1. Summary of proposal, impact on groups with protected characteristics and mitigating actions (to be completed after you have completed sections 2 - 5)

a) What is your proposal? To extent the Council's current Tri-borough leisure contract (with the London Boroughs of Brent and Ealing) with Everyone Active (SLM Ltd) for a further 12 months until 31st August 2025. This is to enable the leisure centres to further recover from the Covid-19 pandemic. Across the leisure sector there has been a slow and stagnating recovery from the pandemic and the subsequent cost of living crisis impacting usage and income generated from leisure centres. This has particulary impacted older sites. A further extension of the leisure contract will also enable a leisure investment strategy to be completed as it has been identified that there is likely to be limited interest in the management of Harrow's current ageing leisure facilities and the financial returns for the Council will be worse.

b) Summarise the impact of your proposal on groups with protected characteristics

No protected characteristic would be specifically affected by these proposals for users of Harrow Leisure Centre, Hatch End Swimming Pool, and Bannister Sports Centre. The proposal is to extend the existing leisure contract so there will be the same range of sport and leisure activities available as currently under the current leisure contract with Everyone Active (SLM Ltd).


