Section 2: Report

2.1 Brief History

In 1998 full Council approved the first Early Years and Childcare Plan. Every January since that date Members have considered the progress made towards meeting the challenging targets contained in the strategy.

The 2004-2006 strategy period has now ended. The requirement from Government to produce a stand alone Early Years and Childcare Plan no longer exists and the headline targets for early years, childcare and parenting activity are included in the Children and Young Peoples Plan.

2.6 Equalities Impact

The 2004-2006 Early Years and Childcare strategy has contributed to the corporate equalities plan and race equality scheme in a number of ways.

The strategy aimed to improve outcomes for all children and families, provide opportunities to succeed, achieve aspirations, provide access to services, combat disadvantage and promote social inclusions.

The main ways it did this are:

- Ensuring Childcare is established in all Harrows areas of disadvantage
- Promoting Childcare and Early Education as a career to Men, people with a disability, Harrows ethnic communities and people over 40.
- Linking closely with Harrows Ethnic Minority Achievement Service to provide specific services to Harrows underrepresented groups.
