#### **Annex 1 – Mandatory Conditions**

Mandatory conditions where licence authorises supply of alcohol:

- 1 No supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence
  - a) at a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence, or
  - b) (b) at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended
- 2. Every supply or sale of alcohol made under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.

Mandatory condition where licence requires door supervision:

Where one or more individuals are required to be at the premises to carry out a security activity, such individual(s) must be licensed by the Security Industry Authority.

Mandatory Conditions Order 2010

- 1.—(1) The responsible person shall take all reasonable steps to ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.
- (2) In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises in a manner which carries a significant risk of leading or contributing to crime and disorder, prejudice to public safety, public nuisance, or harm to children—
- (a)games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to—
- (i)drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or
- (ii)drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);
- (b)provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic (other than any promotion or discount available to an individual in respect of alcohol for consumption at a table meal, as defined in section 159 of the Act);
- (c)provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less;
- (d)provision of free or discounted alcohol in relation to the viewing on the premises of a sporting event, where that provision is dependent on—
- (i) the outcome of a race, competition or other event or process, or
- (ii)the likelihood of anything occurring or not occurring;
- (e)selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-



social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner.

- 2. The responsible person shall ensure that no alcohol is dispensed directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of a disability).
- 3. The responsible person shall ensure that free tap water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.
- 4.—(1) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder shall ensure that an age verification policy applies to the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.
- (2) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and a holographic mark.
- 5. The responsible person shall ensure that-
- (a)where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures—

(i)beer or cider: ½ pint;

(ii)gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and (iii)still wine in a glass: 125 ml; and 250 ml

(b)customers are made aware of the availability of these measures.

#### Annex 3 - Conditions attached after a hearing by the licensing authority.

- 1. A 30-minute drinking up time to be allowed for gradual dispersal from the premises.
- 2. The patrons to be encouraged to leave the premises quietly.
- 3. Appropriate signage to be in place to request patrons to leave quietly.
- 4. No entry or re-entry to the premises to be allowed after 0000.

Additional conditions attached after hearing on 18th April 2011

- 1.The Designated Premises Supervisor must ensure that no independent sound system shall be brought on to the premises and used for entertainment within the premises so as to cause a public nuisance.
- 2. An appropriate automatic noise device must be fitted to the premises. The device should be set at a volume so any amplified sound emanating from the premises does not cause a public nuisance. A calibration certificate must be supplied for the installation of the unit and submitted to the licensing authority for approval.



- 3. An accurate and up to date log book shall be maintained in a format specified by the licensing authority, providing details of door supervisors employed in respect of the premises and which shall be comprised of two distinct parts:
- i. Recording the name, address, telephone number and registration number of each door supervisor employed in respect of the premises, whether employed directly or through an agency, and the name, address and telephone number of the agency providing the supervisor, where the supervisor is not employed.
- ii. Recording the name and registration number of each door supervisor, date and time of commencement and finishing of work, the signature of the door supervisor in respect of both and details of any incident in which the door supervisor was involved, including the calling of the police and any police action taken.
- 4.There sha<mark>ll be a minimum of one door supervisor on duty at the premises every Friday and Saturday from 19h00 until the premises is closed to the public.</mark>
- 5. There shall be a minimum of one door supervisor for every seventy five persons (or part thereof), with a maximum number of persons accommodated at any one time not exceeding 200 (or the maximum stipulated in the fire risk assessment) on the ground floor.
- 6. CCTV cameras and equipment shall be installed, operated and maintained in good working and in accordance with the recommendations of the police, one copy of such recommendations being lodged with the premises licence holder and one copy accessible on the premises.
- 7. A Central Station Monitored Intruder Alarm and Panic Alarm system shall be installed, operated and maintained in good working order and in accordance with the recommendations of the police, one copy of such recommendations being lodged with the premises licence holder and one copy accessible on the premises.
- 8. The premises licence holder and designated premises supervisor of the premises shall adhere to the guidance of in the Metropolitan Polices' Safe and Sound policy (or updated version thereof when applicable), with a documented door search policy including drug seizures and disposal of the same.
- 9. The premises staff are to permanently exclude any person found with weapons or illegal drugs at the premises as well as customers known to have contributed to crime or serious disorder in the premises.
- 10. The premises are to take all reasonable steps to make security and other staff aware of the identities of excluded persons.
- 11. Exclusion books are to be kept at the premises and are to be fully maintained stating full details including name and description (and photograph if available): such books are to set out full reasons for the exclusion as well as the period of the exclusion. The books are to be made available for inspection by officers of the police and local authority at all times.
- 12. Any information regarding crimes committed within the premises, including suspected drug dealing and violence, must be reported to the police immediately or in any event no later than within 24 hours.




- 13. A direct landline telephone number for the premises shall be displayed at the entrances to the premises and on request contact details for the area manager shall be provided immediately.
- 14. The premises licence holder, or nominees thereof, will conduct meetings where requested with local residents to address any concerns arising from the operation of the premises.
- 15. "Challenge 25" scheme, as agreed with the Metropolitan Police shall be implemented at all points of sale for alcohol.
- 16. All bar staff will undergo training in the "Challenge 25" scheme and their personal responsibilities under the Licensing Act 2003. A record will be kept to record the name of the individual trained, the date they undertook the training and who they were trained by.
- 17. Children under the age of 18 are not permitted on the premises after 19h00 save for when attending pre-booked events in the function room. The designated premises supervisor must provide the licensing officer at Harrow police station with 7 days written notice of any such functions.
- 18. AWP machines are to be either emptied nightly and signage indicating that this is done prominently displayed or be fitted with an appropriate police approved security device (such as a roller shutter or 'boot').
- 19. The designated premises supervisor, or if he or she is not available, a Personal Licence e holder on behalf of the designated premises supervisor, is to participate in the pub watch scheme if one is in existence.
- 20. The Premises Licence Holder will monitor the operation of the premises at least every 8 weeks and keep a log of the outcome which shall be open to inspection by the Metropolitan Police and the Licensing Authority.
- 21. The emergency exit onto College Road should remain closed at all times except in case of emergency and be fitted with an audible and visible alarm
