ANNEX 1 - MANDATORY CONDITIONS:

1.SUPPLY OF ALCOHOL

- (1) NO SUPPLY OF ALCOHOL MAY BE MADE UNDER THE PREMISES LICENCE -
 - (a) AT A TIME WHEN THERE IS NO DESIGNATED PREMISES SUPERVISOR IN RESPECT OF THE PREMISES LICENCE, OR
 - (b) AT A TIME WHEN THE DESIGNATED PREMISES SUPERVISOR DOES NOT HOLD A PERSONAL LICENCE OR HIS PERSONAL LICENCE IS SUSPENDED

2.DOOR SUPERVISION

- (1) WHERE A PREMISES LICENCE INCLUDES A CONDITION THAT AT SPECIFIED TIMES ONE OR MORE INDIVIDUALS MUST BE AT THE PREMISES TO CARRY OUT A SECURITY ACTIVITY, THE LICENCE MUST INCLUDE A CONDITION THAT EACH SUCH INDIVIDUAL MUST BE LICENSED BY THE SECURITY INDUSTRY AUTHORITY
- (2) BUT NOTHING IN SUBSECTION (1) REQUIRES SUCH A CONDITION TO BE IMPOSED-
 - (A) IN RESPECT OF PREMISES WITHIN PARAGRAPH 8(3)(A) OF SCHEDULE 2
 TO THE PRIVATE SECURITY INDUSTRY ACT 2001 (C.12) (PREMISES WITH
 PREMISES LICENCES AUTHORISING PLAYS OR FILMS), OR
 - (B) IN RESPECT OF PREMISES IN RELATION TO-
 - (i) ANY OCCASION MENTIONED IN PARAGRAPH 8(3)(B) OR (C) OF THAT SCHEDULE (PREMISES BEING USED EXCLUSIVELY BY CLUB WITH CLUB PREMISES CERTIFICATE, UNDER A TEMPORARY EVENT NOTICE AUTHORISING PLAYS OR FILMS OR UNDER A GAMING LICENCE), OR
 - (ii) ANY OCCASION WITHIN PARAGRAPH 8(3)(D) OF THAT SCHEDULE (OCCASIONS PRESCRIBED BY REGULATIONS UNDER THAT ACT).
- (3) FOR THE PURPOSES OF THIS SECTION-
 - (A) "SECURITY ACTIVITY" MEANS AN ACTIVITY TO WHICH PARAGRAPH 2(1)(A) OF THAT SCHEDULE APPLIES, AND
 - (B) PARAGRAPH 8(5) OF THAT SCHEDULE (INTERPRETATION OF REFERENCES TO AN OCCASION) APPLIES AS IT APPLIES IN RELATION TO PARAGRAPH 8 OF THAT SCHEDULE

(3) EXHIBITION OF FILMS

- 1) WHERE A PREMISES LICENCE AUTHORISES THE EXHIBITION OF FILMS, THE LICENCE MUST INCLUDE A CONDITION REQUIRING THE ADMISSION OF CHILDREN TO THE EXHIBITION OF ANY FILM TO BE RESTRICTED IN ACCORDANCE WITH THIS SECTION.
- 2) WHERE THE FILM CLASSIFICATION BODY IS SPECIFIED IN THE LICENCE, UNLESS SUBSECTION (3)(B) APPLIES, ADMISSION OF CHILDREN MUST BE RESTRICTED IN ACCORDANCE WITH ANY RECOMMENDATION MADE BY THAT BODY.
- 3) WHERE-
 - (A) THE FILM CLASSIFICATION BODY IS NOT SPECIFIED IN THE LICENCE, OR
- (B) THE RELEVANT LICENSING AUTHORITY HAS NOTIFIED THE HOLDER OF THE LICENCE THAT THIS SUBSECTION APPLIES TO THE FILM IN QUESTION, ADMISSION OF CHILDREN MUST BE RESTRICTED IN ACCORDANCE WITH ANY

4) IN THIS SECTION-

"CHILDREN" MEANS PERSONS AGED UNDER 18; AND
"FILM CLASSIFICATION BODY" MEANS THE PERSON OR PERSONS DESIGNATED AS
THE AUTHORITY UNDER SECTION 4 OF THE VIDEO RECORDINGS ACT 1984 (C.39)
(AUTHORITY TO DETERMINE SUITABILITY OF VIDEO WORKS FOR CLASSIFICATION).

