
### **Covid-19 Update**





- Overall Covid-19 cases remain quite high in Harrow
- Harrow is now 309.9 cases per 100k people cases fell recently probably due to half-term and vaccination but are now growing again as schools return
- Significant reduction in impact of Covid-19 on hospitalisation due to vaccination
  but pressures on NHS and Social Care continues
- The Government Covid-19 Winter Plan is in place to manage an expected increase in cases and impact over the next few months
- The vaccination programme is focused on booster jabs for over 40's and vaccination for 12-15 year olds likely to be expanded further
- As Winter approaches Covid-19 and Flu will become an increasing challenge
- Flu vaccination is a priority to reduce pressures on NHS and social care
- Significant focus on service pressures and recovery going forward

### Harrow Covid-19 Dashboard

## Harrowcouncil







Harrow is currently in 9th position out of the 33 London boroughs, a slight rise from previously reported. The decreasing trend in all age and over 60s infection rate has continued. If a bounce back effect happens after school holidays we expect to see it within the coming week.

**Hospitalisations:** There were 71 patients in hospital with coronavirus on 16 November 2021. There were 8 coronavirus patients in hospital beds with a mechanical ventilator on 9 November 2021.

**Deaths:** Between 1 November 2021 and 17 November 2021, there has been 1 death within 28 days of a positive coronavirus test.

### **Overview of Covid-19 Winter Plan**



- Winter anticipated to be very challenging for NHS and social care due to Covid-19 and normal Winter pressures e.g. Flu
- Government's Winter Plan focusses on a "Plan A" based upon vaccination and a "Plan B" which would see other measures such as mandatory face covering and a greater focus on home working
- Other key aspects include testing, self-isolation, encouragement to continue with hands, face, space, flu vaccination and general caution
- Vaccination programme involves new cohorts, boosters and an evergreen offer to those who are currently not vaccinated
- Government has confirmed mandatory vaccination for those working in NHS and Social Care from April 2022
- Council is preparing detailed contingency plans and current mitigations re services will remain in place as part of our support of the Winter Plan

## **Ongoing Covid-19 response**



- Pandemic response continues to be a major focus of the Council and will continue to be for many months – predicted at least through 2022
- Activity continues on key areas including testing, vaccination and isolation support
- Significant demand on services due to covid-19 especially social care, environment, benefits and via the community hub
- The demand on services is causing both a capacity and financial pressure in the system and is likely to grow as Winter approaches especially in Social Care
- The vaccination programme is very important and requires ongoing Council support for c6months

### **Vaccination Update**



- Phase three roll out continues in Harrow, including:
  - Vaccinations for the general 12-15 population, through schools, and now available through GPs, with 40% of eligible 12-15 year olds having received a vaccination so far (best in NWL)
  - Booster vaccination for those over 50 and clinically extremely vulnerable, with over 60,000 boosters delivered to date (best in NWL)
- The booster vaccination is being offered through Primary Care Hubs and pharmacies with sites available across the borough
  - All sites offering both third doses as well as first and seconds, known as the 'Evergreen Offer' which can be booked via the NHS National Booking Site or walk-ins
  - Byron Hall was acting as a 'pop-up' from Thursdays to Sundays for both third doses and walk ins / bookings but is now closing as per the NHS original plan for the site options are being looked at for the Leisure Centre to remain part of the local offer for vaccination
  - Focus of our Covid Awareness Fund still on those who have not had a first dose, especially our Black heritage and Romanian Communities – 11 successful applications through the 6<sup>th</sup> round of Covid Awareness – 47 groups funded so far
  - Broader Communications Campaign is about keeping safe through Winter, which is about the importance of <u>both</u> Covid vaccination <u>and</u> Flu vaccination

### **Vaccination Uptake in Harrow**

Overall **91%** of people who have had a first dose have had their second dose, making Harrow the second best performer in North West London.

On the **Booster Campaign**, Harrow is the best performer in North West London with 62,170 delivered, with over 80% of those aged 65+ in Harrow having now already had their booster.

### **Analysis and Conclusions**



- Covid-19 case rates are high but serious illness and hospitalisation remains lower as a result of vaccination programme
- Onset of Winter will be a big challenge in respect of Covid-19 and
  Flu especially for Social Care
  - Major focus for Council on supporting the Winter Plan response e.g. vaccination and delivery of social care
  - Planning for recovery and ensuring capacity and resilience is in place is a key focus
  - Covid-19 will continue to dominate Council's work and priorities for many months challenging organisational and staff resilience

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
