Background

The London Borough of Harrow is in the process of preparing a new Housing Strategy and Housing Revenue Account Business Plan. The Housing Strategy document is designed to cover the wider enabling responsibilities of the Council beyond the landlord service which it provides for Council housing. The Housing Revenue Account (HRA) Business Plan is used to outline the Council's plans as a landlord for its own stock.

Both the Housing Strategy and Business Plan are being developed in consultation with residents and other stakeholders, and will also rely on community engagement and working in partnership with many other agencies for implementation.

How the Strategy and Business Plan Support the Sustainable Community Plan

The draft objectives for the Housing Strategy and the Housing Revenue Business Plan priorities will support the refreshed Sustainable Community Plan agreed by HSP, as shown in the table below.