Annex 2 – Conditions consistent with the operating Schedule PREMISES MAY OFFER PRIVATE ENTERTAINMENT ONLY, WITHOUT RESTRICTION

a) General - all four licensing objectives (b,c,d,e) (please read guidance note 15)

Strong management controls and effective training so that all staff are aware of the licensing objectives and in particular ensure: no under age drinking, drunkenness on the premises, drunkenness in public, use of drugs, violent and anti-social behaviour and protect children from harm

b) The prevention of crime and disorder

Responsible management of the premises. Keeping to capacity levels, training and supervision of all staff, adopting best practise guide e.g. adhering to the BBPA, Portman Group on drinks strategy, The National Alcohol Harm Reduction Strategy Tool Kit and other voluntary codes of practise, use of proof of age schemes and / or photo ID driving licences with photographs on music nights, member of the Pub Watch scheme, use of toughened glass and plastic glasses for outdoors, provision of secure deposit boxes for confiscated items, provision of litter bins and other security measures e.g. lighting outside the premises.

c) Public safety

Risk Management assessment checked weekly and effective and responsible management at all times. Provision of door staff and general staff levels to secure safety of the premises and customers. Training and supervision of those employed, adoption of best practices e.g. National Alcohol Harm Reduction Strategy Toolkit and other voluntary codes of practice including the BBPA and Portman Group point of sale promotions, toughened glass throughout and plastic glasses throughout for the outside areas, crowd management training and implementation for all staff, monitoring staff, regular testing and certification if appropriate of all procedures, appliances and systems pertinent to safety

d) The prevention of public nuisance

Responsible management at all times. Training and supervision to prevent incidents of public nuisance. Regular visits to all parts of the premises including the exterior and deliveries etc. outside opening hours, adoption of best practices e.g., Control of noise from pubs and clubs, NAHRS Toolkit and other voluntary codes of practice including the BBPA and Portman Group point of sale promotions. Management of people including staff and traffic arriving and leaving the premises. Liason with public and private transport providers. External lighting and security lighting installed. Collection and management of litter and effective ventilation systems to prevent nuisance from odour.

e) The protection of children from harm

Provision of sufficient staff to secure the protection of children from harm with appropriate training, Adoption of best practice guide(Public Places Charter) Children only on the premises between 10am and 8 pm. No children in bars during entertainment. Children must be accompanied by an adult. Proof of age Scheme and or photo ID driving licences

Annex 3 – Conditions attached after a hearing by the licensing authority.

CONDITION 1. THE MAXIMUM OCCUPANCY OF THE BUILDING AT ANY TIME SHALL NOT EXCEED 50 PERSONS UNTIL SUCH TIME AS AN ALTERNATIVE MEANS OF FIRE ESCAPE IS PROVIDED TO THE SATISFACTION OF THE FIRE AUTHORITY.

CONDITION 2. THE APPLICANT TO CARRY OUT A FIRE RISK ASSESSMENT SPECIFIC TO THE PREMISES TO THE SATISFACTION OF THE FIRE AUTHORITY.

CONDITION 3. EXTERNAL DRINKING AREAS TO BE VACATED AT 2300.

CONDITION 4. NO LIVE MUSIC TO BE PLAYED AT THE PREMISES AFTER 2300.

CONDITION 5. CCTV TO BE INSTALLED OUTSIDE THE PREMISES. EQUIPMENT SHALL BE INSTALLED, OPERATED AND MAINTAINED IN GOOD WORKING ORDER AND IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE RECOMMENDATIONS OF THE POLICE OR CRIME PREVENTION OFFICER.

CONDITION 6. AWP MACHINES TO BE EMPTIED EVERY NIGHT OR FITTED WITH A 'BOOT'.

CONDITION 7. PROMINENT, CLEAR AND LEGIBLE NOTICES SHALL BE DISPLAYED AT ALL EXITS, REQUESTING THE PUBLIC TO RESPECT THE NEEDS OF LOCAL RESIDENTS AND TO LEAVE THE PREMISES AND LOCAL AREA QUALITY.

CONDITION 8. DOORS AND WINDOWS SHALL BE KEPT SHUT AFTER 2200 WHEN REGULATED ENTERTAINMENT IS IN OPERATION.

CONDITION 9. AMPLIFIED SOUND EQUIPMENT SHALL BE GOVERNED BY A SOUND LIMITING DEVICE SET AT A LEVEL APPROVED BY THE LICENSING AUTHORITY.
