Section 2: Report

2. Background

- 2.1 In June 2006, this committee received a report on enforcement of the Code of Conduct, and the options available to the Standards Board for England on receipt of a complaint.
- 2.2 This report now informs members of complaints to the Standards Board for England about Harrow councillors.
- 2.3 Between August 2005 and July 2006 two allegations were made to the Standards Board about Harrow councillors. The outcome was that these allegations should not be investigated. Members are asked to also note that no sanctions have been recommended against any Harrow councillor during this period.
- 2.4 By way of comparison with the other London Boroughs, Harrow's position is below average. Nationally the Standards Board received 3826 complaints between August 2005 and July 2006. Only 5% of which related to London Boroughs. As there are 33 London Boroughs, this represents an average of between five and six complaints per London Borough.
- 2.5 Officers are not aware of any other complaints made to the Standards Board. However, any further complaints will be included in next year's report.
