Section 1: Summary

Decision Required

Section 2: Report

2. Background

- 2.1 The Code of Conduct for Councillors is a statutory element of Local Authority Constitutions, based on a model Code of Conduct.
- 2.2 The Code includes a requirement that the Members of the Authority maintain a Register of Interests, which is held by the Monitoring Officer. The requirements falling on individual Members with regard to registering their interests is set out in Part 3 of the Code of Conduct (within the Council's Constitution).
- 2.3 In order to assist Members in their duty to register interests, the Monitoring Officer provides each Councillor with a registration form together with instructions on how to complete the various sections and the Part 3 guidance as to the obligations.
- 2.4 The information process is updated regularly and at least every six months, with Members required to complete a new form, make amendments to the existing return or confirm that no change is necessary.
- 2.5 There is a specific requirement on Members to inform the Monitoring Officer of any change in their registrable interests within 28 days of becoming aware of such a change (this maintains the integrity of the Register between the six monthly reviews and protects the individual Member).

- 2.6 Following the Borough Elections in May there was a need to secure the registration of the interests held by Members elected for the first time, as well as renewing the registrations of re-elected Members.
- 2.7 The full compliance or otherwise by Members of Council elected in May 2006 in registering and/or renewing their entries in the Register of Electors will be advised to the meeting.

The next six monthly review reminder will be sent to Members in November 2006.

2.8 The Register of Members' Interests is open to public inspection.
