Cabinet – 17 July 2008 Strategic Performance Report – Quarter 4, 2007/08 Performance Summary

Overall Progress

The Council has made considerable progress during the fourth quarter but has a number of challenges that it still faces.

The Council's **management restructuring** process is making good progress. A new Divisional Director of Environmental Services started in June. Paul Najsarek has been confirmed in the post of Corporate Director Adults and Housing. Carol Cutler has been confirmed as Director of Business Transformation and Customer Services. The process for appointing an Assistant Chief Executive is underway.

The Council started the year in a weak position financially with reserves of £1.3m and a need to close a funding gap of £12m. These factors contributed to a financial standing score of 1 out of 4.Progress has been made in 2007/08. Early figures show that the Council **underspent by £4.7m** in 2007/08 and that reserves will be increased to £3m. In addition, more **prudent provisions** can be made against key budget risks.

Going into 2008/09 the Council has included an additional **investment sum of £1.9m** for investment in priority areas over and above a further £6.1m to meet rising costs in demand led services. Investment will contribute towards:

- o Cleaner streets and improved environmental services
- o Redevelopment of the town centre
- Improvements in Access Harrow
- o Grants to the voluntary sector
- o Further improvement in adult care

Total savings of £9.9m will be delivered during 2008/09.

A new **Council Improvement Programme** was agreed at Cabinet on 19th June that takes forward the Chief Executive's 9 step plan in a coordinated 3 year programme. This will be managed through a robust monthly monitoring process.

Considerable progress was made during the quarter delivering elements of the improvement programme. A new **Efficiency and Improvement Board** has been created to drive and monitor the Council's medium to long term financial planning. This will provide oversight of Revenue Income Optimisation, Efficiency Reviews, Strategic Property Review, business Transformation Partnership projects and the Adults and Housing Transformation Programme. A new programme of Efficiency Reviews has been launched with initial work in IT and Highways.

Project management training has been rolled out across the organisation in support of the project management toolkit. This has been supported by Roffey Park.

Work has also started with Roffey Park on a **culture change programme** across the organisation. The new management development programme pilot has been launched to an initial tranche of 20 managers. Staff survey results are due imminently but show an overall **48% response rate** against the survey.

The Council's Communications Team has achieved its highest media scores to date with a score of 714 vs a target of 200. The Innov8 campaign has been shortlisted for **the Internal Communications Campaign of the Year award.**

The Council's Legal Team has been shortlisted for **the In House Public Sector team of the year award**. The Council was also shortlisted for the **IRRV excellence in counter fraud award**.

A **new Local Area Agreement** was agreed on 1st June and will be a cornerstone of the new Local Area Agreement.

Historic **debts with the PCT** have been largely settled with a substantial payment being made to the Council.

The Adult Learning Team has won a bid for **£880k of capital funding** from the LSC for improvements to the adult learning facilities at harrow Arts Centre. The Council has also officially opened the Kenton Learning Centre. The **new Gayton Library** has successfully opened at its new home in Garden House.

Major applications are due with the Strategic Planning Committee including work at **Wood Farm and Bentley Priory.** Major schemes for the Town Centre at Gayton Road and Harrow College are making good progress. Planning performance has also made a step change in Development Management which should place Harrow within the top 25% of London Boroughs.

Comprehensive Performance Assessment (CPA)

Some major improvements have been seen in performance. The **Housing Service** is expecting to move up to a 3 out of 4 at the next CPA in February 2009. The Adoption Services has moved into a 'very good' banding. The Council launched its Parenting Strategy and Work Plan in June. Performance against assessments has continued to move up and is now 'very good'.

Quarter 4 **Improvement Boards** have taken place across services and the Council is driving performance indicators as hard as it can prior to year-end.

Performance Highlights

The remaining part of this report contains the top 100+ indicators that track performance across council services. Key improvements have been highlighted along with the key challenges for Harrow.
