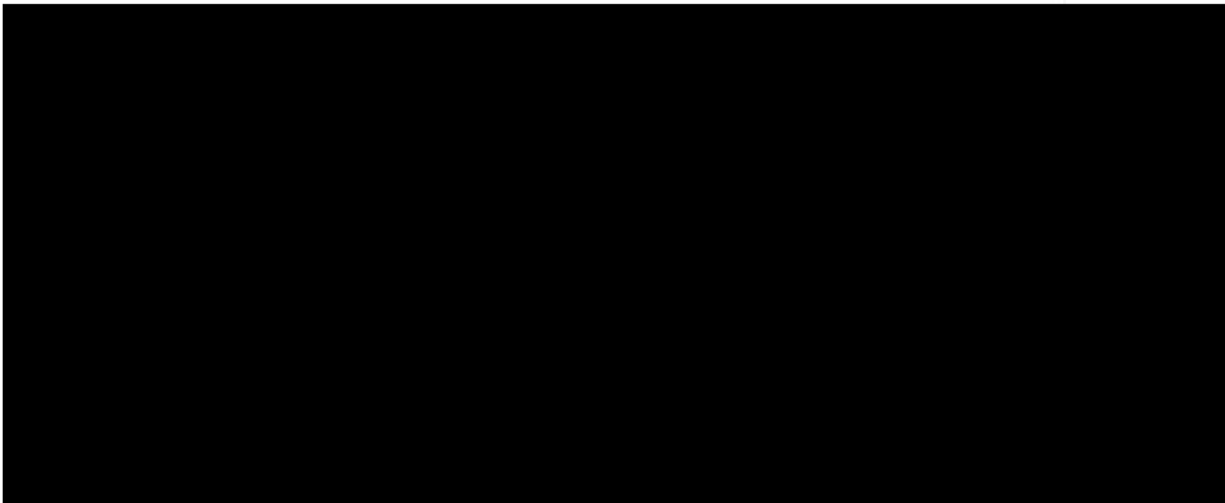
The Harrow Street Pastors have recounted their experiences elsewhere in Harrow of the impact of late night drinking. I write to object to a late night licence being granted.

Dear Sirs,

I wish to register my objections to the proposed granting of the alcohol and music licenses and the change of use of the Wealdstone Inn premises in Harrow Weald. The granting of these licenses will cause considerable inconvenience and congestion to residents in the area.

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Apart from the fact that the car park on the premises is not large enough to accommodate the number of vehicles likely to come to the venue, there is the problem of noise late at night.

The damage to property also arises. I live very near to the building and, prior to the closing of The Wealdstone Inn, frequently had damage to my garden fence and endured late night noise and, on occasions could hear arguing and fighting. All due to bad behaviour by people who, no doubt, had consumed too much alcohol. This has not happened since the closure of The Wealdstone Inn. This could, of course, be a coincidence, but my feeling is that there is a connection. The fact that, apart from drinking on the premises, alcohol can be purchased to take away is very disturbing.

I would have thought that in view of the fact that both The Red Lion and The Wealdstone Inn were closed due to the trouble (drugs and fighting etc) they attracted, that the last thing Harrow Weald needed was an reincarnation of those venues.

I trust that my views will be taken into consideration before any decision is taken.
