On 13 June 2011 the Planning Inspectorate awarded partial costs against the Council in relation to the appeal against the Council's refusal of planning permission for the redevelopment of St George's Field to provide 7 x 1 bed flats, 8 x 2 bed flats, 4 x 3 bed houses and 8 x 4 bed houses; extended access road, detached double garage; altered parking for St George's Church Hall and retention of approximately 0.8 hectares of open space, (application reference P/1546/09). The appellants have submitted their costs, which the Council is currently examining. These costs have been contained within the Directorate.
