These issues have now been resolved and the review has restarted. The initial report from the review, which considered the process for setting the council's annual budget, was agreed by the Overview and Scrutiny committee on 4 th November. This report also includes proposals for the work programme for the next phase of the review. One of the key recommendations of the review is also being incorporated into scrutiny's consideration of the budget for 2009 – 10. A meeting between the review group and the Chairman and Vice Chairman of the Performance and Finance sub committee has been arranged for 11 th December in order to plan questions for the annual budget scrutiny session with the Leader and Director of Finance. This is the first time that the Overview and Scrutiny committee will be framing its interrogation of the budget based on both an analysis of best practice in terms of budget planning and in a clear understanding of the in-year financial performance of the council.
