1. Summary

FOR INFORMATION

This report sets out key data relating to Children Looked After (CLA) and Children on the Child Protection Register (CPR), plus key performance indicators to the end of 2007-8.

Key points for this period:

- None of the indicators relating to CLA and CPR were red compared with two at the end of 2006/7
- No indicators dropped a performance band, 4 improved by at least one band
- Participation of CLA in their reviews has been sustained at a new high level of 95%
- through careful management and improved team stability, a much more balanced position has been achieved for CPR indicators

- the need remains for careful management of children who have a longterm CP plan – this is being addressed by the relevant managers
- use of in-house foster carers has increased further, meaning better placements and value for money
- this overall picture has supported an improved score of 3 out of 4 in our annual self-assessment which we are confident will be upheld by Ofsted



There were 149 children looked after in Harrow on 31st May 2008.


The bar chart below shows the number of children looked after by month from April 2006 to May 2008.















Breakdown of registration categories of those children on the Child Protection Register as at 31st May 2008


