

ELMGROVE FIRST SCHOOL GOVERNING BODY ELMGROVE MIDDLE SCHOOL GOVERNING BODY

Dear Chris,

The consultation on school amalgamation finished at noon on Monday 12th July.

The joint steering group of the Governing Bodies of Elmgrove Middle and Elmgrove First Schools met this morning, 14th July, and, given the response from the consultation, recommends that Elmgrove First/Infant School and Elmgrove Middle/Junior School amalgamate from September 2011.

The Governing Bodies' view, supported by the consultation outcome, is that an amalgamated school can provide better for the needs of the children and families of Elmgrove and also offer opportunities to staff that cannot be matched by keeping the schools separate.

We have attached the spreadsheet showing the collated response to the consultation.

As you will see the overall response was that 48.4% of respondents were in favour of amalgamation. Taking parents as a group, 62% were in favour and 23% against. The overall figure is heavily influenced by the staff response: 53 staff replied and only 74 parents.

Please convey the view of the Governing Bodies to the Cabinet, to be considered in their decision making.

Comments:

1. I have a child due to start reception as other starts y 3. It would be difficult to do school runs to different schools if junior is shut
2. Amalgamation will benefit both schools
3. Eimgrove Schools are a special case.
As both schools are additionally resourced to meet the needs of children with severe and complex disabilitiess, the staffing levels at Eimgrove are higher than the average first and middle schoole.g currently the First School has over 70 staff
Combining both schools will almost double the staffing level, thus making staff liaison

even more difficult than at present. This, in turn, would have a negative impact upon teaching and children's learning.

Recent amalgamation at several local Harrow schools has led to increased levels of stress and subsequent higher than average staff sick leave
