#### 545. Revised Statement of Principles - Gambling Act 2005

#### Resolved to RECOMMEND: (to Council)

- That the Revised Statement of Principles, as set out in Appendix A to the officer report, be recommended to Council for approval, noting the following:
  - a) each application would be considered on its own individual merits without regard to demand and regulate gambling in the interests of public interest; and
  - b) each application should uphold the three gambling objectives:
    - Preventing gambling from being a source of crime or disorder, being associated with crime and disorder or being used to support crime
    - Ensuring that gambling is conducted in a fair and open way
    - Protecting children and other vulnerable persons from being harmed or exploited by gambling
- 2) That a "no casino" resolution be continued as previously agreed bythe Authority as there is no evidence base to show the need for a casino or the benefits of such an establishment (the policy continues to support well-run, compliant gambling premises).
