Area Assessment Questions

Area assessment will examine:

- the extent to which councils and their partners are delivering improvements on the issues that matter to people within the local area.
- whether the priorities set in the area reflect those of the people who live there.
- how effectively the improvements are being delivered, and will assess the future prospects for improvement.

Gathering Harrow's Answer

Develop a self evaluation based around the chapters in the new Sustainable Community Strategy (3 pages per theme: leads appointed):-

- Improving Environment
- Every Harrow Child
- Health, Well-being and Independence
- Community, Culture and Identity

Evaluation Content

- Address the three questions
- Reference material around the CAA themes:-
- Sustainable Development
- Equality, Diversity and Human Rights
- Vulnerable People
- Value for Money

Partnership Development Programme

- a Partnership Development Programme addressing business improvements to improve Partnership performance and planning including adopting priorities based on community needs, delivering agreed outcomes and enhancing prospects for future improvements;
- An enhanced Partnership Performance
 Management system looking at the Partnership
 Development Programme as well as the LAA
 and Sustainable Community Strategy
