## Introduction.

An audit was undertaken in March 2016 of fifteen cases open to the Early Intervention Teams.

## Summary of findings.

- Cases passed to EIT for signposting to other services
- Cases stepping up to Children in need and back to Early Intervention Service
- Children taken out of lessons to meet with EIT worker
- E-CAF (Early help assessment) completed after an assessment undertaken in Children in need
- E-Caf completed after a lengthy period of intervention
- Providing behavioural support in school
- Lack of evidence of exit plans
- Supporting parents to apply for benefits
- A number of teenagers but no reference to the youth offer
- Domestic Violence prevention work not linked to the Independent Domestic Violence Advisor
- Lack of clarity of frequency of visit to young people
- Case records do not always reflect the intervention
- The voice of the child is not always evident
