Following the road safety investigation and public consultations carried out in the area in October 2003 and March 2004 it is proposed to implement a number of road safety measures. Briefly, these include gateway treatments, vehicle speed activated signs, cycle lanes, buff anti-skid surfacing, and yellow line waiting and loading restrictions at various locations together with a speed table in the service road.

The purpose of the yellow line waiting and loading restrictions is to improve traffic flow. Additionally, the proposal would improve visibility for exiting traffic from the side roads concerned.

The proposed speed table in the service road would improve safety and would deter parking at the proposed location. The proposal would make crossing the service road to and from the pelican crossing safer and more user friendly.

The proposed yellow line waiting and loading restrictions and the proposed speed table are shown on the enclosed plan. The implementation of these measures would be subject to the result of this consultation and the legal process of traffic order making currently underway, which includes consideration of objections (if any).

This is predominantly used by health centre visitors and there is a ready alternative to the rear of the centre. Coaches to the swimming pool/playing fields are also restricted by parking on the south side causing them to go on the wrong side of the road. This solution causes minimum disruption to residents when visitors to the health centre have a realistic alternative to the rear. By allowing parking on verges would also give an alternative to parking on the road.
Anthony Reed 138 Uxbridge Road HA5 4DS	I would like to see the waiting and loading restrictions applied to both sides of the Uxbridge Road between the Headstone Lane and Safeway/Morrisons roundabouts. Emergency parking outside the Elliot Hall medical centre could be a marked boxed section. Restricting parking would have obvious results on traffic flow.
Elliott Hall Medical Centre165 - 167 Uxbridge Road Hatch End HA5 4EA	These measures have the potential to increase the safety of this stretch of road and keep traffic moving. Two designated bays for blue badge holders outside the practice would further improve facilities for patients with mobility difficulties.

Martin Shannon 156 Uxbridge Road Hatch End HA5 4DS	Yellow line restriction that is being suggested is on wrong side of Uxbridge Road. Most restriction that is caused to this traffic route within and outside peak commuting time is outside the Elliott Hall Surgery situated on the south side of the Uxbridge Road. There are already signs at the Health Centre that indicate parking should not take place. Additionally it has been noticed that there is a lot of temporary and casual parking on the south side of Uxbridge Road related to visits to the revamped Morrisons Superstore. At our house we already have a restriction related to the bus stop directly outside. The suggested restriction would make it extremely difficult for even short-term visits to our address, including Parcelforce, delivery services etc who could be penalised for making a delivery at certain times. Two residents	The suggested yellow lines are on the wrong side of Uxbridge Road. Yellow lines would be more appropriate on the south side. The south side is predominantly used by health centre visitors which has parking at the rear.	Parking currently takes place mainly on the south side as there are a number of business premises on this side of the road. The north side is mainly residential with one surgery. Banning parking on the south side would result in parking being displaced to the north side. This would have safety implications as it is likely to result in haphazard crossing of the busy main road by pedestrians. Extraneous parking on the north side is also likely to lead to complaints from the frontages. Therefore, it is not recommended.
	By allowing parking on verges would also give an alternative to parking on the road.	The residents have off-street parking. The businesses also have off-street spaces for their visitors. Alternative parking is therefore available and allowing verge parking would be undesirable as the green areas would be churned out and become muddy, creating an eyesore and a maintenance problem.
	The suggested restriction would make it extremely difficult for even short-term visits to our address, including deliveries.	The loading restrictions would operate from 8 am to 10 am and from 4 pm to 6.30 pm, Monday to Friday. Outside these times, loading and unloading is permitted on the yellow lines for up to 20 minutes. Alternatively, parking would be unrestricted on the south side which could be used by visitors. The proposed yellow line waiting restrictions operate between 8 am and 6.30 pm, Monday to Friday in order to minimise the inconvenience for residents.
One resident	The restriction should be applied to the south side of Uxbridge Road, or both plus a 20 mph speed limit.	The purpose of the scheme is to deter obstructive parking which occurs when cars park on both sides of the road. It is not necessary to deter parking on both sides as the road is wide enough to

