I oppose the granting of this licence as I believe, if the licence is granted there is a likelihood of an increase in crime and disorder; there is a risk to public safety and there will b an increase in public nuisance.

Since I was elected in May 2014 I attend the regular meetings of the Edgware safer Neighbourhood Ward Panel. This is where community activists, elected Councillors and the local Metropolitan Police meet to look at crime and community safety in the Edgware Ward.

From these meetings the attendees learn from the Police where the crime hotspots are and I and my colleagues have learnt that Burnt Oak Broadway has become a crime hotspot.

The type of crimes occurring around Burnt Oak Broadway are street robbery; drunk and disorderly, prostitution, noise nuisance urination/defection in public areas.

This increase in crime and growth in public disorder has causal links to the growth in Edgware Ward of a migratory population that includes a high percentage of single young men. The men, largely from Romania, are living, on their own, in other words with no family support, and work very long hours.

When not working they get very lonely and feel isolated in a foreign country where they know few people and have limited language skills in English. Therefore, at weekends in particular, they seek solace from drink and sex. In other words, cheap alcohol and prostitution.

There are a lot of stores along Burnt Oak Broadway, between Columbia Avenue and Stag Lane that sell alcohol and much of it is very cheap. Some of it is illegal. I witnessed an HMRC/Trading Standards raid on a store not far from Tigris where £10,000 worth of beer was seized as it was stolen and was being sold very cheaply.

The impact of the current supply of alcohol has led to a growth of nuisance along residential roads like The Highlands. The Highlands meets Burnt Oak Broadway near Tigris Supermarket and the type of problem residents now experience is drunken young men walking down The Highlands late at night, drunk, rowdy, intimidating and urinating in public in the street.

If the Tigris Supermarket were to be allowed to sell alcohol 7/24 the store would be a magnet for the young men I have referred to and this could lead to a growth in alcohol abuse, prostitution and public nuisance.

The growth of alcohol abuse on the streets of the Edgware Ward is a driver of crime, and is a primary cause as to the settled community moving away from the area. This is having a deleterious impact on the community. I lived in the area, first as a child, from June 1957 through to November 1975, when I got married.

The area was always a stable community made up, until the early-1970's, of skilled white working class and a small number of Jewish families. In the early 1970's a large migration of Gujerati speaking Indians moved in who had been exiled from their African home by Jomo Kenyatta and Idi Amin (Kenya and Uganda).

The Gujerati and a smaller South Indian community have formed the backbone of Edgware Ward with the families being small-scale entrepreneurs and their children, educated locally, going into professional roles.

Thus, the area became diverse but stable. Other migrations have occurred over the last 40 years but the community was stable and prosperous. Since the end of the last decade a large number of EU residents have moved in. I and my 2 Councillor colleagues estimate they form 15% of the Edgware community and growing. 95% of that community are Romanian. It is principally the Romanian community who are living in rented units and often as single men and I believe it is this community that Tigris want to target with longer opening hours.

With the limits imposed by central government on public expenditure Council' are less likely to do community relations work with the Romanian community so the Council is unable to assist the community to assimilate and settle. It is also unable to engage on health protection where many Romanian men at weekends get so drunk they are legless (witnessed by me). This is having a serious impact on their health and well-being and is another reason to object to the granting of the licence.

I am prepared to attend the Licensing Panel as a witness and I have photographic evidence of the problems caused by alcohol abuse.



I object to increase in the Licencing hours on following grounds:

I oppose the granting of this licence as I believe, if the licence is granted there is a likelihood of an increase in crime and disorder; there is a risk to public safety and there will be an increase in public nuisance. Burnt Oak Broadway has become a crime hot spot.

It not uncommon to find a lot of empty beer cans and alcohol bottles all around the area. Drunken and disorderly behaviour is very common. We have had many complaints of persons urinating from the surrounding areas mainly around The Highlands. Residents have often found young drunken men walking in the area.

This kind of behaviour has direct link to public safety and residents feel threatened and unsafe to walk particularly young girls and women on their own.

There are already many shops selling alcohol in the area and allowing more shops will only add to the suffering of the residents.

This being the main shopping area for residents, even though there are no schools in the immediate vicinity of the shop, young persons and children use the Broadway regularly and adding one more shop selling alcohol will only add ricks to young persons and children.



I make this representation on behalf of the Licensing Authority.

In your application under Section 18, it is noted that you have not offered any additional conditions or offered to amend any conditions but are willing to further conditions.

Clear stipulations are used when establishing licensing conditions (please see section 1.16 of the statutory guidance).

The following proposal is made:

All current conditions that appear under annex 2 of the premises licence be removed replaced with the following:

1. The CCTV system to be maintained and operated in good order and to the satisfaction of the Metropolitan Police's reasonable requests. The medium upon which the images are recorded will be clearly identifiable, stored securely and retained for a period of not less than 31 days and will be made available to Licensing Officers of the local authority and Police immediately upon request.
2. Such footage must be provided in an immediately viewable format and must include any software etc. which is required to view the footage. Any discs, portable drives or other storage media onto which the footage is transferred must be provided by the premises.
3. A member of staff who is trained to operate the system and supply the footage must be present at the premises at all times when licensable activities are taking place.
4. The Designated Premises Supervisor or authorised person by him must ensure that the CCTV system is checked at least once every week by a suitably trained

member of staff. This check must include the operation of the cameras, the recording facilities, the facilities for providing footage and the accuracy of the time and date.

5. Prominent, clear and legible notices shall be displayed at the entrance/exit requesting the public to respect the needs of local residents and to leave the premises and the area quietly.
6. A record of age related refusals of sale will be kept and will be made available to Licensing Officers of the local authority and the police upon request.
7. A written authority from the DPS will be kept at the premises where he authorises any member of staff to sell alcohol on his behalf. This authority will be produced immediately upon the request of an officer of the police or the licensing authority.
8. A record of any incident that takes place at the premises which would undermine one or more of the four licensing objectives to be kept at the premises. The record will be made available to officers of the Metropolitan Police and the Licensing Officers of the local authority immediately upon request.
9. All staff shall receive regular training at least twice a year in regards to their responsibilities under the Licensing Act 2003 and in particular, about age restricted products. Records of the training will be kept and made available to authorised officers of the local authority and police immediately upon request.
10. At least two members of staff to be present on the premises between the hours of 23:00 and 05:00 each day.
11. The premises will have an intruder alarm incorporating panic buttons installed. The alarm system will be monitored by a central station and be maintained and regularly tested and staff trained in its use
12. The age verification policy shall apply to persons who appear to be under the age of 25 years old ("Challenge 25 policy"). A record of age related refusals of sale will be kept and will be made available to officers of the Metropolitan Police and Licensing Authority immediately upon request.

I believe that the above conditions are necessary to promote the four licensing objectives.

In addition to the above and following my email dated 26 July 2016, to which I have not had a response please can you supply a local area risk assessment. This should explain what, if any, effect that a licensed premises authorised for the sale of alcohol for such long hours would have on the community that exists within the vicinity of the premises and how this effect would promote the licensing objectives.
