This proposals sets out harrow Council’s climate change strategy and action plan over the period 2019 – 2024, providing a clear framework of action for the council and its business partners.

Climate change has the capacity to devastate populations and damage economies. So for humanitarian, environmental and business reasons, it is essential that we as a local authority take action to reduce the impact of climate change in Harrow. This proposal will mitigate current effect of climate change on Harrow resident’s health and quality of life. The key improvement areas which are relatively low and medium costs provide relatively large benefits include; measures that target:

- Energy efficiency improvements in existing buildings, • Decentralised generation of heat or electricity such as renewables and investment in high quality district heating networks,
- Transport and Electric Vehicle charging infrastructure,
- Sustainable planning and development, ensuring new developments are highly efficient and incorporate low carbon heating solutions,
- More efficient waste management