		accommodate parking on one side as well as two way traffic.
		A 20 mph speed limit would not be appropriate on the A410. This section of Uxbridge Road is one of its safest parts and a 20 mph speed limit cannot be justified on accident grounds. Additionally, the regulations indicate that a 20 mph speed limit could be considered where existing 85 percentile speeds (the speed not exceeded by 85% of vehicles) are already 24 mph or lower. This is not the case here. However, the proposed road safety scheme including narrower lanes, separated hatched centre line and speed activated sign would achieve lower speeds and a safer environment.
Two residents	Banning parking on the north side will increase parking on the other side. At present, visibility out of the access road adjacent the playing field is very poor due to parking on Uxbridge Road.	The frontages within the access road have generous off-street parking. There is a swimming pool and a nursery with parking for visitors and coaches. There are only two residential properties within the access road. Subject to the ghost capes policy elsewhere on the Agenda being agreed, it is recommended that ghost capes be provided at the service road junction with Uxbridge Road to Improve visibility by deterring parking close to the entrance to the access road.
	Numerous accidents occur here and access for coach traffic to swimming pool is problematic.	These may have been "damage only" collisions. There have been no reported personal injury collisions in the vicinity of the entrance to the access road in the last three years (to April 2005).
Elliott Hall Medical Centre	These measures have the potential to increase the safety of this stretch of road and keep traffic moving. Two designated bays for blue badge holders outside the practice would further improve facilities for patients with mobility difficulties.	The Medical Centre has off-street parking at the rear for visitors. On-street disabled persons spaces are not normally provided for businesses that can provide them off-street. As no parking controls are proposed on the south side where the Medical Centre is located, blue badge holders would still be able to park, in the street if they wish.
		It is therefore recommended that the objections be set aside.



Businesses have rear service roads for their servicing needs and there is a public car park for shoppers as well as on-street parking in the Uxbridge Road service roads. See also recommendation below.
Studio Gautier 415 Uxbridge Road	"They should have allocated parking spaces. The problem is car parking in i.e. 2/3 spaces."	The comment is not clear, but the assumption is that space for 2/3 cars should be marked without restrictions. See recommendation below.
CL Kitchen Transformation Company 286 Uxbridge Road	The no waiting at any time would make it extremely difficult to unload heavy deliveries.	There is a rear service road which could be used for deliveries without the need to kerbside loading/unloading. Also see recommendation below.
290 Uxbridge Road	"I strongly object to the proposed restriction in Grimsdykc Road. The only drivers you will penalise are disabled drivers who will be unable to park in Grimsdyke Road. Under the circumstances a disabled bay should be placed outside York House at the end of Grimsdyke Road."	In view of the objections and preliminary discussions with Transport for London (TfL) who under the Traffic Management Act 2004 make an assessment of the affects of the Council's proposals on the strategic road network, it is proposed to drop the advertised parking controls on the east side except for the first 10 metres at the Uxbridge Road end. This part of Grimsdyke Road already has 8 am to 6.30 pm, Monday to Friday yellow line waiting restrictions. The proposal was instigated in order to alleviate the congestion problems in Uxbridge Road caused by obstructive parking in

		Grimsdyke Road. It would be feasible to widen Grimsdyke Road by reducing the footway width on the west side by 0.2 metres. The footway is 4 metres wide and the proposal would not have a significant impact on pedestrians. This would mean parking by blue badge holders or loading/unloading could take place on the east side whilst at the same time maintaining two way traffic. This alternative proposal achieves the objectives of the original proposal but has less impact on the local community. It is proposed to implement the advertised double yellow line waiting restrictions and 8 am to 6.30 pm, Monday to Saturday loading restrictions at the first 10 metres of Grimsdyke Road at Uxbridge Road end together with the section stretching into Uxbridge Road as shown at Appendix F.
		It is therefore recommended that the advertised waiting and loading restrictions on the east side except for the first 10 metres at Uxbridge Road end be dropped in favour of road widening and implementation of the remainder of the advertised waiting and loading restrictions as shown at Appendix F and the objections be set aside.
