

## **Prevent Action Plan Cover Report**

The Home Office current counter-terrorism strategy is known as the CONTEST strategy. There are four strands to CONTEST, known as the 'Four Ps':

**Pursue** lies within the realm of the police and security services. It is concerned with the apprehension and arrest of any persons suspected of being engaged in the planning, preparation or commission of a terrorist act.

**Prevent** is concerned with working with partners to reduce support for terrorism of all kinds, challenge extremists whose views are shared by terrorist organisations and challenging and isolating extremists operating on the internet.

**Protect** aims to strengthen our protection against a terrorist attack and reduce vulnerability to such attacks. This involves managing the risks to crowded places and the safeguarding of hazardous materials.

**Prepare** seeks to mitigate the impact of a terrorist attack where that attack cannot be stopped. This includes work to bring a terrorist attack to an end and to increase resilience.

### **The Prevent Strand**

The council's engagement with counter-terrorism takes place within the Prevent strand. The Prevent strand represents the safeguarding element of Contest. Prevent seeks to keep children, young people and adults safe from the harm of being drawn into terrorist activities. Following the commencement of the Prevent Duty on 1 July 2015, local authorities are required to fulfil a range of responsibilities as set out in the Prevent guidance. Broadly this work falls into the following categories:

- **Partnership** – local authorities should establish or make use of multi-agency groups to coordinate and monitor Prevent related activity.
- **Risk Assessment** – local authorities should use Counter-Terrorism Local Profiles to assess the risk of individuals being drawn into terrorism in their local area.
- **Action Plan** – Using the risk assessment, if the local authority assesses a risk in the local area, a Prevent action plan should be developed to prioritise and facilitate delivery of projects, activities or specific interventions to reduce the risk of people being drawn into terrorism in the local authority.

- **Staff Training** – local authorities will be expected to ensure that appropriate frontline staff have a good understanding of Prevent and are trained to recognise the vulnerability to being drawn into terrorism and are aware of available programmes to deal with this issue. Local authority staff are expected to be aware of, and make appropriate referrals to, Channel, which has separately been placed on a statutory footing. (see below).
- **Use of local authority resources** – local authorities are expected to ensure that publicly owned venues and resources do not provide a profile for extremists. Consideration should also be given as to whether IT equipment available to the general public should limit access to terrorist and extremist material. New contracts for the delivery of services in a local authority should reflect the principles of the duty in a suitable form.
- **Other agencies and organisations supporting children** – a range of private and voluntary agencies provide services or exercise functions for children, for example children’s homes, independent fostering agencies, and bodies exercising local authority functions. These bodies must ensure as part of their local authority safeguarding arrangements that staff are aware of Prevent.
- **Out of school settings supporting children** – local authorities should take steps to understand the range of activity in their area and take appropriate and proportionate steps to ensure that children attending such settings are appropriately safeguarded.

## **The Channel process**

The Channel process is part of Prevent. Channel is essentially a key part of the safeguarding process, which means that partner agencies cooperate on multi-disciplinary work to minimise and manage risks to people who have been identified as being vulnerable.

They are likely to have been identified as holding extreme yet legitimate ideas but have been assessed as being at risk of moving from that position into one of criminality. In some cases they may be at risk because of exposure to such ideas and activities. Channel aims to keep them safe.

Channel seeks to involve vulnerable people in tailored support activities and offer them as much choice as possible in the intervention process. It should be stressed that people involved in the Channel process do so voluntarily and have not committed any offence.

Channel is completely confidential and completely open. The person at risk is approached and can decline to take part in an intervention. A person who has been identified as being at risk is referred to the local Channel Panel. A decision is made to whether to go ahead with an intervention or the person is deemed unsuitable and is exited from the process.

If it is decided that an intervention should proceed, the person will be contacted. This initial contact will usually be made by the police. An intervention provider will be appointed to work with the person at risk with their consent or the consent of their parents. The case will be reviewed after six months to see whether the intervention can be ended or whether it should continue. There is no danger of future career prospects being damaged through an employer asking for a Criminal Records Bureau check. No criminal act has taken place so no record would be kept. Channel is neither a profiling nor an intelligence gathering exercise.

## **PREVENT ACTION PLAN REPORT**

The Prevent Strategy is part of the Government's wider Counter-Terrorism Strategy called CONTEST. There are four work streams within CONTEST:

- *Pursue*: to stop terrorist attacks;
- *Prevent*: to stop people becoming terrorists or supporting terrorism;
- *Protect*: to strengthen our protection against a terrorist attack; and
- *Prepare*: to mitigate the impact of a terrorist attack.

The Prevent strand which is the responsibility of a range of bodies including local authorities, schools (of all forms, state, free, academies and independent), Further Education Colleges and Universities, Clinical Commissioning Groups and Hospital Trusts, the Probation Service including Community Rehabilitation Companies and Prisons includes:

- responding to the ideological challenge of terrorism and the threat we face from those who promote it;
- preventing people from being drawn into terrorism and ensure that they are given appropriate advice and support; and
- working with sectors and institutions where there are risks of radicalisation which we need to address.

The initial actions that will deliver the local Prevent responsibilities are set out below and have been considered by the Problem Solving Panel and the Security Review Board as well as by Safer Harrow. These actions are based on the Prevent Risk Assessment for Harrow.
