Section 1 – Summary and Recommendations

This report presents the Annual Public Health Report for 2018. The theme for the report is local health and a profile has been produced for each ward in the borough, showing aspects of health and wellbeing.

Section 2 – Report

Each year, the Director of Public Health must publish an independent report on health in the borough. The annual report is the Director of Public Health's professional statement about the health of local communities, based on sound epidemiological evidence, and interpreted objectively. The report should be publicly accessible. The Health and Social Care Act 2012 added in a new s.73A to the National Health Service Act 2006 requiring the appointment of a Director of Public Health. Under subsection s.73B(5), the Director is required to prepare an independent annual report on the health of the people in the area of the local authority and the local authority is required to publish this report.

For the past four years, the Annual Report of the Director of Public Health (Annual Public Health Report or APHR for short) has an important public health topic and described why it is relevant to Harrow and challenged the council and those who live and work in the borough to address it. This year the report has taken a back to basics look at wellbeing across the geography of Harrow with a suite of profiles for each ward in the borough.

The annual report is an important vehicle by which Directors of Public Health can identify key issues, flag up problems, report progress and, thereby, serve their local populations. It will also be a key resource to inform local interagency action.

This year, the annual report takes the format of a series of ward health profiles. Each profile paints a picture of health and well being and some of the factors that influence it. The profiles present some demographics, some information about the services within the ward and they use a variety of data to illustrate the themes of the Health and Wellbeing Strategy: Start Well, Live Well, Work Well and Age Well.

Financial Implications

Whilst this report does not have any specific recommendations with financial implications, any changes in public health strategy that occur as a result will need to be identified. Such expenditure is expected to be contained within the ring-fenced public health grant and reflected in future commissioning intentions as appropriate.
