Strategic Performance Report – Quarter 1, 2006/07

Performance Summary

Format and Content

Appendix 3 now shows results for the last four quarters from Quarter 1 2005/06, where available. This allows performance to be compared over time rather than be seen only at a single point in time.

Annual measures are either marked 'now updated' where new data is available or are shaded darker with an indication of when the next update is due.

A number of new measures have been added in this year, with three key changes:

- The key measures which the Council needs to improve for its CPA position have been included
- The key projects which the Council monitors through its Strategy and Programme Board have been included
- New projects and indicators have also been included to reflect the changes made to all performance reports as a result of the new Corporate Plan and development of new service plans for 2006/07.

This is the last performance report which will be produced through the Council's CorVu system. As of September all reports will be produced in the new SAP Business Warehouse and will change in format and presentation. The information contained in the report will however be the same.
